WASHINGTON, Nov. 24. (P)— The possible selection of President Roosevelt as the American dele-gate to the proposed International

Security Council is being suggested in Administration circles.

According to this idea the President would continue in office while taking on the new post, thus setting a precedent which his successors might wish to follow.

Proponents said the advant-ages of picking the Chief Exe-cutive as United States member of the planned eleven-man peace

3. He could make quick decisions without referring them home, and might be better able to get Congressional and popular support for actions of the inter-national agency than another representative.

Officials suggested that a deputy delegate would be named also, so that the council could be in continuous session without requiring prolonged absences of the Chief Executive from his domestic duties.

Since the question is receiving attention in Washington, it is considered probable that Mr. Roosevelt, Prime Minister Churchill and Marshal Stalin will discuss at their forthcoming meeting the level on which the peace council should be organized.

Presumably, if President Roose-Presumably, if President Roosevelt represented the United States the other chiefs of state would represent their governments.

The still-unsettled problem of how to choose the representative indoubtedly will be taken up with Congress and a formula may be included when supporting legisation for the Dumbarton Oaks

One possibility is an executive-legislative committee to advise the United States representatives on the council, although the Dumbarton Oaks plan contemplates that he will be free to take specific decisions without submitting them for Congressional



But from the few graves that survived there came a wealth of scientific material. The tombs yielded jewelry, necklases, bracelets, beautiful alabaster vases and dishes, pottery, a huga flint aword thousands of flint knives, finely-carved figures of Osiris and Isis, the god and his sister-wife; as well as some atone palattes used by the very artists who ainted the decorations on these tombs.






There is magic in maps, as our much-traveling Americans know. And doubtless millions of our people have been following lately, with nostalgic as well as historical interest, the sweep of American armies eastward toward the storied Rhine. Every part of that famous river, viewed inversely from Arnheim in Holland, southward through Duesseldorf and Cologne, Coblentz and Mainz, Karlsruhe, Strasbourg. and Mulhouse, to Basel at the Swiss border, is filled with recollections that jar strangely with the present brutal realities of that region.

It was a wondrous pilgrimage for American college boys in the good old days before the last war. And likewise for the German students themselves, found everywhere in that marvellous region, with eagle feathers in their queer little hats and guide books in their hands, scrupulously observing and noting well every item of interest they were expected to see. But they did not fraternize much with American students, for even then the first great war was casting its shadow, and the English tourists knew it, although the Americans were often blind.

Ah, well-we fought them once, soon after that, and our old veneration for German students, and student days never returned. Now we are fighting them again along the once-beloved Rhine. And who remembers the little one-man ferry that used to run from the Basel water front across the narrow, rushing upper Rhine, to the ever-peaceful Swiss border?

Women-Should Learn To Carve Turkey

By CHARLOTTE ADAMS Associated Press Food Editor A lot of women who've never carved before are going to carve the bird this holiday season-or not have the bird to cat, unless they just tear it apart, which is a messy and wasteful business. Because turkeys are so scarce, I'm going to tell you how to carve a chicken. It isn't hard, but it does take know how.

First of all, be sure that the carving knife is sharpened to per(ection, Before you start your carving career please take my word for it that a sharp knife is indispensable and thus improve your technique before you've even

Place the chicken on its platter before you with the legs to the right. Now insert the carving ork- about in the center of the ird so its prongs straddle the breast bone. It remains there through the entire carving. First, step in carving is to re move the second joint and leg in one operation. Cut through

the body, following the seam to the back bone socket. Now grass the end of the drumstick with your fingers and with the blunt edge of the knife bend the whole piece down toward the platter At this point you will see the with the point of the carving from the second joint, or serve them as one piece, whichever


