·But Mr. DeCottes has further based his figures on the number of cases handled in the circuit court during the past six years, including the active years of the boom. A better basis of comparison for the next two years would be the past year, ending Mar. 1, 1932. During that time 245 cases have been handled, making a total of 490 for the two year period. instead of 779 as Mr. DeCottes would lead you to believe. This further reduces the figure of \$104.000 to \$75.500.

But Mr. DeCottes has neglected to state that many cases actually docketed are never contested or litigated and that unlitigated cases can be handled through the mails, and consequently at no cost to the people of Seminole County. During the past year 108 of the 245 cases, docketed were never litigated. A careful consideration of this fact by Mr. DeCottes would further reduce the figure of \$75,000 to \$53,900.

But Mr. DeCottes has arbitrarily figured the cost of these litigated cases as a \$100 loss to Seminole County and has then he calls "money spent by lawyers going to Titusville for the purpose of arguing cases." This repetition has increased his estimated losses to Seminole County by \$5,000 a year, or \$10,-000 for the two year period. Thus the sum of \$53,900 becomes


