Do Your Part

The annual Roll Call of the American Red Cross has gotten off to a good start and bids fair to achieve its goal well before the time limit of March 81 expires. This year of all years there is every incentive for making generous contributions to such a worthwhile organization not only because the need is so great and the cause so just, but also because individual incomes generally are up and the things for which money can be spent are limited

In Seminole County the quota is \$8,500. Last year the regular Red Cross Roll Call was for \$1,500 and later a war fund drive was made for \$5,000. And an additional \$1,000 61.56 for the war emergency brought the total for the year up to \$7,500. Thus this year's quota is only \$1,000 more than was actually raised last year and should produce no hardship on anyone.

Ned Smith, chairman of the drive, says that patriotic easons alone should be sufficient to induce everyone to make a sizable contribution. And in this connection we would like to remind the public that Mr.-Smith is a busy man, has accepted this chairmanship for patriotic reasons alone, and those who are assisting him in the drive are in the same boat. The public should make their labors as light as possible and not ask them to come back a second

Throughout the country the Red Cross is planning to raise \$125,000,000 this month. That is a lot of money It is, we believe, the largest sum of money ever asked from the people at one time by any one organization. But there is no doubt that the need is acute. There is no doubt that the Red Cross is the best equipped organization in the world to handle the task which lies before it. It has over 3,750 chapters with some 6,000 branches, and uses 800 volunteers for every paid worker.



# **Issuing Clothes** Is Comparable To **Assembly Line**

CAMP BUANDING MAN MAN MAN (Special)—An Army Maptation of industrial assembly line methods elothes hundreds of Florida selectees bere daily in the record time of 45 minutes per man.

Operated under the direction of Capt. L. H. Lachicotte, the cloth-

ing assembly line is both a speedy and accurate method of clothing the large number of men who pass through the Reception Center. Out of a total of 44 items received by each man, an average of only 1 per soldier requires alteration. And according to Capt. Lachicotte, "there is no rea-

son for a poor fit."

The warehouse which provides a roof for this rapid method of giving the new soldier his wardrobe is situated on "B" road in Blanding, close to the hutments used by selectees returning from 7-day furloughs. Daily it re-ceives from the Quartermaster rush shipments of shoes and shirts, socks and ties, field jackets and overcoats to be fed to the assembly line where new soldiers are gradually being clothed as they pass by. The soldier about to receive his

Army outfit plunges into the camphor-scented air of the warecamphor-scented air of the warehouse from a platform which is
on the other side of the building
and parallel with the one where
the military habiliments are received and stored. First he passes a deak where he is checked off
on a roster. Then he gets two
blg barracks bags, filled with 10
items such as handkerchiefs, neckties, towels—things which will not
have to be fitted to him. He also
puts all his civilian clothes except his shorts and socks in one
of the bags.

As he passes along the line, the
novitiate is gradually dressed in
Army apparel. He tries on the
clothes he is going to wear. He
dons an O. D. Shirt, puts one
away in his bag, and so on down
the line in 45 minutes or less,
including his visit to the shoe
man. Contrary to popular opinion,


