Happy Astronauts Play 'Space Tag'

Receive 'Go' For 15 Orbits

CAPE KENNEDY (UPI)—Geminol 9 astronauts Thomas Stafford and Eugene Cernan, cheering themselves on, blasted triumphantly into orbit today on their third try and raced toward a waiting target satellite in a long space race.

Off the ground at last last, Stafford and Cernan received a go-ahead for the first 15 orbits on the spacewalking flight scheduled to last three days. The same computer guide Stafford was functioning and Stafford planned to tinker with the bad plug after rendezvous.

"We're on our way," they cheered as they soared off the pad on a plume of smoke and flame into a brilliant blue sky.

"Ah, that's fantastic," Cernan rejoiced as he got his first taste of space.

Command pilot Stafford began a series of tricky "burns," with his own steering rockets to change his path and speed, in the voyage to the orbiting target.

The astronauts voices floated to earth calm and crisp, discussing technical flight data with ground tracking stations.

Ten months ago, Deaton was removed from the fire department committee following a complaint by the firemen that they were unable to work with him.

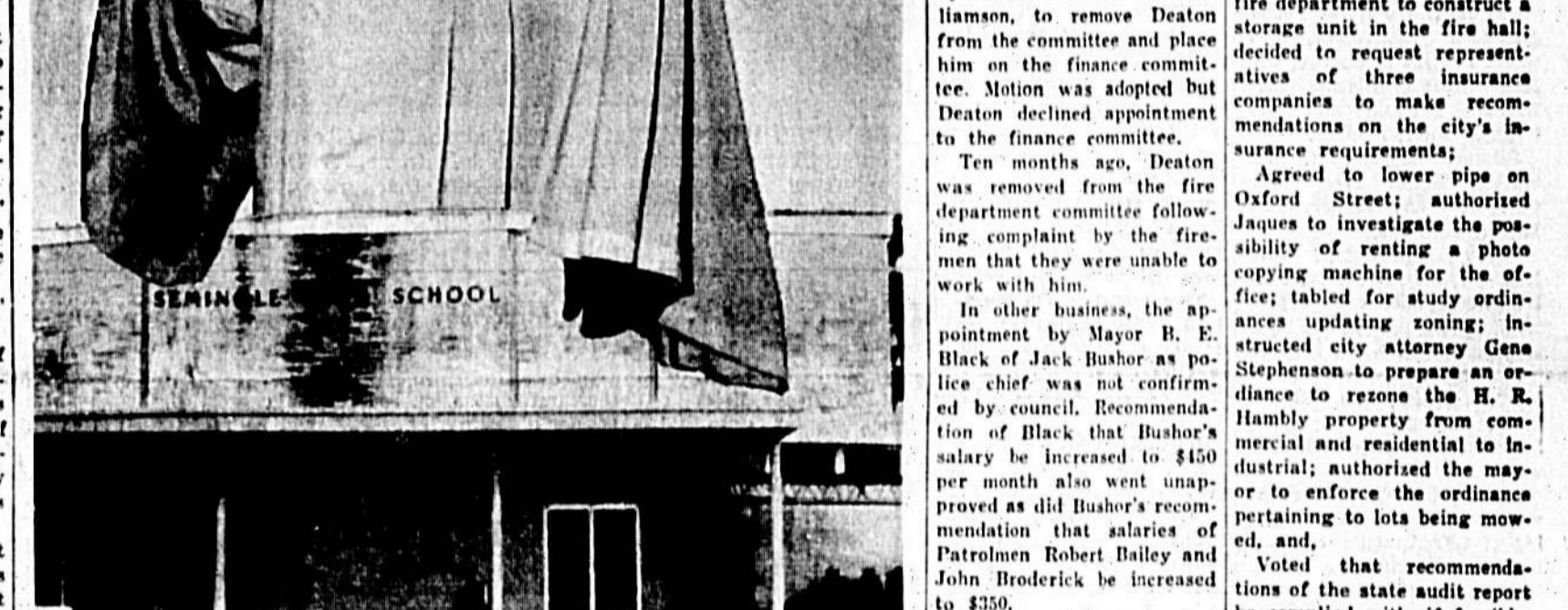

"Over half of the members of the house will have had no legislative experience whatsoever," he noted.

