SANFORD — Rob Nixon, the county's incoming economic development director, said Friday he's fond and familiar of Sanford and Seminole County.

During training at the Navy Nuclear Power School in Orlando in the mid 1980s, Nixon said he frequently drove to Sanford.

"I like to explore, to observe all I can," Nixon said from Fort Pierce, where he

has two weeks remaining as economic development director of St. Lucie County. Nixon, who'll be 35 in November, wowed Seminole officials during interviews to find a successor to Bob Turk,

who resigned two months ago as economic development director.

"He's sharp, enthusiastic, we're happy to have Rob Nixon," Seminole County Manager Kevin Grace said Friday.

A native of Flint, Mich., Nixon was educated at Thomas College in Thomasville, Ga., at Florida State and at Valdosta State. He was the Urban Recruitment Program Manager for Enterprise Florida, Inc., and has been in St. Lucie County since May 1999.

"I'm coming to a vibrant place, a favorite of mine," Nixon said. "We're going to help create good jobs and show the people the benefits. This has become

Florida's first football powerhouse

Judge recalls when Stetson competed with Gators, 'Noles

Another football season is here. As the smell of pigskin rises in the air, unique memories come to Sanford Judge Gene Stephenson.

Stephenson knows that when most dedicated Florida college football fans are asked to name the first Florida college that beat both the Florida Gators and the PSU Seminoles

in football, they would be wrong in naming the Miami Hurricanes. The correct answer is the Stetson University Hatters.

Stetson University is Florida's first private university, located in DeLand about 30 miles north of

Sanford. It was founded in 1883 as DeLand Academy by Henry A. DeLand, a New York philanthropist.

The name of the school was changed in 1889 to Stetson University to honor John B. Stetson the nationally known hat manufacturer. The Stetson teams are called

the Hatters in recognition of the large financial contributions made by Stetson as a result of selling a lot of Stetson hats.

Stetson doesn't have a football program now, but its football heritage dates back to 1894 when two teams of Stetson students played two games. Unfortunately, one of the

Track work continues on CR 427

There have been several announcements during the past two months, regarding when and where roadways will have to be closed during work to improve CSX railroad tracks in Seminole County areas.

The latest information was supplied this Thursday by Brian K. Scales, with Kaiser Engineers of Longwood:

The tracks at Longwood/Lake Mary Road and General Hutchinson Parkway will remain closed for an additional week. This work has required more time to be completed properly. This section of roadway will reopen Friday, Sept. 22.

The next phasing of this work at the tracks north of SR-434 on CR-427 is scheduled to begin Monday, Sept. 25. CSX estimates this section of roadway will remain closed for two weeks.

The final closure of CR-427 will be south of Dog Track Road, and this work is scheduled to begin Monday, Oct. 2.

Scales said if there were any additional changes, he would notify the media, in an effort to keep the traveling public and emergency services aware of the status of the CSX improvement work on the CR-427 project.

'Kids Voting USA' lets youngsters vote for president

In Florida, a person must be 18 years of age or older to register to vote.

But what if the voters who would select our leaders were children, from kindergarten through 12th grade? Would the decisions be different than the adults or would they have a tendency to go along with what they hear at home? We may find out this year.

As the adults go to the polls for the General Election on Nov. 7, students will also be involved in voting under a program called "Kids Voting USA/Seminole." It's a non-

profit, non-partisan voter education group with educational and private sectors as partners.

The program was first started in Arizona in 1988, and is now a national effort which has been overwhelmingly accepted by teachers, parents and students.

Youngsters in grade kindergarten through twelve will participate in classroom activities about the rights and responsibilities of voting, and become registered voters, not officially, but for the sake of this program.

On November 7th, students, most of whom will be accompanied by an adult, will go to their neighborhood polling place and cast their ballot.

Seminole County Elections Supervisor Sandy Coard said her department will not be involved in the Kids Voting

Glass show opens in Sanford

SANFORD — People prone to clumsiness will need to stay away from the Sanford Civic Center this weekend.

Thousands of pieces of glass, china and pottery are on display for the annual September Sanlando Depression Era Glass Show and Sale. Twenty-seven top-quality dealers from all over the Southeast are attending the event, which continues until Sunday.

Joe Solito of Connecticut brought only a small portion of his glass collection to the Sanford show — about 1,000 pieces.

