Merry 'Barges' Into Sanford

Revival of Sanford as a waterway port — for products other than fuel and chemicals — was underway today as a barge loaded with 200,000 building brick was maneuvered into docking position at the old bandshell "island" at the foot of Park Avenue on the lakefront.

The brick came from Merry Bros. Brick and Tile Company, of Augusta, Ga., and was shipped in via Merry Shipping Company.

That Merry Bros. became the first "customer" for the Port of Sanford, plans for which are still on the drawing boards. Construction of the port on the St. Johns River, just north of Lake Monroe, is expected to be completed by next October.

Formal ceremonies at 11 a.m. Friday will mark the unloading of the brick, the first consignment to the new port.

John Alexander, chairman of the County Commission, and Leo P. Moore, director of the Port Authority, will speak briefly.

Why They Came!

Some three-to-four years ago Merry Bros. of Augusta, Ga., looked into the future and decided Central Florida would be a good place to do business — and obtained the necessary clearances to use the St. Johns River as a waterway for its barges and Sanford as a port.

Now, after obtaining those clearances some three years ago, Merry Bros. first shipment — 350,000 building brick — tied up at about 9 a.m. today at a temporary dock at the foot of Park Avenue.

The brick will be unloaded on the old bandshell "island" — after appropriate ceremonies Friday — and then removed to a storage place on West First Street, across from the Florida Power and Light Company's sub-station, on land leased for 18 months from Chase & Company.

Merry Bros. will continue this arrangement until the Port of Sanford is completed on the St. Johns River, across from the FP&L power plant, when it will lease storage space there, shipping its product out by rail and truck.

Kirk Slapped By Jurists Here

The five circuit judges of the 18th judicial circuit Wednesday threw out the appointment of Gov. Claude Kirk as chairman of the Sanford Development Company.