Outlining Seminole County's stance, Cleveland explained that Seminole County and other counties will be represented by Sens. J. A. Boyd, Leeburg, D. D. Covington, and Pasco; L. K. Edwards, of Ocala, and Verle Pope, of St. Augustine. Pope will be president of the Senate with Rep. Ralph Turlington of Gainesville as Speaker of the House.

Seminole and Lake County share three representatives including Cleveland from Group 2, Thomas McDonald of Group 3 and either Democrat William Lewis or Republican Charles Halls of Lake County in Group 2.

"The big counties, especially Dale, could care less what happens to us in Seminole County, but I feel the smaller counties will be fortunate in having Senator Pope and Representative Turlington as head of the Senate and House, as both are from small counties and tend to be moderate in their thinking," Cleveland said.

Cleveland listed the major issues as education, constitutional revision, more home rule for counties and the question of daylight saving time for Florida.

On the question of home rule for counties Cleveland said he would not be in favor of the "meter" system as there is "too much duplication of effort."

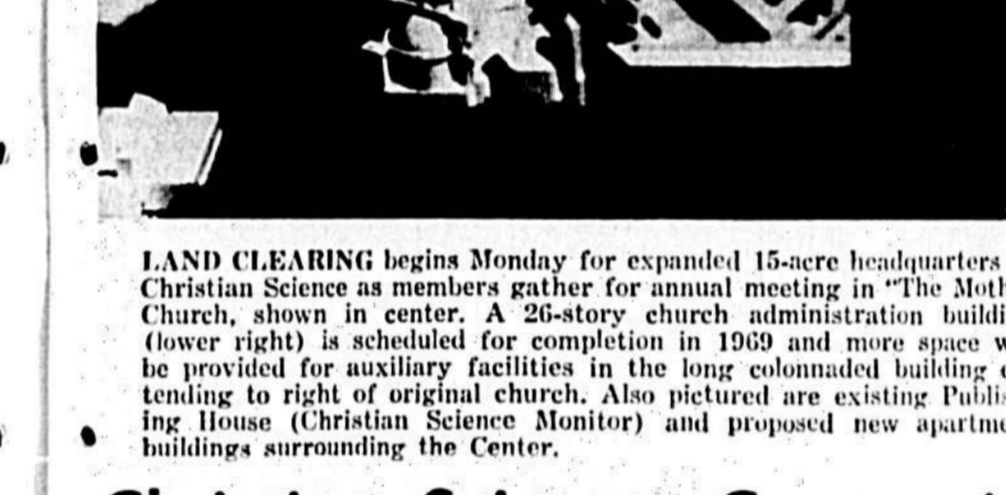

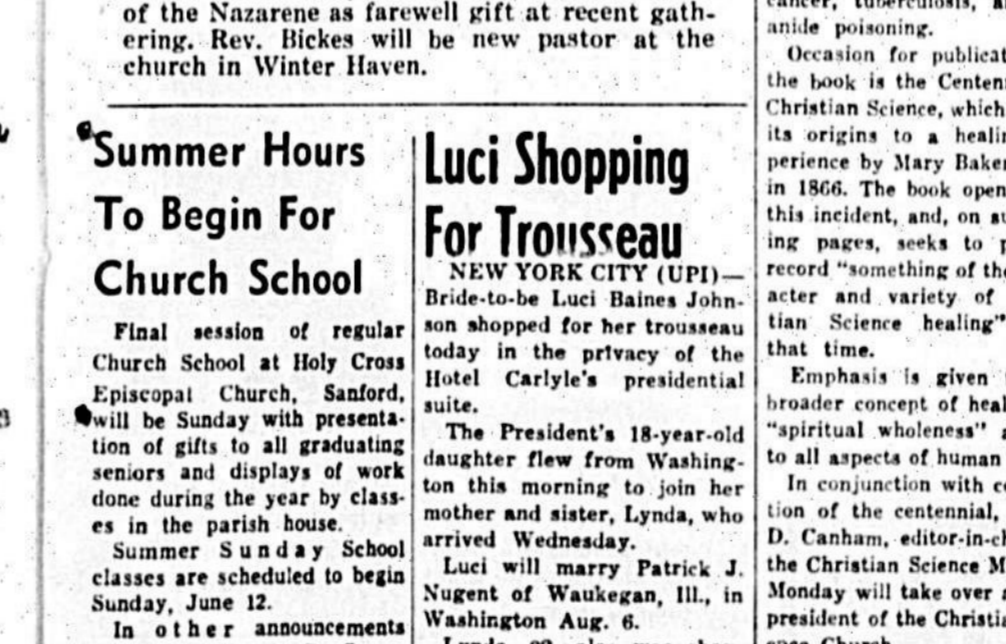

Federal Loans Aid Rural Home Builders

Florida Farmers Home Administration State Director William T. Shaddick said today new or improved housing plans to have their homes renovated inside and out.

