WASHINGTON, Apr. 15 .- Steps to press the Rumantan relief debt question to early settlement have been initiated at Bucharest by the Washington government. The amount involved aggregates

nearly \$42,000,000 principal and interest, and the loan is viewed at the state department as a purely relief transaction, not to be confused with the general war debt problem.

Views of the Washington government have been presented at. Bucharest by Minister Jay in a formal communication. It calls attention sharply to the fact that Rumania has negotiated refunding agreements with several other governments covering similar loans negotiated after the American oans had been made and for smaller amounts, but that the obliga-tions to the United States thus far have been ignored. Loans Not War Measures.

The note also emphasizes that the loans were not made as war measures but to relieve urgent necessities of the Rumanian government and people after the war. On that ground, the Washington government holds that the loan.
