Question To Pose

Disclosure that intelligence officers of the U.S. Army have kept civilian organizations and individuals under surveillance has aroused justifiable concern among the American people This is certainly an uncommon role for any branch of our military service.

The fact must not be overlooked, however, that the Army was carrying out this intelligence assignment on orders from the executive branch of the government.

Nor should we forget that at the time this activity was begun, in 1967, the nation was facing a period of grave civil disorders.

It emerges that former President Johnson, through a National Security Council directive, ordered the Army to gather information that would assist in efforts to control disorders in

The President issued his directive in conformity with the policy that the Army has always been at the disposal of the government to augment civilian law enforcement agencies when disorder of major dimensions threatens.

The Senate Judiciary Committee does not need to address the question of whether the Army should or should not have executed this intelligence-gathering function.

The Army was simply carrying out its orders. The only question remaining is whether good judgment and discretion were used in the

Organic Farming

Waste Not... Recycle

CASSELBERRY-America is a growing country, in population, in housing, in automobiles, and in miles of highways but growth no longer means progress, because we are running out of space in which to dilute the products of waste. Organic farmers believe they have the answer, that in

their hands lie the key to the survival of America as a work able, sensible place to live. Waste not and always recycle. That is the byword of the organic farmer. One such farmer in Seminole County is Axel Ornberg. He and his wife have been organic farming for seven

years, dating from the year of a heart attack when his doctor told him it was necessary to have a hobby. Except for meat, the Omberg's are completely self-sustaining. All fruit and vegetables are grown on their land. It is a labor of love.

Ornbrg had many tips to pass along. Nature will take care of herself. Nature has a way of building up the soil. Farmers of past generations managed to feed themselves without the use of poisonous chemicals. "I remember someone years ago telling me to take a can of mineral oil and walk up and down the corn and spray a drop of oil on each corn silk. For some reason I cannot explain, insects will not bother that corn," said Ornberg. Insects do not like the odors of marigold flowers, castor beans or radishes. Plant these in between your crops. As a rule it is the weak plants insects attack, and not healthy strong plants.

"I do many things," said Ornberg "to lessen insect damage, I buy several hundred pounds of bird seed. Birds eat insects, toads help too. Did you know most organic farmers purchase Praying Mantis eggs? The Praying Mantis will devour mites, caterpillars, lace bugs, aphids, borers, flies, lice and hundreds of other har still bugs, but is completely harmless to humans, animals, pets, flowers, plants and vegetables."

City Would Lease Barracks As Jai

City Manager W. E. Knowles has approached the Federal Aviation his engagement to Teresa Ar-Administration (FAA) again to lease the former Navy barracks building baugh, of Aiken, S.C. 310 at the airport. After failing in an effort to secure a \$1-a-year lease, the city man-

ager has returned with a proposal to lease the 40,000 square foot structure to use as a police station-security complex for \$10,000 a year over a five-year-period. The long-term lease would increase by \$5,000 a year over each subsequent five-year

lease term, as proposed by the city manager. This formula would mean by the 26th through 30th year of the lease, the FAA would be receiving \$35,000 a year from the city to allow the city to use its own property since, in effect, Sanford had a deed to the airport property.

Knowles made the offer to Gene Faulkner, compliance officer with the FAA at Miami, and pointed out that the city is having to maintain, and care for the building, which thus far has been impossible to lease, and yet is receiving nothing for time and ex-
