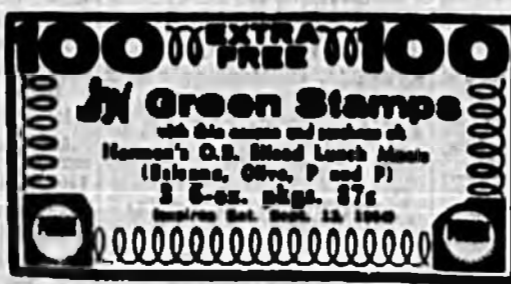

## Dora Heads Across N. Florida

### Winds Hit 62 MPH



### St. Augustine Dealt Severest Blow In State

ST. AUGUSTINE (UPI) — Monstrous Dora smashed through this historic coastal city today and inland across north Florida, dealing the area its worst hurricane blow of the century.

There were no immediate reports of casualties but thousands were homeless in Dora's wake as the storm crunched through north Florida's Piney Woods toward the northwest Florida panhandle. Dora left behind smashed fishing piers, crumbling beachfront restaurants and dwellings and chewed-up beaches between St. Augustine and Jacksonville beach and northward to South Carolina. Two amusement park ferris wheels were twisted by the storm and power was out in many coastal areas.

There were also reports of looting in both St. Augustine and Jacksonville and National Guardsmen were posted at Brunswick, Ga., where store fronts were blown in.

The coastline from St. Augustine north to Brunswick was a shambles. Cottages and beach-front buildings sat tilted and buckled on their foundations. Windows of a clothing store at Jacksonville beach were shattered and mannequins — their wigs blown away — were pitched into the street. Winds tore their fancy clothes to rags.

The weather bureau warned of high winds and up to 15 inches of rain during the next two days in parts of North Florida, Georgia and possibly South Carolina as Dora — its winds down to hurricane force of 75 miles an hour in gusts — smashed relentlessly westward at a slow 8 m.p.h.

Far at sea, another hurricane, Ethel, pounded to the west along the same track Dora took.

The Tallahassee Weather Bureau said in a special advisory that the center of Dora should pass close to the Florida capital during the night.

The meeting of city commissioners with marine engineers has been postponed until Tuesday at 8 p. m. City Manager Pete Knowles said this morning.

The regularly scheduled city commission meeting will be held Monday at 8 p. m., with several public hearings scheduled.

Juvenile Council meets at 8 p. m. today at the Courthouse.

Police of Sanford report everyone behaved themselves during the storm. There were no reports of any vandalism or other troublemaking, and only a couple of minor fender-scraping.

All went well at Seminole Memorial Hospital during the storm. Power never went off and business went on as usual with no emergencies attributable to the storm.

Telephone company survey teams went out at daylight this morning to all points in the county to try to get a comprehensive report on damages caused by Hurricane Dora.

Word from the VAH-11, Det. 8 Checkmates Wives Club at press time today says the big fashion show, scheduled for Friday night has been cancelled due to the weather and rescheduled for October 9th at the Ballroom on SNAS. More on this later.

Roger Harris, president of the Seminole High Boosters Club, said this morning that tonight's meeting of the organization will be held as scheduled, 7:30, at the School Board Building in Sanford.

