Plants should be placed as closely as possible to the original growing depth in the container. When transplanting is completed, plants should be mulched to increase soil water holding capacity, reduce evaporation from the soil, reduce competition between plants and grasses or weeds, reduce soil compaction, reduce soil temperature during summer and decrease temperature fluctuation during winter.

Federal Funds Helping Zoo, Red Bug Park

The U.S. Department of Labor has approved the use of \$50,000 in federal money to hire workers at the Central Florida Zoo and at Red Bug Park, Jim Bedsole reported today.

Bedsole, who hand-carried the county's request through federal offices in Atlanta on Friday, said 43 workers will be hired with the \$50,000.

"The Labor Department signed it on Friday after I carried it through," Bedsole said this morning.

"We've started applications, and all the people should be working by Friday," he added.

Bedsole is the county's director of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA) program, a federally-sponsored program which pumps about \$4-million yearly into the county to offset unemployment.

Eighteen workers are scheduled for the Red Bug park project, while the remaining workers will be assigned to the zoo.

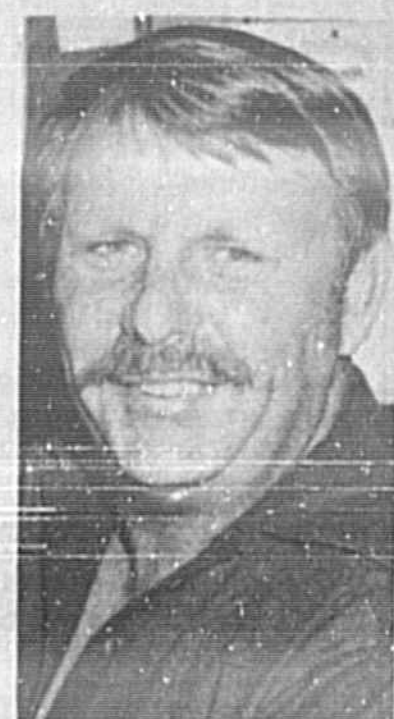
County Commission Chairman Michael Hattaway said he decided to utilize the \$50,000 after meeting with Zoo Director Al Rozon. Rozon, Hattaway says, informed him additional workers are needed to complete zoo projects.

Bedsole said job seekers have to be unemployed for a minimum of 90 days and must be Seminole County residents.

Job applicants may apply at CETA offices in South Seminole County, or at Florida Employment offices in Sanford and South Seminole.

Also, Bedsole says special recruiting efforts will be made Wednesday from 10 a.m. until noon at the CETA outreach station at 9th Street and Palmetto and from 9-11 a.m. Thursday at the Antioch Baptist Church in Oviedo.

