### Czechs Oust

(Continued From Page One)

In a telephone call to Berlin, Kolarek, press attache of the embassy in Prague, said the Czech government accused him of "grossly abusing" his diplomatic office by using Czech nationals for spying and propaganda work against their government. Kolarek denied the charges.

The Czech government last October had announced it had smashed a spy ring directed by six former U. S. embassy officials. U. S. Secretary of State Dean Acheson said in Washington at the time that these charges obviously had been "trumped up."

"They (the Czech Communist

government) are really turning on the heat against us now," a Prague embassy spokesman commented in the Berlin telephone conversation. The U. S. I. S. library long had been under Czech secret police pressure. Czechs who patronized the library frequently were stopped and warned not to return there.

In another development, J. Zastava, 20 years old, was sentenced to 18 years in prison on his conviction on charges of high treason and spying. Zastava, a student, also was ordered expelled from the country, the dispatches say. This is the usual procedure in Communist Czechoslovakia and other Iron Curtain countries. The indication is that the sentence must be served before the prisoner is expelled from the country.

Zastava was reported sentenced along with 15 Czechs, but details of the accusations against them

were not immediately disclosed. Meanwhile, in Berlin, the son of a deputy prime minister of Soviet occupied East Germany became a political refugee in West Berlin.

Ralph Kastner, whose father is leader of the Eastern Liberal Democratic Party (LDP), announced he had fled with his wife and children to escape "unbearable Communist pressure."

The U. S. high commissioner newspaper, Neue Zeitung, reported that the son telephoned Deputy Prime Minister Hermann Kastner on his flight after safely arriving in the American sector. The LDP press office declined to comment. The father, whose own career has been endangered by Communist-instigated purges of the LDP this year, answered no further telephone calls at his East Berlin home.

Young Kastner told the American official newspaper that "there is no democracy to speak in the East since any longer."

He accused East German Communists of arranging for a single list election next October "although most of the people are funny determined to vote no."

And in Berlin, Chancellor Konrad Adenauer of the West German Republic denied there was any nationalistic intent when he asked a Berlin audience yesterday to sing a verse of the former national anthem, "Deutschland über Alles," (Germany above all).

When Adenauer called for the singing yesterday at a public meeting in his honor, Socialist leaders, affronted, walked out of the hall in protest.

In the south German city of Munich, German police arrested today a twice-wounded former U. S. Army soldier, Homer Cook, 37, of Muskogee, Okla., wanted on charges, was found sleeping in a freight car in a railroad yard here.

(Continued From Page One) him, but he slowly worked his way back to what had become "normal" for him. Other ailments, many of them aggravated by his confined, immobile life, fastened on him. He suffered from colds, hay fever, eczema, curvature of the spine, pneumonia, eye trouble and kidney stones.

At one time he and his family had hoped and planned for the future, but as the years passed, they gave it up. On Christmas in 1938 his father said: "We don't talk about futures; we're just going along from day to day."

A few days before Sweet's 51st birthday—also in 1938—it was found that his coming of age would make him ineligible for state and county help.

Unlike another widely-known iron lung prisoner, Fred Switz of Chicago, Sweet's parents were not prosperous and had to have outside assistance for the \$100-a-week expenses of their son.

But the law proved static. County officials called on Gov. Herbert H. Lehman, now a U. S. Senator. He consulted with his legal advisors. In the end, they agreed that if the law were looked at from a certain special angle, the aid could be continued, and it was.

"It just had to be done," said County Judge J. Gordon Flannery, now a state supreme court justice. "We couldn't let down a lad who had fought as long as he had."

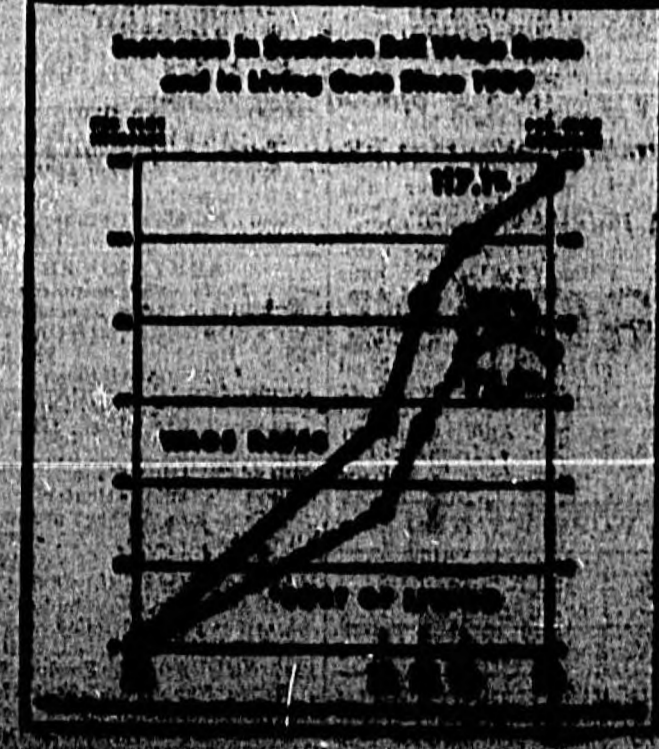

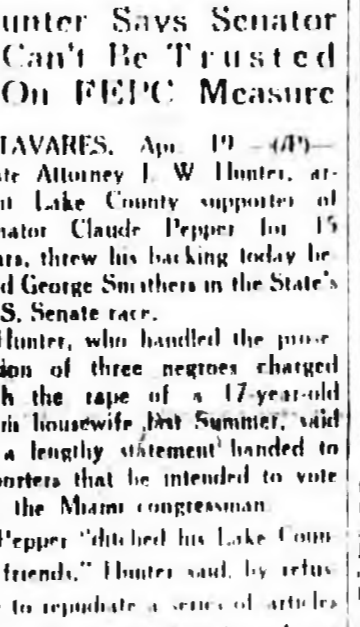