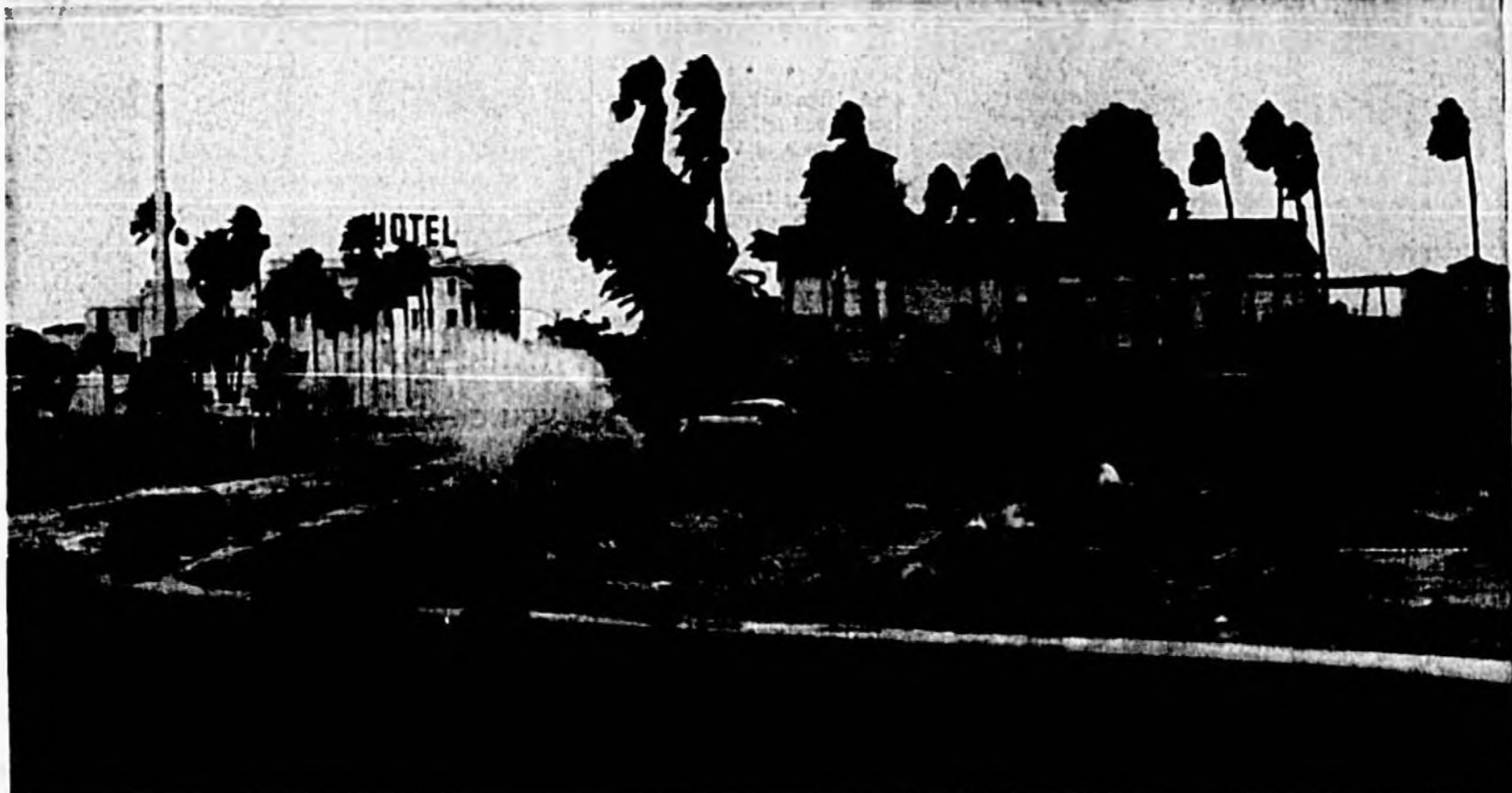

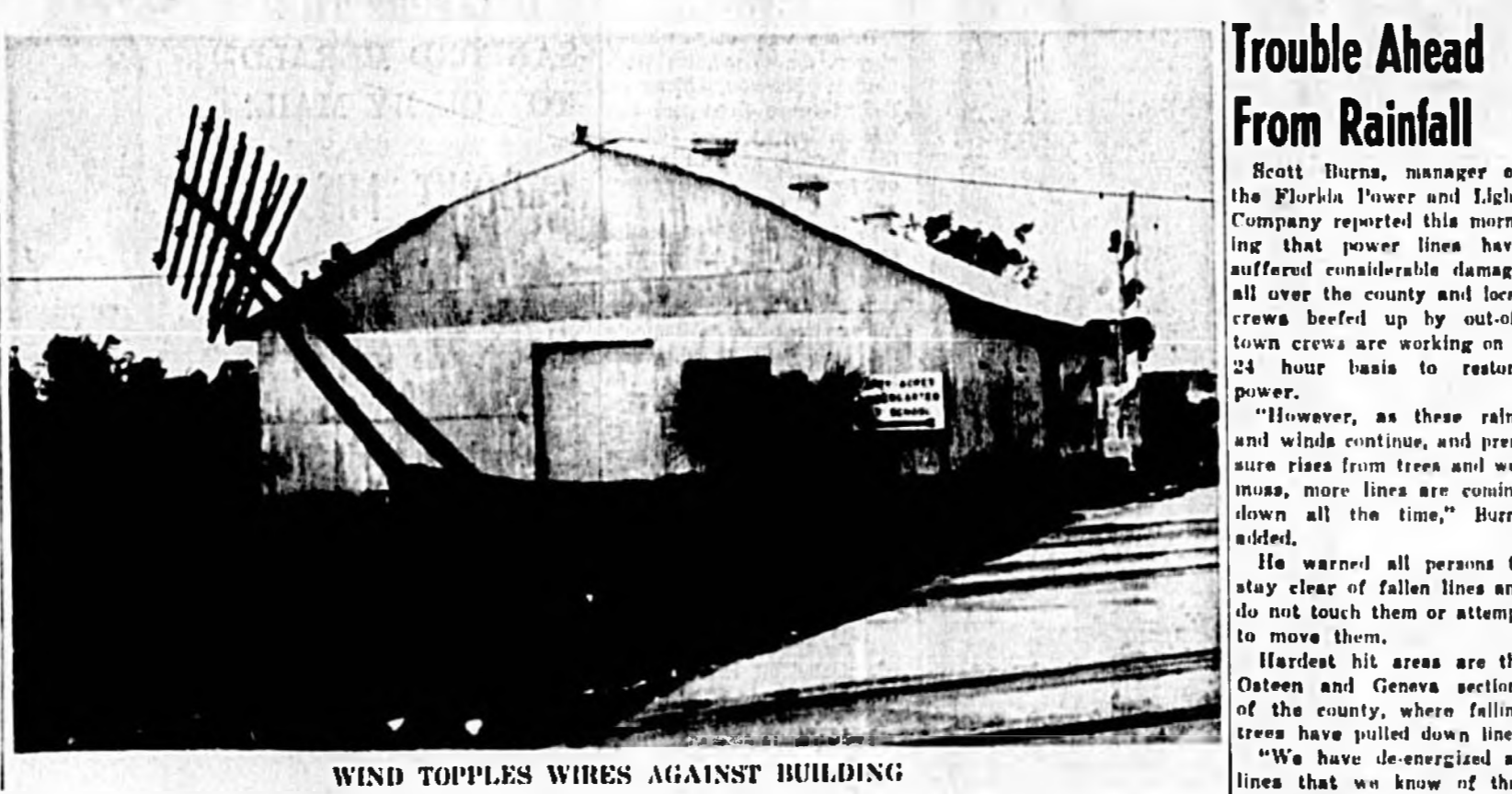

## Area Power Lines Damage Heavy



WIND TOPPLES WIRES AGAINST BUILDING

Sustaining winds of hurricane Dora, with gusts up to 62 miles per hour, lashed Sanford and Seminole County Wednesday.

Striking on the fourth anniversary of the visit by well remembered Hurricane Donna, Dora's gales left Sanford soggy but with no casualties nor injuries. Uprooted trees — one of which crashed into a home at Ninth and Elm in Sanford — and downed power lines were the most serious damages reported.

Power throughout the county area was reporting in service but several areas in Sanford were still without electricity at noon today.

The greatest danger right now, said local authorities, is from trees which are leaning at critical angles and could fall if rains continue to soften the earth around root structures.

Sanford Naval Air Station's chief meteorologist reported peak winds in the Sanford area were 62 m.p.h.

Municipal and county as well as public utility emergency crews throughout Seminole County were on a standby basis and maintained services as well as possible during Dora's passing.

Municipal and county authorities are keeping a watchful eye on Dora's sister storm, Hurricane Ethel. At noon today Ethel was reported to be moving westward from a position about 300 miles south of Bermuda.

## Crews Push Massive Cleanup Job In City

Sanford city crews, working round the clock since 7 p. m. Tuesday continued today their massive clean-up operation, as limbs, trees and debris kept on falling into already littered streets and yards.