"This is only a drop in the bucket," Solito said. "Back home, I've got about 15,000 to 20,000 pieces."

Solito said he began collecting Depression Era Glass in 1975 after he attended a tag sale with a neighbor. He found a chip saucer for 10 cents, and he was hooked.

"It was just amazing to me," he said. "And, it turned me on

to this." According to Solito, the glassware was produced during the Great Depression of the 1930s. There are two types of glassware from the era — machine-made and hand-made glass.

The machine-made glass was

mass produced and usually inexpensive, he said. It was even given away at movie houses or appliance stores.

"If you purchased a stove, you got a set of dinnerware,"

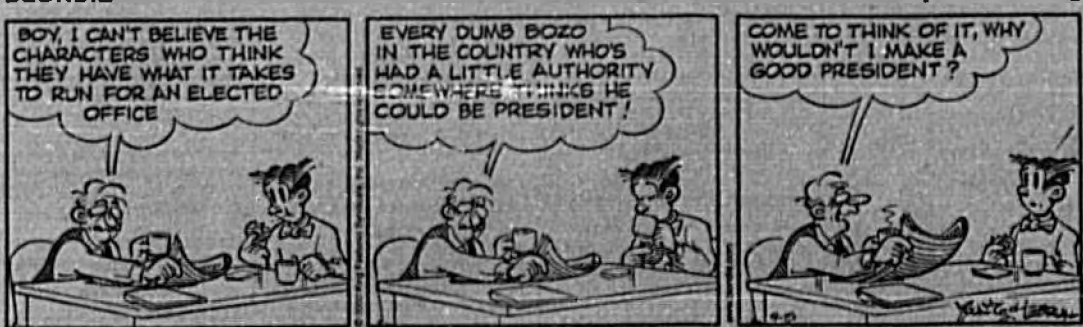

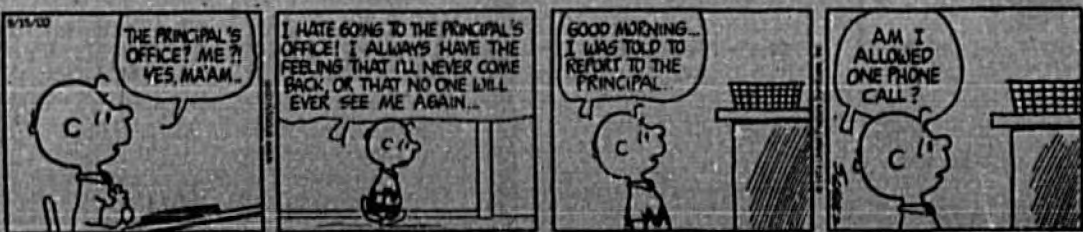

Tampa Bay had the most selections with two, WR/DB Lawrence Samuels and FB/LB Andre Bowden made the team for the first time. Samuels had a team-high 19 receiving touchdowns on 844 yards and Bowden led the team in rushing with 14 touchdowns and a game average of 11.1 yards per game.

WR/DBs Curtis Ceaser of Florida and Sean Riley of

Milwaukee round out the All-Ironman squad. Ceaser led the Bobcats with 771 yards receiving and 14 scores, along with a team-leading four interceptions. Riley, in only his second AFL season, was fourth in the league with 1,349 receiving yards with 1,349 and 27 touchdowns.

Privacy laws not so private

Computerized or not, your medical records and intimate health data are supposed to be accessible only to those with a legitimate need to see them.

And yet, in recent years, incidents have demonstrated just how easy it is to subvert security measures. Knowing only the birth date and ZIP code of the governor of Massachusetts, for example, a computer-privacy researcher at Carnegie Mellon University was able to retrieve his health records from a supposedly anonymous database of state employee health-insurance claims.

The electronic storage of individuals' intimate medical data has offered new convenience for snoops, increasing the ease with which health marketers and others can find out what ails you.

For the time being, personal health information is held in three distinct and separate oceans of electronic data: government and institutional databases, commercial databases, and the Internet.

Where commercial databases are concerned, there are no laws governing the use of information, much of which is voluntarily provided by consumers filling out a questionnaire, registering a warranty or even buying something from a catalog.

The Internet, meanwhile, is a wide-open marketplace, where both deliberate and accidental privacy breaches can happen.