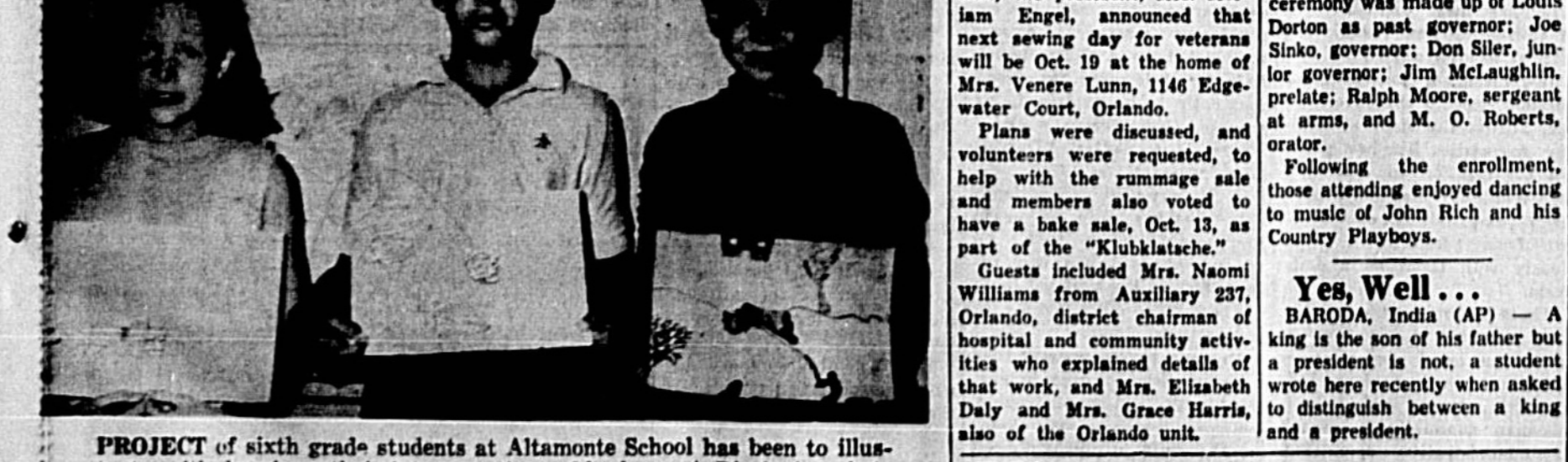

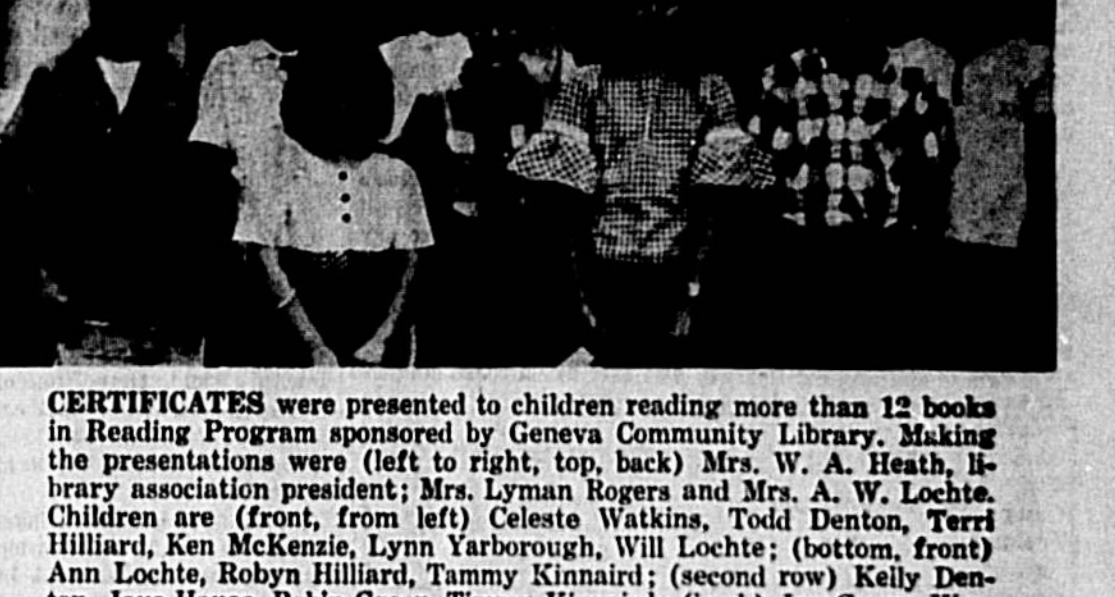

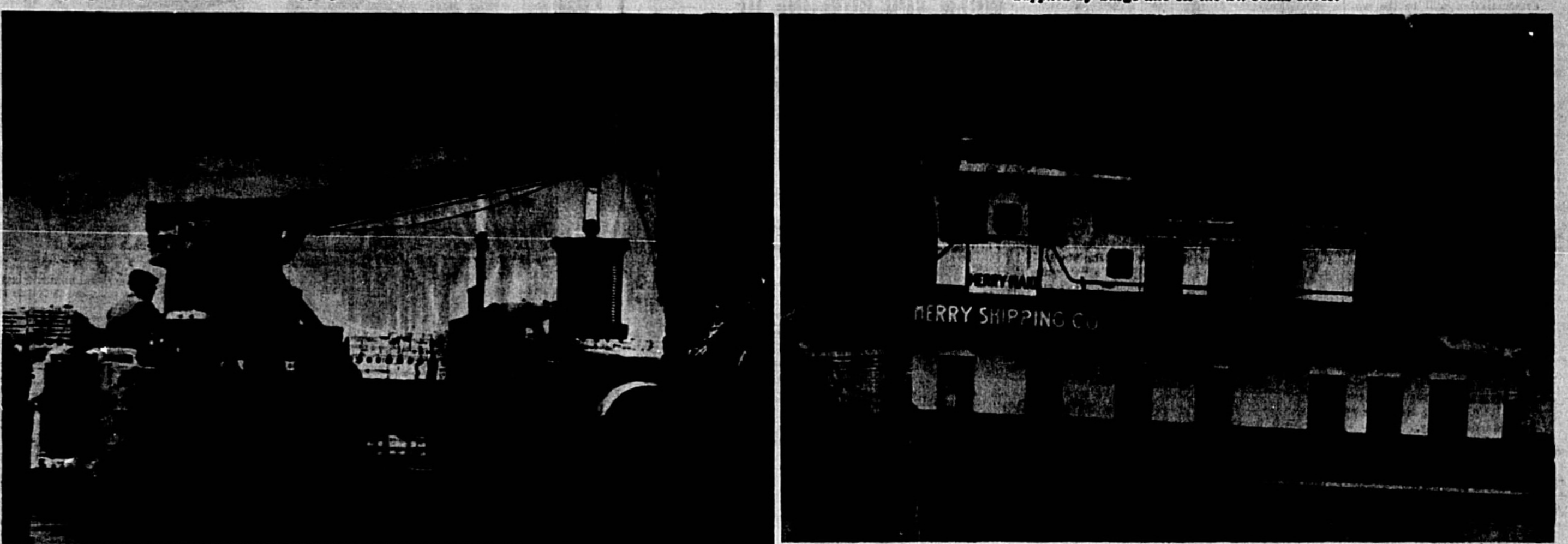
Questions and Answers

Q. I have a maid that works one day per week doing general cleaning duties in my home. Should I report her wages?
 A. The amount earned would determine if you are required to report the wages. If the person is paid less than \$100 per quarter, the wages need not be reported.
 Q. My maid does not wish for me to withhold social security tax from her pay. Can I waive reporting the wages?
