



### Frayed Cable Blamed

VAIL, Colo. (AP) - A frayed cable may have caused the derailment of two aerial gondolas that dropped 100 feet to the mountainside at the Vail Mountain ski area,

killing three people, a ski area official says. "The cars looked like tuna fish cans ... it was mangled. There were ski poles sticking out of the top," said a skier who arrived at the scene moments after Friday's crash, which also injured nine persons.

Bob Parker, senior vice president of Vail Associates, operator of the ski area, confirmed witnesses' reports that a cable carrying the gondolas was frayed and acknowledged that the frayed cable may have caused the

Parker said the cable was last given a thorough inspection in May 1975, but added that it was inspected and greased weekly by Vail Associates.

### Postal Cuts To Continue

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Postal Service says it is still cutting services and will carry out plans to curtail business deliveries in 10 Eastern cities next week, despite a statement by a key congressman who says the agency

promised a moratorium on cutbacks. Chairman James M. Hanley of the House Postal Service subcommittee called a press conference Friday to announce that he Fostal Service had "seen the light" and had agreed to suspend all plans for cutbacks in mail

Later in the day, the Postal Service issued a statement that said, "There is no moratorium on our cost-cutting programs. The Postal Service is currently proceeding with those cost-cutting moves that have already been announced and which are the only prudent steps open to

Kissinger Says Plans

### Against Cuba Are Warning

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger says the Ford administration is not contemplating specific action against Cuba and that drawing up military "contingency plans" is only a warning to Cuba and Russia not to intervene in Rhodesia.

Kissinger assured the Scnaté Foreign Relations Committee on Friday that "there is no crisis that now requires us to contemplate specific action" against Cuba. But, he added, "We do want the Soviet Union and Cuba to understand that it's a matter of deep gravity and we want to do this before any irrevocable decisions are

Cuba sent 12,000 troops into Angola to aid Communist-backed forces there in their successful fight this year for control of that former Portuguese colony.

### Videla To Replace Peron

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP) - Gen. Jorge Videla, the army commander and member of the junta that deposed President Isabel Peron, will replace her as president of the republic Monday, the junta announced as political violence flared after a short lull.

At least 10 persons were killed on Friday and three others in the previous 24 hours. The deaths raised the year's

Violence had plagued the crisis-ridden, 21-month administration of Mrs. Peron, who was overthrown Wednesday in a bloodless military coup. She is reported under custody, guarded by 600 soldiers, in a luxury retreat house owned by a provincial government 900 miles south of



### Use Of Coal Urged

TAMPA (AP) - The reconversion of Tampa Electric Co. power plants into coal-burning units would save customers \$4 million a year rather than costing them \$16 million annually as claimed by the company, a federal energy official says.

Bill Rosenberg, assistant administrator of the Federal Energy Administration (FEA), said Friday that TECO customers would realize the savings because of the switch to lowcost coal from expensive oil.

At a meeting with TECO executives and state officials, Rosenberg criticized the power company's calculations of we much the reconversion would cost, and he said the fuel savings had been urderestimated in TEOO figures. "It is our estimate there will be a \$4 million savings to the consumer from the conversion, not a \$16 million cost," Rosenberg said.

### **Award Controversy Erupts**

GAINESVILLE (AP) - The Gainesville Sun and the Florida Education Association United are involved in a controversy over the 1975 School Bell Award the newspaper thought it was going to receive, but didn't. H.G. Davis Jr., a Sun editorial writer, says he received a letter March 10 from FEAUnited President Richard D. Batchelder saying the daily had been selected for the award given for editorial excellence.

On March 23, Davis said, he received a call from Batchelder informing him that the initial award announcement was premature. Davis said Batcheider made it clear that some of the Sun's editorials did not reflect the views of the union.

### Cancer Testing Effective

ST. PETERSBURG (AP) - A nationwide program for the early detection of breast cancers may actually cause cancer in a few women, says the president of the American Cancer Society, but preliminary results indicate the program is saving the lives of many more. Dr. Benjamin F. Byrd Jr., cancer society president, said that 245,000 women over the age of 35 have been screened at 27 breast cancer detection demonstration

# Zeigler Jailed On Four Murder Counts

ORLANDO (AP) - Furniture-store owner W.T. Zeigler Mays was at the store to pick up a television set as a gift for his Jr. has been jailed without bond following his indictment on four family. counts of first-degree murder in the Christmas Eve shooting deaths of his wife, inlaws and a store customer.

Circuit Judge B. C. Muszynski ordered the crew-cut, slightly built Zeigler, 35, arrested and jailed Thursday after he was in-

dicted by an Orange County grand jury. The jury heard testimony from more than a dozen witnesses and deliberated two days before indicting Zeigler, who had been free on \$40,000 bond.

### **Primary System Needs Overhaul**

Are the 30 presidential primary elections necessary? Is it really essential that serious candidates spend the huge amounts of time, effort and money to round up enough delegates to win the

Every four years we hear such questions concerning reform of the nominating process. Then, after the nominating conventions are held, the subject drops from sight, to be replaced by more pressing matters of government policy.

It's time, however, that we look at the presidential nominating process that has evolved primary and precinct caucus structures, state laws and party rules.

In 1960 there were only 18 primary elections today there are 30, each without any relationship to the others. Together they account for approximately three-fourths of the delegates which will attend both national conventions this summer.

Students of politics have suggested that many of these elections represent waste motion. For instance, James S. Beniger, a graduate student in sociology and statistics at the University of California at Berkeley, wrote in Public Opinion Quarterly (Spring, 1976) that the conventions almost always nominate the candidate with the most support among party voters, as measured in the popularity polls.

"The candidate who stands highest in national opinion (polls)," he wrote, "has the best chance of winning both the state primaries and the presidential election. . . . Despite the occasional success of an 11th hour challenger like Wendell Willkie or of a primary strategy like that of George McGovern, there is no greater advantage than strength in the early polls for winning the presidential nomination."

We doubt whether anyone would propose eliminating the primary system, necessary to provide some elimination process leading to the national conventions. A frequently mentioned alternative, however, would be regional primary election dates, on which states in the same geographical region would hold simultaneous

Regional primaries would let candidates focus their traveling and staff work on one part of the country at a time. More important, they could develop positions on issues that are of major concern in those regions.

Congress should move ahead on studying various alternatives so that a more orderly system can be devised well in advance of the 1980 elections.
