

CRA proposes \$117,612 price per credit with discounts for some projects

They would allow developers in downtown Sanford to purchase the credits instead of having to build a stormwater pond or vault for a new development.

The CRA has spent the last three months determining land values and costs of development in order to set up a fixed methodology for the credits'

At the May 25 CRA meeting, city staff presented the board with its methodology, which was approved by the CRA unanimously.


The value of the credits was set at \$117.612 per acre (credit). Three different discount factors apply based on the type of construction project up for consideration.

CRA Chairman Bob Parcell said in See Stormwater, Page SA

an interview Wednesday that the CRA has broken up the discount factors into new construction, infill construction, and undevelopable construction.

New construction is classified as empty lots with a large enough parcel of land to build a stormwater pond. Those projects would be able to purchase the stormwater credits for 25 percent off of the \$117,612. The final cost would work out to \$88,209 per credit (acre).

funeral procession to pass under a huge American flag strung between the tower trucks, of Station 27 and Longwood Station 15. lucen Kucera died following a train-

ing exercise. Seminole County Battalion 3 Chief Steve Thiebauth has known Kucera for 23 years.

"Frank was actually a fireman's fireman," Thiebauth said. "He loved to train."

Thiebauth said Kucera was considered cancer free, and he wanted to serve on a tower truck. He achieved that goal but wanted the challenge of the Special Hazards Operations Team.

Thiebauth said the SHOT team requires the most schooling and training of any in the department. Kucera made the team in 2002 and his last assignment was at Station 12 on Douglas Road in Altamonte Springs. He was promoted to lieutenant in 1990.

Kucera's death is hard to understand, Thiebauth said. He described his friend as a person in very good shape who didn't smoke and drank only occasionally.

The drill that Kucera had done was a typical one for firefighters. The air consumption drill simulates what it would be like to be running out of air while trapped in a building. Thiebauth said the person sits there and has to calm himself to see how long the air can last.

"I can tell you the training was over with,"

How high do they jump?

They don't really jump or climb much.

How old are they? They are 12.

How long do they live? Only until about 15 years old.

The young interrogators were surprised that the big cats would have only about three more years to live. The felines run around and play with toys the keepers give them and appear energetic.

The young people are also active despite naving serious heart problems. They

Family-owned style returns to Gramkow Chapel

SANFORD — Personal service at an affordable price is the goal of Collison Family Funeral Homes Gramkow Chapel in Sanford.

While many Central Florida funeral homes have gone corporate, Gregory Collison has sunk more than \$100,000 into renovating the Gramkow Chapel, hoping to reestablish a family atmosphere in the management.

"We are the largest independent funeral home in Central Florida," Collison said recently. With his wife, Dayna, and funeral director Christopher Neal and family services coordinator Mike Browning, Collison discussed the changes he is making at the funeral home on East Airport Boulevard.

The business was formerly owned by Betty and the late Bill Gramkow. The couple buried thousands of local residents over the years, Collison estimated. After Bill died, Betty sold the business to a Texas corporation, who did not put the resources into it.

The front sign was held up by a string, Collison said. His family has owned funeral homes in Central Florida for decades. Now the family owns and operates Gramkow, the

Howell Branch Chapel in Winter Park and the South Seminole Chapel in Longwood.

Collison described how they discarded most of the furniture inside the chapel. Everything but one small table went in the dumpster

The most important thing to us is we pride ourselves at giving personal service at

affordable prices," Collison said. Because of the low overhead of a family business, Gramkow can offer as nice or nicer facilities for about half the price as corporate competitors, he added.

Much of the renovation took place outside, Collison said. Curbing and landscaping were priorities. The family spent more than \$50,000 on landscaping and sod alone. A front porch was added.

The renovations are not completed, he said. New pews are among upcoming changes, for example.

A traditional funeral service costs \$1,995, not including limousines, casket, outer burial container, or memorial items. Collison provides a price guarantee.

According to price comparisons provided by the funeral home, Collison said the nearest competitor is more than \$500 higher. and some are more than double the price. The same goes for a minimum casket cost and the price of direct cremations.

There are a lot of variables in the cost of a funeral, of course, but Collison boasts a cost savings of between 40 and 50 percent as typical.

"We are family owned," he explained.



Thiebauth said. Kucera went to fill the air bottles. An autopsy is being done to determine the cause of death.

"To his parents (Mary and Frank Kucera) he was Franky Boy," Thiebauth said, describing his unique closeness to them. "He is the only person I know that was proud to be a mama's boy."

He is also survived by his wife, Tonya, who Thiebauth said was Kucera's best friend. He also had a step-daughter named Chyannie.

"He loved his step-daughter more than anything," Thiebauth said. "He loved training and he loved his job. If you had to put a picture of a fireman on a billboard, Frank would be the one to use."

Hundreds of firefighters and rescue personnel paid tribute to Kucera at his funeral June 1 at Northland Church on Dog Track Road. A large procession interrupted traffic all the way to the burial at Woodlawn Memorial Park in Winter Garden.