Even during the height of the storm and all during the night, the yellow-slickered crewmen were busy taking care of the worst damages, often with debris falling all around them.

"We have not suffered any damages to our men, trucks or equipment, but they have done a magnificent job. None of the men have even been down on a home at the corner of Ninth and Myrtle; at the Imperial Gas Station at 13th and Park and on a home at Third and Magnolia.

Knowles also commended the local radio station for cooperation in relaying messages to the public.

"The public has been helpful also in informing us of trees and limbs down and blocked streets," he added.

As strong winds and rain continued today, reports of falling storm-weakened trees and debris were still coming in at press time.

He advised home-owners as they cleaned up yards to pile limbs and trash on the parkways at the curb line and be patient until city refuse crews can get to it.

"It took us nine days to finish up the job after Hurricane Donna," Knowles reminded.

Large trees were reported down on a home at the corner of Ninth and Myrtle; at the Imperial Gas Station at 13th and Park and on a home at Third and Magnolia.

Knowles also commended the local radio station for cooperation in relaying messages to the public.

"The public has been helpful also in informing us of trees and limbs down and blocked streets," he added.

As strong winds and rain continued today, reports of falling storm-weakened trees and debris were still coming in at press time.

Scott Burns, manager of the Florida Power and Light Company reported this morning that power lines have suffered considerable damage all over the county and local crews beefed up by out-of-town crews are working on a 24 hour basis to restore power.