When it examined the privacy practices of 21 of the most popular health-care Web sites, the California Health-Care Foundation found—in some cases—that the sites were violating their own privacy guidelines, usually by sending personal information to third parties without the knowledge or consent of site visitors.

We support the prompt enactment of these regulations. In the meantime, you can help keep your medical records and health-care history private by limiting disclosure of your personal information to your insurance company.

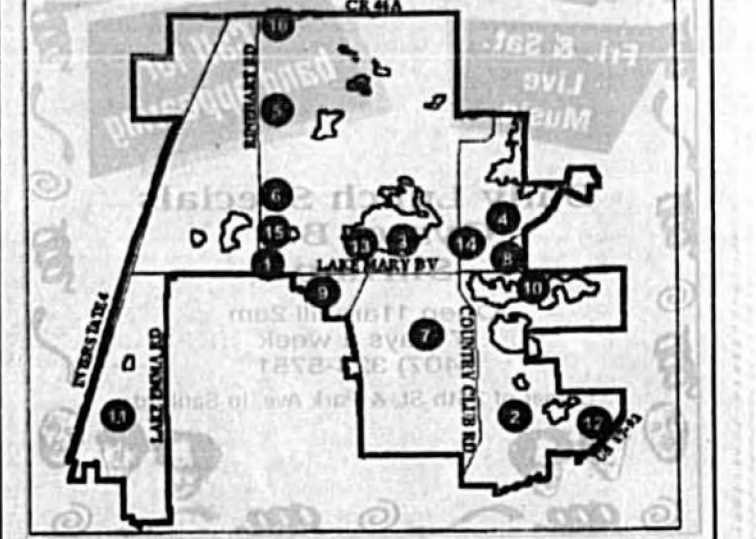

Some people believe attending church can make them sick

Can going to church make you sick? Some people say it can.

A recent column of mine on "the peace" — that interlude in the worship service when members of the congregation scurry around the church greeting other members with hugs, good wishes and "the peace of the Lord be with you" — brought forth a large response.

While some writers said they like the practice,

most agreed with me that "the peace" is an unwelcome intrusion into the mood of worship.

"I hate it!" wrote an Episcopalian from Vicksburg, Miss. "I have a friend," she says, "who falls to his knees in a prayerful way during the peace so he won't have to indulge in this charade. I've thought of doing that."

There is a touch of irony to this matter of the peace.

As a frequent church visitor, I have been struck by the fact that while I may receive an enthusiastic welcome during the peace, often nobody speaks to me when the service is over.

I walk out of the church alone, ignored and suddenly forgotten. Where have all the smiles and good fellowship gone?

Back to my correspondent who hates the peace. She admitted, however, to being a hated "pew blocker" who stakes out a seat at the end of a row even though it earns her dirty looks from those

who must try to get past her.

She defended herself by saying, "I'm short. If I get buried further down the row, I can't see what's going on."

But her main purpose in writing, she said, was to take aim on people who go to church when they have head colds.

"I don't know why," she says, "but they usually take a pew behind me, coughing and sneezing all over me. I am just getting over the flu from one such experience."

Another correspondent said she no longer goes to church because the perfume wearers in the congregation make her "physically ill." She suggested roping off an area in the sanctuary for perfume wearers.

"Then, maybe I'll come back,"

she said.

Churchgoers' biggest health concern is not, however, the coughers, sneezers, snifflers and perfume wearers, but the use of the common-cup communion.

Germs were unknown in ancient times, so the Bible has no rules on hygienic practices, but some churches urge people with colds or other communicable diseases not to drink from the common cup at communion.

Medical doctors disagree about the health dangers posed when many people drink from the same communion cup. Those who say the common cup may serve as a means of transmitting disease admit the risk is very small.

A doctor quoted in a Catholic brochure said, "The alcoholic content of the wine, plus the practice

of wiping the cup and turning it to a new position for each communicant, seems to remove any danger of disease being transmitted."

Other physicians, however, dispute the claim that the wine (14.5 percent alcohol in sacramental wine) kills any bacteria.

Many religious people have no fears about drinking from a common cup. They have faith that no harm can come to them while they are consuming wine that represents — or has been turned into — the Lord's blood.

As for the germ-carrying sneezers and snifflers, with winter coming on, my suggestion is that churches put cough drops in the pews before the first snowfall.