Kucera received a team citation award in February. A collision involving a diesel fuel truck had already killed two people, but Kucera helped keep the intense fire from engulfing a second vehicle.

He received a letter from Congress thanking him for helping Brevard County during Hurricane Erin in 1995. He was awarded a certificate of appreciation from the Missing Children Center in 1997 and numerous

Florida and Puerto Rico. About 1,800 babies are born with congenital heart defects in Florida each year. Nearly twice as many children die from congenital heart disease in the United States each year as from all forms of childhood cancers combined, according to the American Heart Association.

Sometimes the problems are known when they are born such as Casey Moore, 14, of Lake Mary. He was born without the left side of his heart.

Sometimes the problems surface later as was the case with Corbin Krupa, 11, of Deltona. During a physical to start a prescription of Ritalin, his mother Jennifer said doctor's found a congenital problem called bicuspid aortic valve.

The valve in the aorta artery normally has three parts or leaflets, but Corbin and others

like him have just two. Corbin also has an aneurysm in the aorta discovered after a checkup for the valve. An aneurysm is the ballooning of a blood vessel and the aorta is the body's main blood vessel. If the blood vessel breaks, the person could die.

"One thing led to the next," Jennifer recalled.

For Corbin that means no hard running or contact sports. He cannot play basketball or participate in Tai Kwon Do. His mother said he has to sit out during a lot of PE activities at school.

One thing Corbin can still do is be interviewed by TV reporters. He excitedly jogged over to his mom when the interview was over. They wanted to talk with her now, he said.

Before she did the interview, she told The Herald that Corbin's aneurysm has not grown in two years.

The core activity for the American Heart Heroes is summer camp and family weekends at Camp Boggy Creek. The parents praised the camp.

"If you forget something, they have it for you." Jennifer Krupa said. They have been to five such weekends.

The young people can also take part in activities like the one at the zoo on Thursday.

Member families receive a newsletter and health information.

The membership and all activities are free thanks to donors and sponsors, said Rachel Akers, a communications director for the American Heart Association.

The program is designed to give support, information and networking to families with children with heart diseases.


Casey and his 12-year-old sister, Beth, said they had a choice about which animal to meet up close and personal after touring the zoo.

They could have chosen Mary and Maude, the zoo's elephant pair, but they went with the big cats because, well, they didn't smell bad like the pachyderms.



in far-off places is always handy, rather than relying on someone else to drive you around.



When you travel, be sure to keep in contact with someone back home. Cell phones are now common, and are a good method of keeping someone informed as to where you are, where you are heading, and what other circumstances may be.



Local woman has questions for regional hospital To the Editor:

I need some answeps.

To start, I want to say I have very high respect and appreciation for the Central Florida Regional Hospital in Sanford. They helped save my husband's life two years ago, and I have been there several times in the 30 years we have been in the Sanford area. BUT the Admitting, Register and ER departments really give it a black eye.

On April 5, 2005, I received a frantic call. I could hear in the back ground, "Call your family and get to the hospital". It was my 24-year old grandson at work. I told him I would be there. As we left home I got my wits and called him on the cell phone and told him that we were on the way, but to call an ambulance. I was afraid he was having a heat stroke.

2:50 p.m. He filled out the forms. He put "badly dehydrated:. I added, "heat stroke" with a question mark. We waited and waited. Finally, I asked the Security Guard if we could get him in to lye down. They took him next and sent him back to the waiting room. We waited and waited

After an hour, he moved over to the corner so he could put his feet on the table and lean back against the wall. We waited and waited. He got so dizzy and nauseated that he said he needed to lie down. I told him to go ahead and lay down on the floor. We were clear back in the corner by the TV so I didn't think there would be any problem.

Another patient was informed that there was about a four-hour wait, so we resigned ourselves that we

gone, someone moved to our seats, so we sat back down in the center chairs. I left to go to the restroom. While I was gone, he started trembling with cold again, so a stranger sitting beside him asked a nurse for a blanket, and was informed they could not bring them out to the waiting room.

Finally, after another hour, I asked the same guard what was wrong. I didn't know if maybe they had mis-laid his papers, or if he was just a 24year old guy with no insurance, or if maybe he had had some trouble with people before and they wouldn't help him. I asked if we were just wasting our time or if we should wait. Everyone that was there when we got there and may others was already gone. Instead of answering my question, someone in a white uni-







While attending Mrs. Margaret Zachary Wright's fumeral on May 17, my mind began reflecting on my memories of her and her family and how are families intertwined. I also did some research later in early Salmagundis to connect some of the dots.

Margaret Wright was a much-loved



person as attested to by the large attendance at her service and the testimonies given by her children, grandchildren and friends. She touched many lives during her 101 years of life.

Grace Marie Stinecipher My mother, Marie Stemper Stinecipher, and Margaret Wright were about the same

age and both moved to Sanford with their families in 1913. The Stempers had come from Homeland, Georgia where they had lived only one year, long enough for my Uncle Jack to be born. Marie had been taught in the third grade by a 14year-old girl, so her parents put her back

the third grade when they came to Senford. Margaret Zachary had come here from Raleigh, North Carolina and proba-

bly entered fourth grade at Sanford Grammar School. I found a history of the SHS Class of 1923 in the 1923 Salmagundi, which stated that this class had attended Primary School in the building on Palmetto Avenue and then attended Grammar School for six years, grades three through eight. So, Margaret and Marie probably met at the grammar school, which they both entered in 1913.

