





# For Over-sea Jumps perts ever since Col. Charles

NEW YORK, July 18 .- (A.P.)-In about three weeks a new 40-passenger flying boat will take the nearing day of regular trans-Atlantic air travel.

For this plane is to go into the Caribbean service of Pan-American airways, which is the testing ground for commercial trans\_Atlantic flights.

The new plane, the largest commercial plane ever built, will fly between Miami and Baranquilla, Colombia, a distance of 1350 miles and only 60 of which is over land. The hop from Jamaica to Baranquilla is approximately the same distance as from the Atlantic scaboard to Bermuda, the condi-tions are about the rame, and al-most all the way the pilot is out of sight of land.

Pan-American Airways is defin's ly interested in participating in an Atlantic line and it looks on its Caribbean department as a practice ground on which to learn the leasons necessary to successful rperation of a cross-ocean service, which come experts believe will

come within two years.