"Our loans for home improvement," Shaddick added, "enable a family to put new siding on their house and fix-up and paint-up the interiors as well as the outside. These funds can also finance the installation of a bathroom or an extra bedroom."

Expanded use of the Farmers Home Administration funds is made possible through the agency's new insured housing loan program in which the repayment of money advanced by private lenders for construction is guaranteed by the federal government.

Under the new insured program, housing loans can be made to families of low income at five per cent interest with up to 25 years for repayment.

Farmers Home Administration credit is advanced only when the applicant's needs cannot be met by other lenders.

Shaddick said that families with weekly take home pay as small as \$45 may be able to obtain loans to improve their housing, through construction of new homes, purchase of

previously occupied housing, or repair or expansion of present dwelling. Applications for loans are made at the local office, 110 East Commercial Street, Sanford.

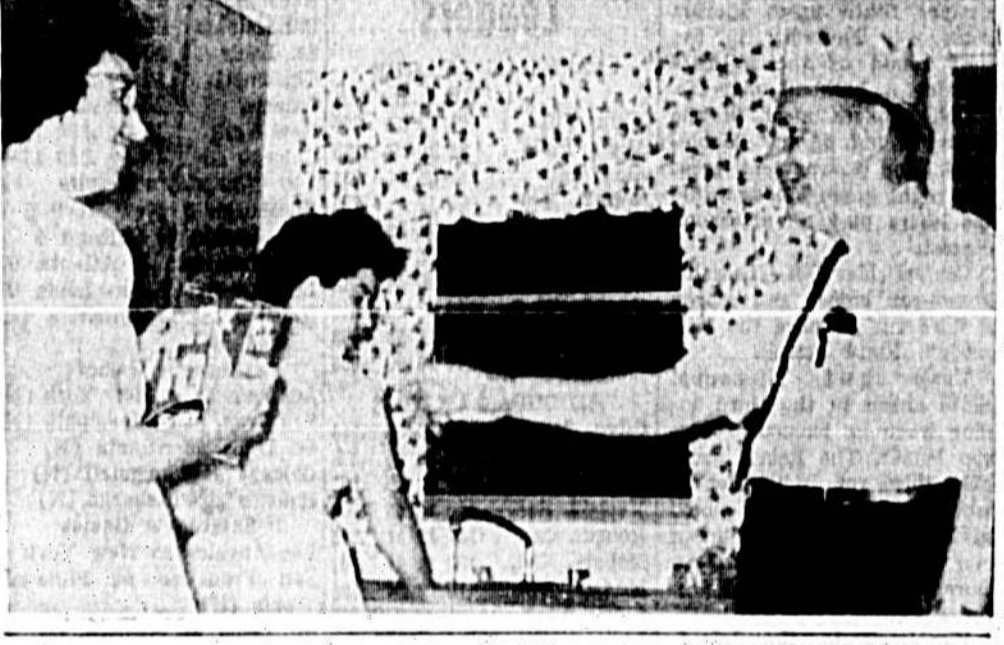

CROOMS HIGH SCHOOL 1965-66 SCHOOL TERM WAS A GRAND SUCCESS

The 1965-66 school year has been one of the most rewarding educational experiences in the history of Crooms High School, according to Principal E. L. Blacksheare.