"However, as these rains and winds continue, and pressure rises from trees and wet moss, more lines are coming down all the time," Burns added.

He warned all persons to stay clear of fallen lines and do not touch them or attempt to move them.

Hardest hit areas are the Osteen and Geneva sections of the county, where falling trees have pulled down lines.

"We have de-energized all lines that we know of that are down, but if any more come down we urge that they be reported at once," Burns said.

"All main feeder stations have been restored at the present, and we are getting to the smaller lines as quickly as we can," Burns said.

## Trouble Ahead From Rainfall

City firemen were summoned five times Wednesday when power lines were either downed by falling objects or shorted out due to the weather.

The first of the five calls was received at 3:03 p.m. when a line was down at 207 E. 10th St.

The next was at 4:37 p.m. when a falling tree limb pulled down a wire at 1512 Summerlin Ave.

The third alarm was at 5:30 p.m. when a power line was arcing on the ground at 2818 Grove Dr.

Then at 8:43 p.m. they stood by at 11th Street and Mulberry Avenue when another line was down.

The final call of the night was at 11:17 p.m. when a wire short-circuited at 1807 W. 12th St.

The two Naval officers were killed Tuesday in the crash of their twin-jet A-5A Vigilante into Lake Monroe.

Memorial services will be held for Lt. Cdr. Moore at 2 p. m. Friday in the Navy base chapel. He is survived by his widow, June, two children and a sister. The family requests contributions to the Navy Relief Society Scholarship Fund in lieu of flowers. Contributions may be mailed to the Reconnaissance Attack Wing One Staff, NAS Sanford, attention Lt. Isenburg.

A requiem mass for Lt. Haney will be recited at 11 a. m. in All Souls Catholic Church. Survivors include his widow Mary, three children and his

parents. The family requests contributions to the Mary Knoll Fathers, Mary Knoll House, 4107 Canal Street, New Orleans 19, La.

Both will be interred next week in the Arlington National Cemetery.

The accident claimed the lives of two of the Navy's most experienced Vigilante crewmen.

The Seminole County Sheriff's Department reported today that the home of James P. Hall just off Tuckermilla Rd. near Goldenrod burned to the ground Tuesday night, while the family sought safety in a hurricane shelter.

The family is being cared for by friends and relatives. Hall had recently rebuilt the house after it burned down in 1957. The cause of the fire has not yet been determined.

A case of breaking and entering was reported at the Driftwood Bar on the corner of Beardall Ave. and 25th St., during the night, when would-be thieves forced open a door and attempted to open a safe without success. It is being investigated.

Sheriff J. I. Hobby commended the power and telephone company for keeping electric power and telephone lines in working order throughout the storm.

