A Piece Of String

The St. Petersburg Independent differs with Roger Babson's recent statement that the Administration's present gold purchase policy is a prelude to price-fixing. "The commodity dollar," says the Independent, "if that is what the President is againg at, would have a fixed relation to a group of prices, but the various commodities themselves would vary in price, according to supply and demand."

The theory is of course that the average price of some six or eight hundred commodities would be held constant with relation to some given number of dollars. This would be accomplished by changing the value of the individual dollars. If the average price of all commodities were fixed at one hundred dollars, and the price suddenly began to drop, the value of the individual dollars would be reduced so that the average price would still be one hundred.

Applying the theory to our present situation, it is generally thought that prices are too low now and it is desired to raise prices to the level of about 1926. Average prices, instead of being one hundred dollars, for instance, are seventy-five dollars. The prices are to be pushed up to one hundred by reducing the value of each dollar so that it takes twenty-five more of them to buy the same amount of commodities.

It is exactly the same as if you have a piece of string which is two yards long. You decide that the string is not long enough for the work to be done. You must make it longer. So you decide that henceforth the yardstick instead of being three feet in length, will be only two feet in length. You "devaluate" the yardstick, in other words, by one-third. Now with your two foot yardstick, you measure the string and you find that instead of being only two yards long, it is three yards long. (Continued from Page One). as possible, Fagg said, adding that Washington authorities will be asked to allocate sufficient funds to Plorida to cover a payroll of 140,000 to 150,000 men by Jan. 1.

At present, there are 101,000 persons engaged in part-time employment on work relief projects, a survey showed.

All work-relief projects, undertaken by the emergency relief administration, will be transferred to civil works classification Thursday or Priday, Fagg said, and additional projects will be developed as rapidly as possible.

"The payroll will be about \$1, 200,000 weekly." Fagg said, adding that the civil works program will continue at least until Feb. 15. It will cease then unless Congress in session beginning shortly, makes appropriations for continuing it. or some similar program.

The previously created relief councils in all counties were designated by Hopkins as county civil works committees. Applications for civil works projects to be undertaken by cities or counties should be made to the county civil works committees, Fagg said, adding that where applications of this nature are made first to headquarters here they must be returned to the counties for approval before the state council can act upon them.

Fagg also said that delegations need not come to Tallahassee to urge their projects, saying recommendations would be considered only from county councils.

Only projects which can started quickly and finished Feb. 15 will be undertaken by the administration, Mr. Fagg said to-

Condition Is Pictured As Most Serious Of All Facing Growers

TAMPA, Nov. 21.-Citrus packing house cull piles have virtually passed from the Florida picture and instead, the highways leading cut of the state to other states are dotted with trucks hauling discarded fruit to market.

This is the situation as per-

trayed to officials of the Firida Citrus Exchange, who say it is the most serious aspect of the present citrus situation. They de-scribe it as being worse than it ever has been before, and it will get worse than it is now, if some-

This bulk fruit goes clear across the United States to the Canadian boundary, at Detroit, It reaches Baltimore, Washington, eltles in quantities.

Directors of the exchange at Friday's meeting c nsidered a request to Governor Sholts for an extra session of the Legislature to stop the traffic, but in view of the Governor's repeated refusals to call a session, they compromised by asking that the quession be called.