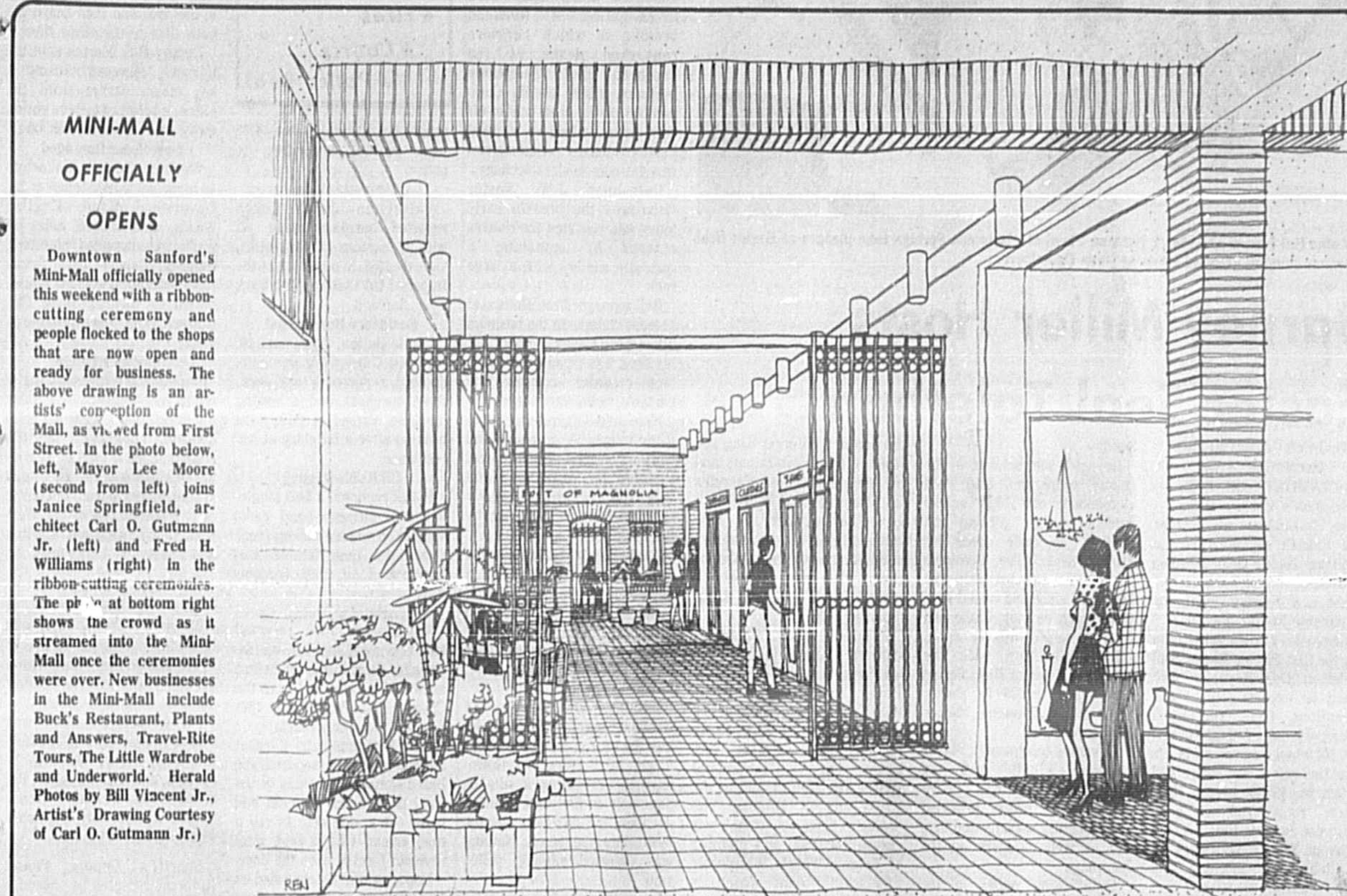

over because the program was not required to pay unemployment compensation — was made by Hattaway.

Hattaway's project was approved by the full board on Tuesday.

At the zoo, workers will be utilized for completion of projects that are under deadline as a result of a \$100,000 grant from the state.

At the park, the workers will attempt to get the first phase of that facility into operation by early summer.

Reagan Critical Of Networks For Refusing Him Air Time

Ronald Reagan, faced with the refusal of the three major television networks to sell him air time, says they should grant his request "in the interest of fairness and justice as well as the peoples' right to know."

Reagan said that by refusing to sell him time, ABC, CBS and NBC are denying him equal access to the people, because "the other contenders"—President Ford — can usually get network time whenever he requests it for an address that isn't considered purely political.

Meanwhile, as the final full week of campaigning before the April 6 presidential primaries in Wisconsin and New York was launched, Alabama Gov. George Wallace said that if he doesn't win the Democratic presidential nomination this time he probably will retire from politics after serving out his term as governor.

Wallace, who ran second to Sen. George McGovern in Wisconsin's 1972 primary, said Sunday on NBC's "Meet the Press" that he intends to continue his campaign for the presidency until the Democratic National Convention in July, despite defeats by Democratic frontrunner Jimmy Carter in three consecutive primaries — Florida, Illinois and North Carolina.

The hustings were relatively quiet on Sunday as Ford, Reagan and Democrat Jimmy Carter all took the day off.