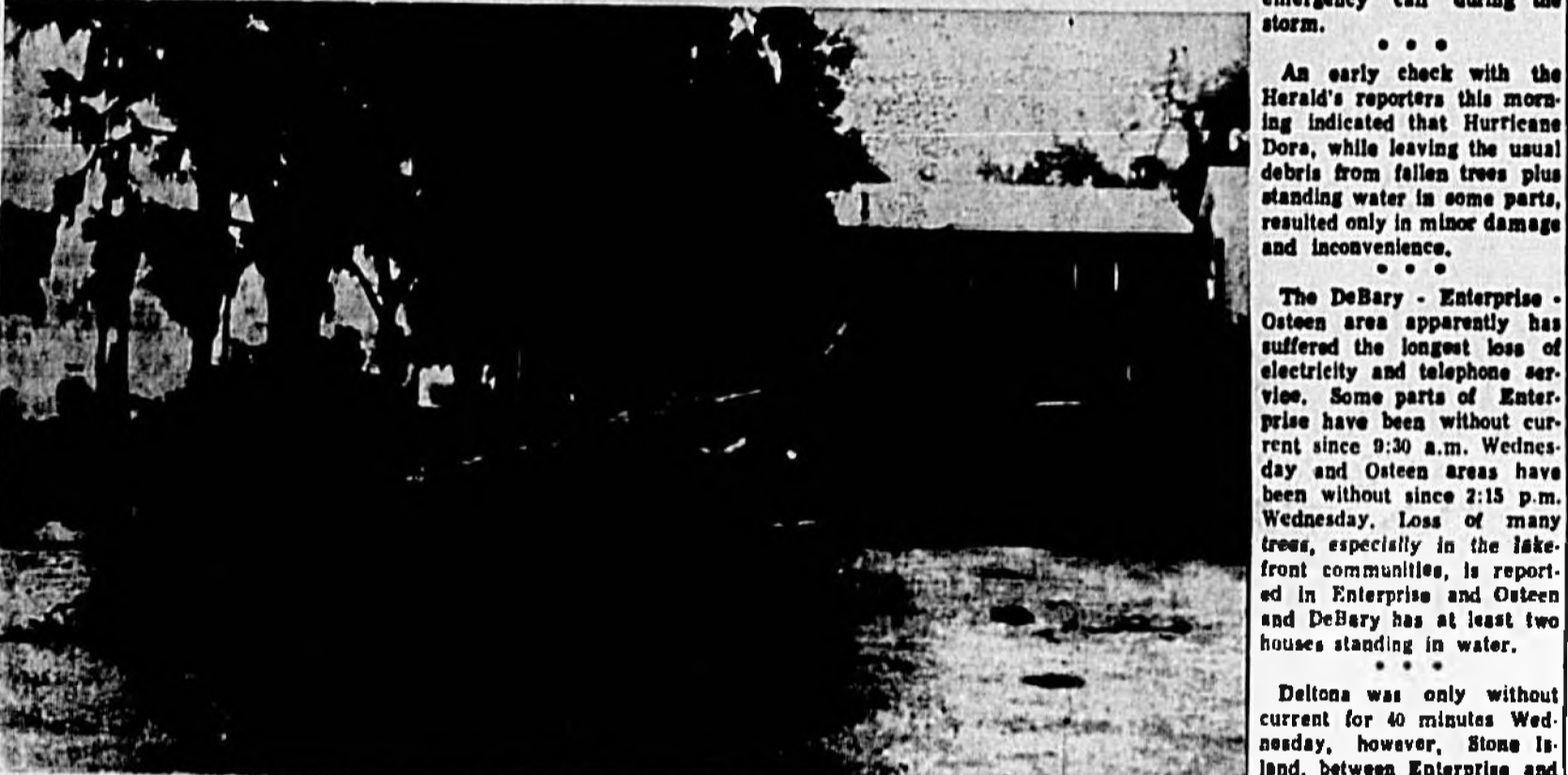

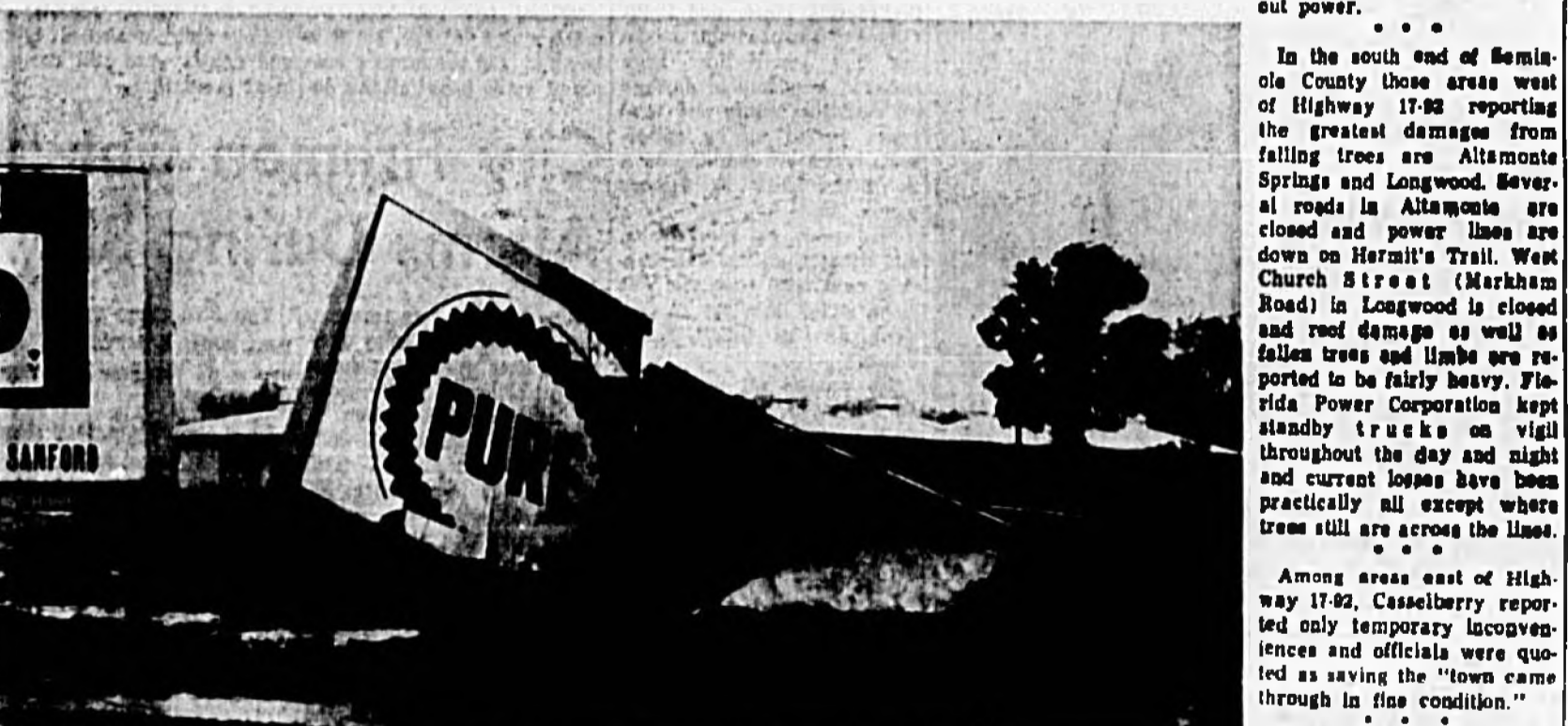

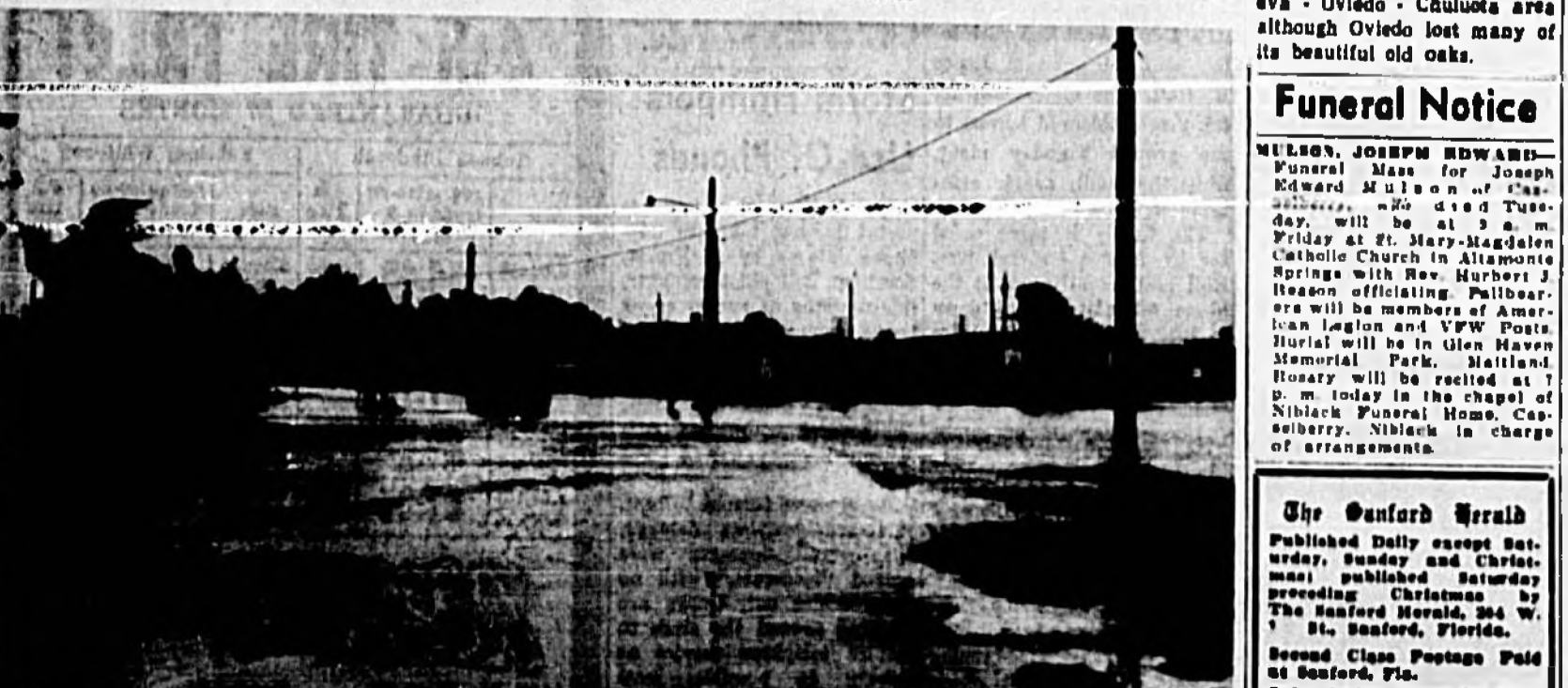

# NFO Leader Puts Halt To Mart Revolts

CORNING, Iowa (UPI) — The National Farmers Organization, reacting to the death of two NFO members crushed beneath the wheels of a cattle truck, today called off all protest demonstrations in its 23-state market rebellion.