 A. No. Wages must be reported if at least \$20 in a quarter.
 Q. How can I find out if my employer is reporting my wages correctly?
 A. You can secure a card from any Social Security District Office to mail to Baltimore, Maryland; you will be sent a copy of your earnings record as reported by your employer.
 Q. What records should I keep for Medicare bills?
 A. Keep all bills for covered charges. If you have doubts if bills are correct, check the Medicare Handbook or write to the Social Security Office.

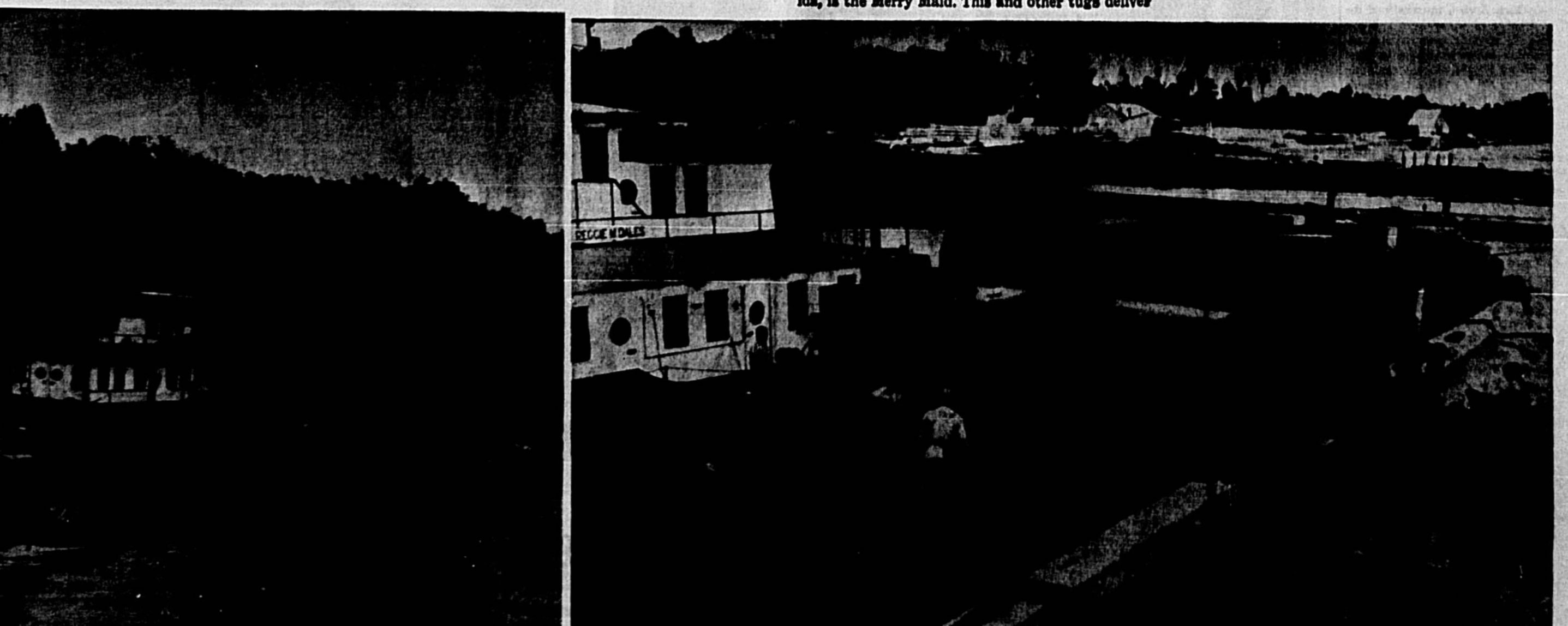