That led to a job at the *Orlando Sentinel*. My Season of Self-Doubt ended — and we were very grateful.

During the time I was without work — the newspaper I worked for had died — I received few telephone calls. Friends said they

weren't sure what they could say. One said it was like I had died. The mail brought the rejections. It seemed like an endless Season of Rejection.

Then, without warning, was an offer to write a free-lance article for a magazine. A trip to the Poconos to a basketball camp. A \$2,000 check for the article — \$1,000 up front, \$1,000 when I was done. My Season of Coming Back had begun.


Then, three weeks at the *Chicago Tribune*. Great pay. A chance to catch the Cubs at Wrigley Field before working the night shift. I did well. But the *Tribune* didn't have a job open. They "optioned" me to Orlando. A Season in the Sunshine.

I can't say the things as well as Pastor Walsh will on Sunday. But I promise you will learn about the Seasons of Life from him. I suggest, also, that whatever Season this is for you, praise God and be grateful. With each season we grow in maturity and in love with our God.

And, don't forget The Pension.

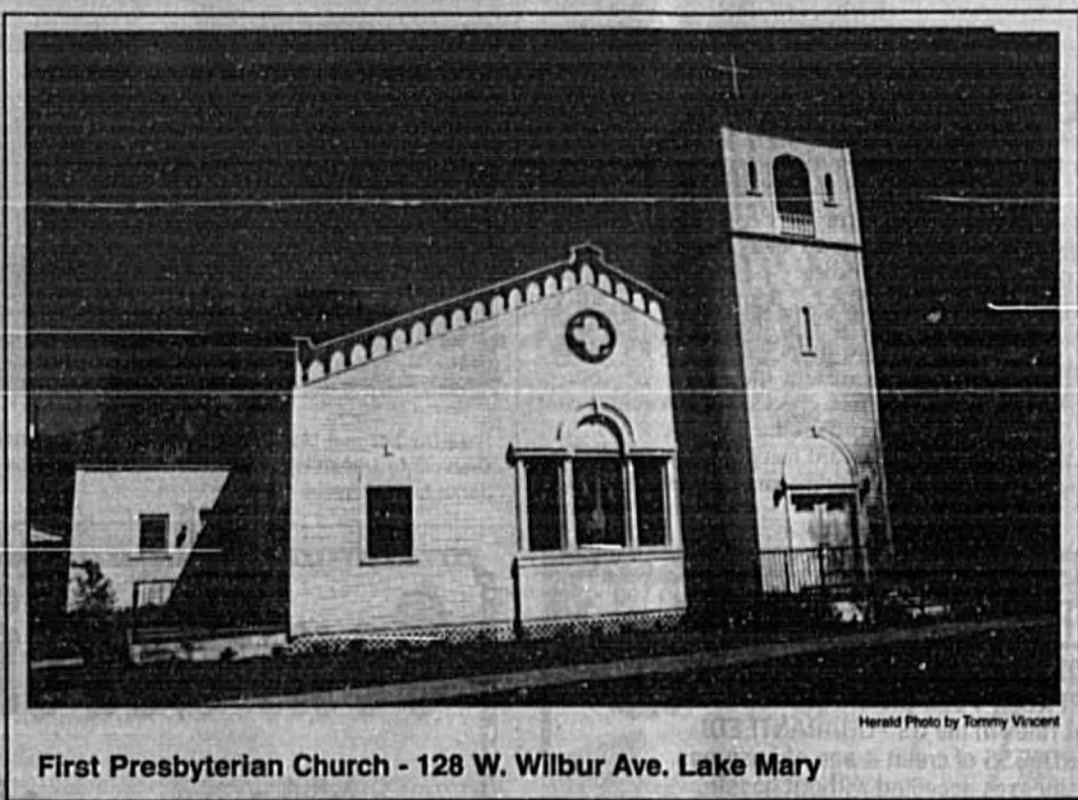

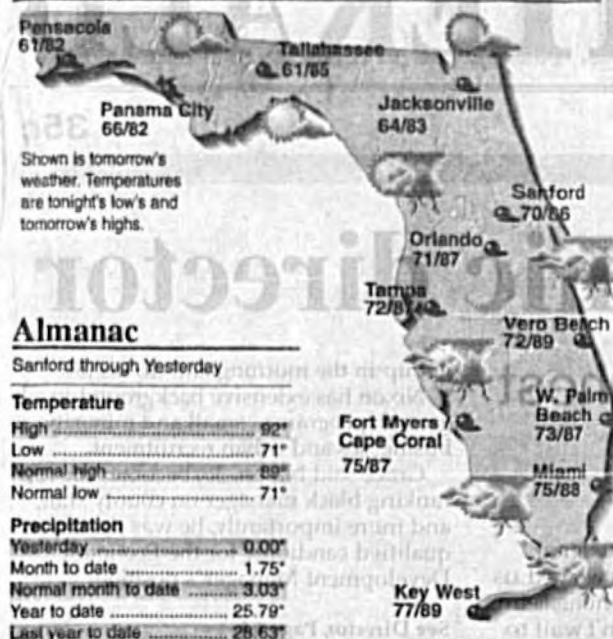

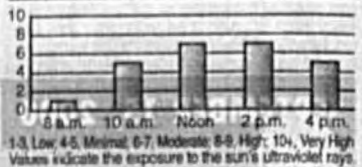

Iron toxicity is uncommon and usually limited to toddlers

DEAR DR. GOTT: My 80-year-old uncle, who swore by his daily iron tonic, recently died with symptoms of nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, weight loss and fatigue. Could his 50 milligrams of daily iron be the cause?

DEAR READER: In healthy adults, excess iron is eliminated in the stools. Therefore, iron toxicity is extremely rare. Iron poisoning is almost always acute and, for practical

