



Americans continue to be the movingest people. Figures compiled by the U.S. Bureau of Census show that 33 million persons of all ages changed homes in the year ending March, 1956. This represented one person out of every five in the civilian population, a proportion which has shown no important change from year to year over the

The majority of these movers were young under thirty, but there were a substantial number of older persons as well, including liose to one and a half millin pedsons 65 years old and over.

Some 22 million persons who moved during the period changed homes within the same area in which they lived, but hlise to six million more went from one county to another and an additional five million crossed state lines.