Open Lee Staley, president of the NFO, issued a post-midnight plea from his headquarters here, calling upon leaders and members of the militant farm group to stop demonstrations.

Staley called the death of two NFO members at Bonduel, Wis., Wednesday a "ruthless and uncalled for act." The two men, Melvin L. Cummings, 45, rural Birnamwood, Wis., and Howard Falk, 34, rural Bonduel, Wis., were killed as they and about 500 other NFO members and supporters tried to stop a truck carrying five cows and two calves to the equity cooperative yards.

# LBJ Starts FBI Probe Of Racial Woes

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Johnson has asked the FBI for a comprehensive report on its investigation of recent racial riots and other disturbances to see if they fit a common pattern.

The Chief Executive told a news conference Wednesday that "considerable agitation" obviously was involved in disturbances in both the North and South. He declined to say, however, whether FBI had found any signs of outside agitation or political motivation so far.

# Ford Next For Pension Talk

DETROIT (UPI) — United Auto Workers President Walter P. Reuther goes to Ford Motor Co. Friday where he will demand a better contract than the \$90 million, pattern-setting agreement he reached with Chrysler.

The Chrysler settlement called for pensions up to \$400 a month at age 60, early retirement, wage increases, additional relief time, two more paid holidays, an extra week's vacation, improved benefits for retired workers, improved insurance benefits, increased survivors benefits, and improved jobless benefits.

Reuther and Chrysler administrative Vice President John D. Leary agreed the settlement was non-inflationary. Leary said, "we wouldn't be a part of any inflationary settlement."

# Union Chiefs Hail Auto Pact

DETROIT (UPI) — Chrysler's historic \$400-a-month at age 60 pension plan will have a tremendous impact on the American labor movement and the Social Security system, according to the United Auto Workers union.

The UAW said the plan would create thousands of jobs for young people and get the older workers off the assembly lines.

Union President Walter P. Reuther said "it doesn't make sense to stay (on the job) when you can get these kind of benefits. A man would be very foolish to work until he was 62."

# Johnson Swings Campaign Pitch To Pennsy Voters

## 6,000 Expected For Big Meet In Harrisburg

By William J. Egan  
WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Johnson invades Pennsylvania tonight on a vote-seeking trip to help kick off the Democratic campaign in one of the key northern "battleground" states.

Johnson was scheduled to address a 1100-a-plate fund-raising dinner at the Farm Show Arena building in Harrisburg, the state capital.

About 6,000 persons were expected to attend the formal launching of the Democrats' election drive and hear the President deliver his second major political address since his nomination for a four-year term.

Johnson is anxious to win Pennsylvania's 20 electoral votes in November and boost the chances of Miss Genevieve Blatt, Democratic contender for the Senate seat now held by Republican Hugh Scott.

The President planned to leave the White House about 7:45 p. m. EDT less than two hours before his scheduled address between 9:30 and 10 p. m. EDT. He was expected to return to the White House late tonight.

Pennsylvania cast its vote for the late President John F. Kennedy in 1960 but elected Republican William W. Scranton to the governor's chair in 1962. The death of Rep. William J. Green Jr., long-time Democratic boss in Philadelphia, may make Johnson's task more difficult.

The Chief Executive opened his election campaign in Detroit with a Labor Day appeal for national unity. He stressed the goals of peace, prosperity and justice while indirectly challenging Republican candidate Barry Goldwater's views on presidential control of nuclear weapons.

The White House said the democratic national committee would pay Johnson's travel expenses on the Harrisburg trip, as it did for his appearance in Detroit.

Another presidential appearance—before the convention of the machinists' union in Miami Beach next Tuesday—also was announced by the White House.

## Barry Heads For East Rallies

SEATTLE (UPI) — Republican presidential nominee Barry Goldwater, "terrifically encouraged" by early campaign reaction, headed east today from the Northwest where he accused the Kennedy-Johnson administration of playing politics with foreign policy.

The Arizona senator described himself as greatly surprised and greatly pleased at initial responses to GOP campaign efforts. Midway in his first week of intensive campaigning, Goldwater scheduled speeches in Idaho, Montana and Minnesota today.

