# Bars Prepare 'Last Call' For 18-Year-Olds Tuesday

alcoholic beverages legally. The new law raising the drinking age to 19 goes into effect at midnight Tuesday. A United Press International survey shows that some bars and beer joints catering to teenagers plan to close shortly before the deadline hour, clear out the 18-year-old customers then re-open for business. Here is a look at how the law will effect local liquor

"We'll have some troubles, I'm sure," said Hall Huff, assistant manager of the ABC Liquor Lounge in Casselberry. "But nobody's going to lose their job to serve some 18-year-Huff explained that bartenders and waitresses who don't

check identification closely enough and are caught serving liquor to those under age will lose their jobs and be banned from working in the liquor industry for seven years.

olds early Tuesday. Since 17-year-olds now come in attempting to buy liquor and causing trouble when refused, Huff said he expects 18-year-olds to do the same when they are prohibited. Huff, who has been a liquor store manager for five years, said he thinks the drinking age was fine at 21.

"I've seen enough drunk teen-agers," he said. In Sanford, ABC Lounge's manager Duane LaFollette said 18-year-olds will be able to drink until the midnight Tuesday deadline. Although the other ABC's will be clearing them out about 8 p.m., LaFollette said a "last call" for 18 year olds will He said extra security will be present and extra door men

### **U.N. Security Council**

### **Urges Peace Settlement**

UNITED NATIONS (UPI) - The Security Council ended days of backroom bickering and unanimously called on Iran and Iraq to "refrain from any further use of force" and peacefully settle their differences.

The resolution, sponsored by Mexico and thrashed out in several days of closed-door consultations, was approved Sunday by a 15-0 vote by the world organization's principal peacekeeping body.

Consultations, sometimes heated, on the wording of the document went on right up to the final minutes before the meeting, diplomatic sources said. The word cease-fire was not used because it was cor sidered unpalatable to Iran, the sources said.

### 5-Month Oil Surplus Seen

NEW YORK (UPI) - The current world oil surplus can continue for five months despite the loss of 2.9 million barrels a day of oil exports from Iran and Iraq, Petroleum Intelligence Weekly reported today.

And the loss of oil from the giant producers because of their war could go on a year before most world inventories were used up, the weekly said. Of course, OPEC, whose production was at a four-year low of 27.2 million barrels a day in July, could provide a cushion against the Iran-Iraq cutoff by raising its output by

1.8 million barrels a day to late 1979 levels, the authoritative oil journal said. The PIW estimate generally agreed with that of the prestigious weekly Lundberg Letter which came up with the 6-month figure for the world surplus but with a larger depletion estimate.

WASHINGTON (UPI) - President Carter begins three days of campaigning this week with optimistic aides maintaining opponents Ronald Reagan and John Anderson are increasingly

"We always have felt we would win it in the last two or three weeks," a key campaign aide said during the weekend. "We'll probably be within striking distance but behind in the polls

Today, Carter was to speak to the International Ladies Garment Workers Union and the New York City Business and Labor Committee for Carter-Mondale during four hours in New York. His wife was to campaign in Texas, Louisiana and

The Senate plans to finish action today on a resolution continuing financing for most federal agencies, prodded by warnings the federal government could otherwise slow to a halt by midweek.

BALTIMORE (UPI) - Heavy cigarette smokers may face a lower risk of stomach cancer, new research

But the Johns Hopkins University researcher who released the study Sunday said the results should not be taken as an endorsement of smoking but as an indication more action is needed against air pollution. When people with healthy lungs inhale dirt or smoke particles, the particles are cleared from the lungs and nvoluntarily swallowed, said Mary Meyer, an associate professor of epidemiology at the School of Hygiene and Public Health.

Mrs. Meyer and her fellow researchers said people with lungs damaged by cigarette smoke retain carcinogens and other particles in their lungs, increasing their risk of lung cancer. But the risk of stomach cancer is reduced beacuse fewer of the cancer-causing substances reach their stomachs, the researchers

# Necklace Snatchers Prowling New York

NEW YORK (UPI) - New York's newest breed of criminals prowl the subways and shopping districts, sneakers on their feet and their eyes on women's necks.

They are chain snatchers, and police say they make up to \$500 a week stealing gold necklaces and selling them to eager fences. The thieves — some as young as 13 — stole 1,300 gold necklaces in July and August alone. The new criminal fad has resulted in two

deaths, and has forced the city to assign a special force of 150 plainclothes police officers to stalk the thieves. Police Inspector Edward Cappello says some of the chain snatchers have become so brazen they rip off necklaces even as police

"Can you believe that?" he asked. Cappello told how a nimble chain snatcher reached into the window of a 42nd Street crosstown bus, stalled in traffic, and swiped a passenger's \$1,600 necklace. "We apprehended that one," said Cappello,

# Chaos In The Persian Gulf

The escalating fighting between Iran and Iraq provides a frightening demonstration of just how vulnerable the West's oil lifeline in the Persian Gulf has become.