purposes, is limited to toddlers who accidentally ingest iron supplement pills, some of which, tragically, look like M&Ms. Acute iron toxicity causes diarrhea, abdominal pain, gastric bleeding, lethargy and seizures. If untreated, the condition can lead to coma and death. Iron overload (hemochromatosis) is the most prevalent form of toxicity in adults. It is a genetic disease that interferes with the normal

metabolic controls preventing excess absorption of the mineral, and is associated with diabetes, heart failure, and inflammation/scarring of the liver that leads to cirrhosis and death. The diagnosis is made by blood tests. Because hemochromatosis would not cause the symptoms you described, I believe that your uncle died from causes other than iron toxicity. Moreover, your uncle was consuming a very small amount of supplemental iron — the usual dose for iron deficiency is 300 to 600 mg. daily.

DEAR DR. GOTT: My 76-year-old wife suffers from a progressive balance problem. She cannot take a few steps forward without lurching and to avoid taking side steps to avoid falling. She's had an MRI, carotid ultrasound, audiologic evaluation, EKG, Holter monitor and routine blood tests — all with negative results. What do you suggest as our next step?

DEAR READER: I recommend a consultation with a neurologist, if you haven't already obtained one. It sounds to me as though your wife has a neurological disorder that is extremely difficult to diagnose. For example, two possibilities — Parkinson's disease and multiple sclerosis — spring to mind; neither can be diagnosed in the early stages by the tests you listed. A neurologist, by meticulously examining your wife, should be able to narrow the possibilities and, I hope, arrive at a "clinical judgment," based on how your wife moves and appears. This type of analysis is what neurologists do best. If, on the other hand, she has