"With the acquisition of full accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the performance of students on national, state, and local standardized tests, the year's success has been more than gratifying and has stimulated new and improved approaches to the teaching and learning processes at Crooms," said Blacksheare.

"New physical facilities added to enhance and complete the curriculum during this term were the industrial arts and vocational agriculture shops and classrooms. These facilities have been fully equipped and are functioning excellently.

"Library books and materials are constantly being received to maintain the standards of the Southern Association and the State Department of Education. The library hours have been extended in the morning and afternoon so as to provide more opportunities for literary progress.

"Many new materials and equipments provided this year by the federal aid to education programs have greatly aided in making the progress that has been realized. Tapping the full potential of the pupils, thereby, enabling them to perform effectively in a society has been the object of these efforts. Approximately \$80,000 in materials and equipments were purchased this year.

"Various recognitions have been bestowed upon Crooms High School during the past year through their participation in a variety of activities. The chorus achieved superior ratings in the district and state festivals, the band was rated excellent; athletic players were accorded state and county honors; students connected with club activities were selected for state officers. The Tri-Hi-Y placed two members of its club as state officials in the Youth Legislature held in Tallahassee at the Capitol.

"Academically, the superior performance of students on standardized tests has gained them scholarships and admittance to the country's foremost institutions.

"Approximately 1,400 students will be enrolled at Crooms for the 1966-67 school term. This anticipated increase in enrollment will permit more large class instruction, and will thereby expand the learning opportunities for pupils of Crooms. A higher course in mathematics, an expanded program in vocational business, additional teachers and several teachers' aides are a few of the features that will broaden the curriculum for a functional program," Blacksheare concluded.

The Oviedo High School graduating class will consist of 40 graduates this year.

"Our graduating seniors have turned in a fine academic record during their four years here," said Principal Clyde Holder.

"On the senior placement test, 25 per cent of our graduates scored over 400 points, 60 per cent scored over 300 points and 33 of the 40 have indicated they plan to attend college," he added.

"We have one athletic scholarship, which has been awarded to William (Billy) Mikler, our all-state football halfback, who will attend Georgia Tech.

"Mikler also will receive the SAC award given for scholarship, activities and citizenship.

"Brett Thompson has received an appointment to the U. S. Coast Guard Academy and will leave June 27 for New Haven, Conn.

"Recipients of the Hayden Burns Scholarship Awards are Joy Wainright, Larry Strickland and Allan Jepson. We have an unusual situation this year, in that five of our six top students are boys," Mikler noted.

"They include Robert Steward, Allan Jepson, Brett Thompson, Tim Colbert, Joy Wainright and Billy Dann," he said.

In addition to an excellent academic record for four years, the Oviedo High School athletic program has produced a winning season in every sport.

"We went to the finals in the regional basketball tournament and lost only to the state champions. We enjoyed the best record in Oviedo history with a 21 win-four loss season," Holder declared.

"For the fourth time in a row, we won the all-county basketball championship," he added.

"In football, we compiled a 7-3 record and for the first time gained an all-state player, Billy Mikler. Billy was also named to the all-county team," he noted.

"Billy is undoubtedly the most outstanding football player in Oviedo's short history and ranks with the greatest in Seminole County history," the principal stated.

"In baseball, once again, Oviedo advanced to the regional tournament, losing to the state champions at Avon Park.

"Winning has become a tradition at Oviedo High School, due to the quality of our athletes, the high standards that all athletes meet and also to the quality of the coaches we have been fortunate in having with us," he declared.

"As to the future, Oviedo is looking forward to the opening of a new high school in 1968. New courses will be added next year and enrollment is expected to be approximately 850 students in grades one through 12," he predicted.

"We have spent approximately \$30,000 on new equipment and materials which we feel sure will benefit our students in the coming year. More teachers aides will be added as well as assisting teachers. We feel sure our academic program will grow each year," he concluded.