A rally here Wednesday night in the new Seattle coliseum was one source of encouragement to the GOP nominee. There were loud cheers, fireworks, cascading balloons and an overflow crowd which responded warmly to his regionally televised speech on foreign policy.

Rallies at the Boise, Idaho, courthouse and the fairgrounds at Great Falls, Mont., were on the senator's schedule today as his big three-jet campaign plane headed towards Minneapolis for what was described by aides as a major speech tonight.

## Car 'Explodes' Into Pieces; Driver Unhurt

VERNON, Calif. (UPI) — "My station wagon literally fell apart. The body of the wagon turned over, and before I knew it there was a young woman—whom I had never seen before—crying hysterically by my side. We? I just had a few scratches. Then someone helped me out of the wagon and I knew I was all right. It was as simple as that."

This was how John Robert Brynes, 22, Long Beach, Calif., described his near-miraculous escape Tuesday night when his station wagon—going 85 miles an hour—struck a guard rail on the Long Beach freeway and almost disintegrated.

Investigators said pieces of the vehicle were strewn 300 feet along the highway and the engine dropped onto a surface street 30 feet below the freeway.

Brynes said he lost control of his wagon when it started to swerve because the car in front of him was going too slow.

## Ancient Arch Lives Slow Pace

COVENTRY, England — (UPI)—Arthur Arch turned 86 today and said the world is moving too fast—20 minutes too fast, to be precise.

Arch has lived 20 minutes behind the times for 42 years. He maintains that everybody is out of step but himself.

"It's all very simple," he said. "In 1922 the clocks were changed 20 minutes. I never accepted this. Nobody was going to take 20 minutes off my life. So I just kept my watch at the old time."

"It has never stopped since and it is 20 minutes behind the foot's time that everybody else keeps."

Arch conceded that being a non-conformist has its problems. He has been fired a half dozen times for being 20 minutes late to work. He is consistently 20 minutes late for appointments. He has missed a lot of trains.

Even his wife keeps "fool's time," he said. "She has to. The radio keeps to it and she likes to listen to the radio."

"But they won't beat me," Arch said. "I'm going to die 20 minutes late to show them I was right."

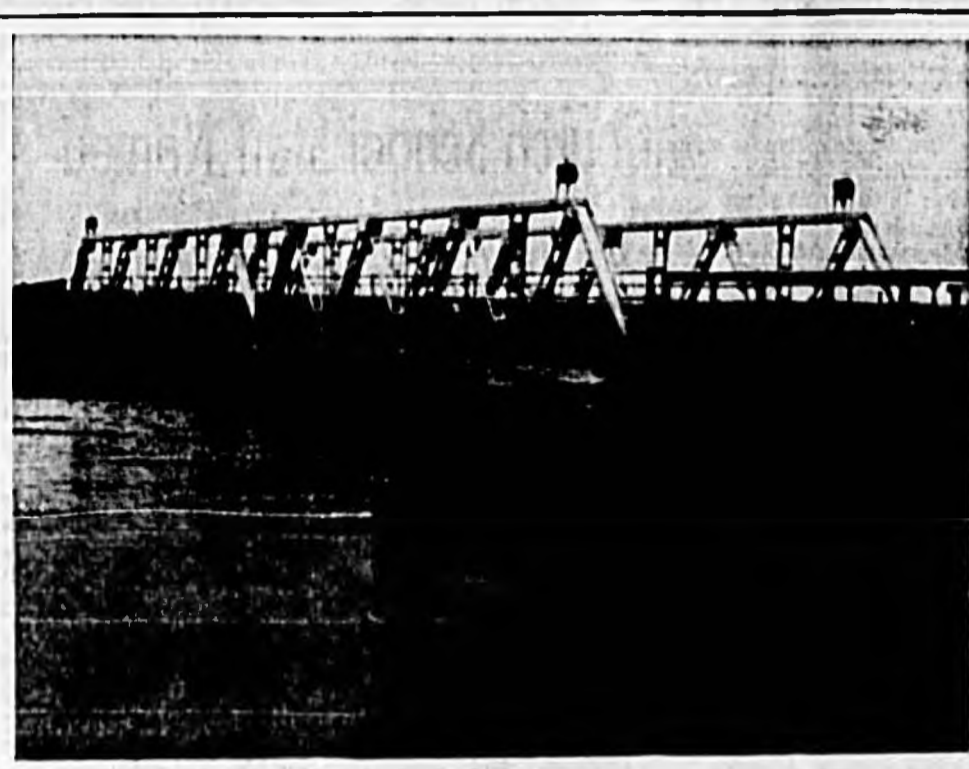