seen a neurologist, I suggest referral to a diagnostic clinic at a teaching hospital, which welcomes unusual and challenging medical problems. 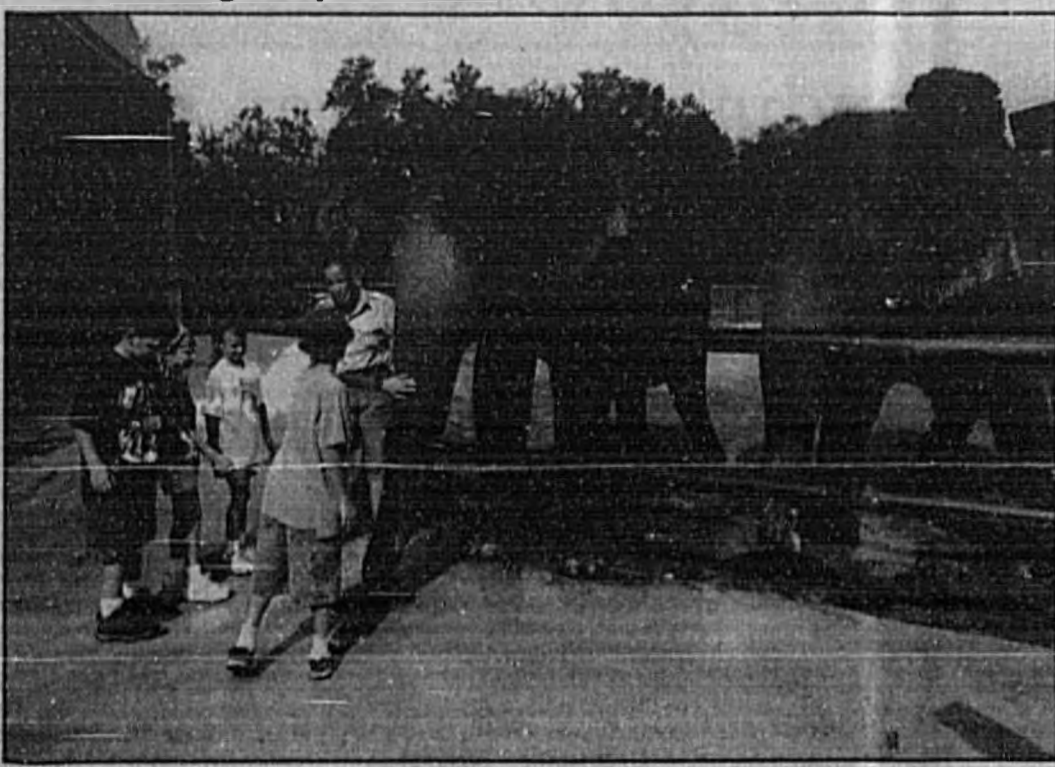

Sister upset brother picks 'wrong' side

DEAR ABBY: I am 37 years old and have one older brother who is 39. When we were growing up, our family was very close, but something happened when my father passed away eight years ago. Within a few years my mother remarried. Soon after, my marriage to an abusive man fell apart. My brother decided to support my ex-husband and held me responsible for not giving him a "second chance." This hurt me deeply. When my mother recently divorced — her husband wanted the divorce — again, my brother took the husband's side. My brother's wife is a born-again Christian and doesn't believe in divorce, no matter what the reason.

My mother is heartbroken and so am I. I always looked up to my brother. I wish I knew it was his wife's influence and not his choice. He promised our father on his deathbed that he would take care of us. Not only has he walked away from us in our time of need, he has sided against us. I have tried talking to him, but it doesn't work. Is there anything I can do? I still love my brother and always will.

SNIFFLING SIBLING IN TEXAS

DEAR SNIFFLING: If talking to your brother hasn't helped, there is nothing more you can do. I don't know whether his identification with other men is so strong that it colors the way he views you and his mother — or whether he is unable (or unwilling) to keep his deathbed promise and can't face either of you. However, the reality is that you and she will have to rely on yourselves. Love him if you wish, but don't count on him for anything.

DEAR ABBY: My mother-in-law, who lives with us, still clings to the cultural values of

the old country and expects everybody to conform to them. This sometimes results in confrontation and ill feelings among family members.

My son, who is 16, frequently brings friends home. Most of the time he remembers to introduce them to the family members, but there are times when he thinks he has already introduced them, so he doesn't.

My mother-in-law gets upset when the young people who show up at home do not acknowledge her. She comes from a culture steeped in values such as respect for elders. She feels these young guests should greet her, or smile at her, and that they have to do it first before she will return the greeting.

Although I value such traditions, in my opinion she does not have to wait. She can initiate the introduction. I told her she should just say hello to them and ask them nonchalantly to introduce themselves. She is adamant that she should be greeted first. I explained that we do not know if these young people are shy, or whether they have

not been properly taught by their own parents. None of the kids are overtly rude, either to my mother-in-law or me. Who is right in this instance?

MODERN MOTHER, CERRITOS, CALIF.

DEAR MODERN MOTHER: I don't know where your mother-in-law hails from, but in our culture it is also proper for young people to defer to older people. Make it clear to your son that when he brings friends to the house, he should make a point of greeting his grandmother and asking if she has met them. If she hasn't, he should introduce them. He should also explain to his friends what kind of behavior is expected from him — and them.
