



Congregational Christian Church The last time I wrote an article for this newspaper space that the Herald so generously provides as a public service it was entitled "Rambling Reflections." I was grateful for the many comments I received concerning the article and this is my only defense for continuing in the same vein today. Hopefully, prayerfully what I have to say will challenge you to think and then to act. You may disagree with some of the things that I have to say, but I trust that we shall be able to sagree in a spirit of Christian love and understanding. What did Jesus mean when he declared "Except ye

repent ye shall likewise all perish"? Many men ruin their health in order to accumulate a vast fortune and then spend their fortune in an attempt to regain their health.

Why are elderly people often unloved and unwanted? The fundamentalist who correctly dots his theological "I's" and crosses his theological "T's" has to be careful lest his theology degenerate into a type of Pharasic legalism

The extreme liberal, who is so open-minded, has to be

careful lest all of his brains do not fall out. You get to heaven "heart first" rather than head first. No amount of knowledge about Christ is an adequate substitute for knowing Christ personally.

Faith that excludes common sense is nonsense. Therefore trust God but do not forget to fasten your seat belt. I read in the Detroit Free Press recently where Dr. Billy Graham was quoted to have said that he did not believe that the Bible taught absolute abstinence from alcohol. He cited the classical example where Jesus turned water into wine at the wedding feast. You may or may not agree with Dr. Graham but you have to admire him for the courage of speaking his convictions. Dr. Graham is not hypocritical. Dr. Lester Schriver, pastor of the Congregational Christian Church in Mt. ## Democratic Leadership-Two Brands

Immediate reactions of two powerful Democrats to the nomination of Senator George McGovern of South Dakota for the presidency are, in one instance alarming and, in the second

For there can be no other conclusion by those who want to see deomcracy work and eligible citizens turn out to vote in greater numbers than the decision of George M. Meany, president of the AFL-CIO, to sit-out this election than to be

Taking into consideration all of the factors at work - which must include the gruff, cigarsmoking Meany's personal antipathies - the history-making and breaking vote of the union's executive council to "refrain from endorsing either candidate for office of President of the United States" sets a "no-vote" example which is deplorable.

"Sitting on the hands" has been one of the most difficult political practices to expose and overcome when a good voter turnout has been

For such a powerful Democrat as Meany to headline his resolve to do just this-". . . my interest would be if there were some easy way to defeat both of them (Democrat McGovern and GOP Nixon . ." is a disservice which can, by a (hardly likely), change of heart, be converted into a true contribution to representative

As for the intra-party disputes which have already been noted and are the unescapable result from the bold reform of the presidential nomination practice which the McGovern win illustrates, these could be a real spur to more voters casting more votes.

Presidential 1972 is very apt to be a political watershed in which both of the major parties shift their positions and become more easily defined and with differences more easily seen.

The other major Democratic leader who has now emerged from the shadows which engulfed him when the delegates to the Democratic National Convention refused to seat the delegates from Chicago which had been elected with the hand of Mayor Richard J. Daley controlling the method (found to be in violation of the new reform regulations) is, of course Mayor Daley, himself.

His approach to the presidential campaign was strictly impersonal but in keeping with the political life of this veteran boss of the Chicago

WASHINGTON - The presumed centers of both the Democratic and Republican parties have been moving around on the political spectrum lately. Perhaps the outcome of the 1972 presidential election will determine where each now resides.

Sen. George McGovern of South Dakota, the Democratic nominee, has already claimed unequivocally that the center of his party has shifted left.

Not so widely recognized is the fact that under Mr. Nixonthe Republicans have been undertaking an increasing amount of political and economic activism that has also moved the GOP off its traditional conservative foundations.

But much deeper questions than that are involved. If McGovern is elected, will the Democratic center have been moved permanently to the left? If he is defeated will this mean the party will go back to its previous, almost centrist position? Will the party shatter into warring Similarly, if President Nixon wins, presumably with

will this bring on the sometimes predicted emerging new Republican majority?

Will the South then become an area permanently attached to the GOP? Would Republican success bring a return to more traditional, hands-off business, government policies? Or has the party moved permanently toward a more liberal, activist posture? Ever since Franklin Roosevelt in 1932 forged a coalition

of liberals, the South, and big city machines, the cutting edge of the Democratic Party has been its liberal wing. It has set policy and attracted large blocs of voters but was not always able to deliver on promises because of southern defections. despite party labels, in congressional voting. Roosevelt, said the party was "a little left of center."

Now McGovern is suggesting that the center has been moved much further left, oriented more toward the "new politics" of his followers than the liberal-Democratic, slightly left-of-center politics of Roosevelt.

If elected, McGovern's case for a new orientation of the center would be greatly strengthened. In politics success

Take a deep breath. If you are in a crowded room, a bus, a plane or a restaurant, chances are good that you have just inhaled a fair quantity of cigarette smoke, perhaps spiced with a pungent dose of cigar fumes.

Are your eyes smarting a little? Are your lungs rebel ling at the touch of tainted air? Do you wince at the bedasional direct gust of smoke that curls under your nose? Unless you are one of those devout cigarette wor shipers to whom pure air smells bad, you are unlikely to escape at least an occasional adverse reaction to the smoke-filled room. And even if you are not aware of it the smoke may be doing some unpleasant things to your

Up to now, the antismoking campaign has concentrated on the harmful effects smoking has on smokers them-

Since the 1964 Surgeon General's report linked cigarette smoking with cancer and other diseases. Americans har in fact cut down. But there remains a hard core of tho who either refuse to believe or choose to disregard research findings, leaving us with a smoky minority of about 44 million peole who patrronize cigarette makers. plus the cigar and pipe clientele.