So long as the late shah sat firmly on his Peacock Throne, Iran remained the guarantor of stability in the Gulf. The shah's large and lavishly equipped armed forces acted as undisputed guardians of Western access to oil resources without which the economies of Europe and Japan

But the days of order and stability in the Gulf are history. The shah is in his grave and two years of chaotic revolution have reduced Iran to a shambles. Its once mighty armed forces have long since been ravaged by purges, mass desertions, indiscipline, and the cumulative effects of a Western embargo of arms and spare long years after the Korean war the

It was only a matter of time before Iraq took advantage of this deterioration to settle its outstanding border disputes with Iran, and to punish the avatollah for his ham-handed efforts to spark a Shiite Moslem revolt against Baghdad's ruling Sunni faction.

The danger now, of course, is that the cycle of raid and counter raid will spin out of control Indeed, both sides have crossed thresholds heretofore respected in bouts of border skirmishing that began 18 months ago.

The rival air forces have bombed each other's capital cities, as well as other targets far removed from the border areas. Both sides have struck at each other's oil installations, a particularly worrisome precedent in view of the acute vulnerability of refineries and pipelines.

There have been naval duels near the mouth of the strategic Shatt-al-Arab estuary, Iraq's only outlet to the Persian Guld.

Most alarming of all. Iran has threatened to blockade the narrow Strait of Hormuz, the okepoint through which 100 oil tankers per day ass bound for Europe, Japan and the United

# U.S.-China Ties May Hurt Detente

policy poker game Jimmy Carter is playing with the Kremlin. China is the wild card. But there is disturbing evidence that Carter may be overplaying his China card, a risky bluff which could, in the long run, escalate a spiraling world arms race.

Carter partially inherited his hand from Richard Nixon and Henry Kessinger, and is playing it out under the guidance of the resident hardline anti-Soviet expert — his Polish-born national security adviser,

Brzezinski — like Nixon and Kissinger before him — is so concerned with the Soviet threat to American security he is willing to provide sophisticated arms and technology to the Chinese. The backfire potential of this rapidly escalating strategy is causing con-cern on Capitol Hill and in the U.S. in-

The concern isn't that the China overtures don't have merit, but rather that Carter's leutenants may be stumbling down a thorny oath which hasn't yet been fully explored, and ch could have dire implications among the Big Three of East and West.

TAMPA — Tampa Bay's 65,450 orange clad faithfuls began slipping out of Tampa Stadium at the 10:20 mark of the fourth quarter Sunday in much the same fashion Buccaneer receivers let slip away numerous Doug Williams' passes.

.Veteran Calvin Hill had just gathered in a 43-yard touchdown pass from patient Brian Sipe to seal Tampa's doom in a 34-27 loss. An embarrassing loss that Buc coach John McKay blamed on poor defense and missed opportunities. "These guys came off the field slapping each other on the

back saying hey don't worry about it," furned McKay in the "Hell, I'm worried about it, somebody better be worried

about it. They (Cleveland) aren't even a good football team. They aren't going to the Super Bowl." If the Buc defense doesn't get any better, Tampa Bay won't

For the second straight week the Buccaneer secondary looked like the remnants of a discarded spaghetti strainer. Brown's quarterback Brian Sipe, frustrated with an 0-6 first quarter passing performance, warmed up midway through the second period and began what turned out to be a record breaking day against Tampa's once proud defense.

Sipe completed 22 of 32 passes and became the first NFL quarterback to connect for over 300 passing yards against the Buccaneers. When the Cleveland signal caller wasn't busy picking the Bucs apart, he found time to hit Hill on 43 and three-vard strikes, Ricky Feacher on a 14-yard scoring pass and guided the Brown offense to Charles White's eight-yard

Ageless place kicker Don Cockroft added field goals of 35 and 36 yards in a point race with Tampa's Garo Yepremain to account for the Brown's 34 points.

Tampa was on its way to a first quarter rout when penalties and miscues halted the Bucs from blowing the game wide Williams drove the Bucs for a 37-yard Yepremian field goal

on Tampa's first possession and managed to drive again the next time Tampa had the ball. Ricky Bell rumbled in from eight yards out with an apparent score but the play was nullified on a holding call and Tampa had to settle for a 37-yard Yepremian score. The Bucs again drove in the closing minutes of the first period and attempted to pad a 6-0 lead, electing to go for a first down instead of a field goal on a fourth-and-one at Cleveland's 16. Williams tossed an incomplete pass to kill the drive, but it was one of few poor

plays Williams made on the day Tampa's controversial quarterback enjoyed his finest day as a pro, connecting on 30 of 56 attempts for three scores and 343 yards, all club records.

Williams hit Gordon Jones on a 41-yard strike and followed up with a shorter three-yard scoring pass to Jones and a sevenyard strike to Jerry Eckwood, who broke a team record with 10 Yepremian's two field goals boosted his career mark to 1,006