Margaret graduated from Sanford High School (located on Palmetto Avenue at 9th Street) in 1922 and Marie graduated in 1923.

Under Margaret's senior picture is written: "Beware! She has a temper and how she blushes! Blushes, temper and all, we like her just fine!" Her activities included Vice President of the Literary Society, Assistant Business Manager SalhuStaft, Dramatic Club, Senior Play and several plays in which she acted. On the Who's Who page, she was named "Most Attractive."

Under Marie's senior picture we find this: "Practical, industrious, smiling, that's Marie Back of that smile is a strong, brave character that will conquer all difficulties."

Her activities included Literary Society, Glee Club, plus several plays in which she acted.

Marie went to Piedmont College in Georgia, while Margaret went to Sullins College in Virginia.

Marie began teaching at Sanford Grammar School in 1926 and was on the Seminole High School faculty 1930-1934. I found Margaret on the SHS faculty in 1928 and in the early 1930s. So they went to school together, then taught on the same faculty together.

Both Margaret and Marie had married. Joan Wright was born in 1935; Peggy Wright and I were both born in 1936. And our mothers stopped teaching for awhile.

When I entered first grade in 1942, Marie began substituting at both Sanford Junior High and Seminole High.

In the fall of 1946, a sixth grade teacher at Grammar School had to resign because of illness and Principal Ben Steele persuaded Marie to teach the class. Joan Wright was in her class while Peggy Wright and I were in Mrs. McNab's fifth grade class.

The next school year, Margaret Wright took Marie Stinecipher's place as a sixth grade teacher and continued teaching there for many years. Marie went back to substituting, though she would occasionally fill in for a teacher long term.

I was in the Wright home several times, at three of their residences: 1308 Magnolia Avenue, the Zachary home at 812 Magnolia, where the Wright's lived during the war and 443 Elliot Avenue. I also got to know Mary Ann, Jimmy and Roy, who we called "Rooster."

One vivid memory of mine is that Peggy had a "Come As You Are Party" at their nome across from Southside School and I had to go in my pajamas!

Peggy now lives in Bradenton and Highlands, North Carolina and I had last seen her at our class reunion a year ago. When I saw her at her mother's funeral, she told me that she had seen my column about the tourist homes and reminded me that the Zachary home was the Carolina Guest Home for many years. When the Wright clan moved in, though, all the bedrooms were filled so the tourist home business had to be interrupted for a few years.

The Wright family was very fortunate to have had their mother with them for so many years; my mother, Marie Stemper Stinecipher, died in 1965 at age 60.

While looking through the SHS Salmagundis from the early 1920s, I have



with an existing building on it that would need to be torn down. So, any redevelopable land would be able to purchase stormwater credits for 50 percent off, or \$58,806 per credit (acre).

Undevelopable lots are classified as too small to be able to build a stormwater pond and not cost efficient to build a stormwater vault. This land is usually only 1/4 acre or a little larger. These projects would be eligible to purchase the stormwater credits for 75 percent off, or \$29,403 per credit (acre).

"There's only eight or nine of those vacant parcels," Parcell said of the undevelopable land.

Parcell said this plan will go to the City Commission in June for its approval. A joint CRA and City Commission meeting may be scheduled

In other CRA news, the board:

 Approved up to \$5,000 for two stop signs and three directional signs for the First Street Streetscape Project. The money allotted will provide the CRA with the posts for directional signs and downtown businesses will have the opportunity to purchase a sign with their company name on it pointing to the direction of their location.

There was some discussion from District 1 Commissioner Art Woodruff regarding public directional signs for places like City Hall, the library, the museum and other downtown locations.

Parcell said that first they needed the directional signs for the downtown businesses because the merchants were the first to bring the idea to the CRA.

"It's the merchants who've been beating on us for years," Parcell told Woodruff.

Woodruff told the CRA members that they needed a design that would allow

"We don't answer to stock holders and we can keep the overhead low."

He said the business takes a fair profit. People expect that, he added, but they don't want to be gouged.

Neal has experienced both sides. He has served at Gramkow for 20 years, starting with the Gramkow family and then with the Texas corporation.

He recalled getting a phone call from Texas in the middle of the week telling them to raise the prices. No reason was given. Prices were much higher, and in one two week period, the corporation raised prices more than 5 percent.

He said the traditional funeral service that now custs \$1,995 was priced at \$4,695 before the Collisons bought the business.

None of this is new, Collison said. The media is filled with negative stories about the industry, many justifiable.

"People are shocked that they can pay that much less and get a great funeral," Collison said. "Unfortunately, there is a lot of

double talk in the funeral industry. Much of the problem is the industry's own fault."

He invites people to make comparisons. He said many do and often they come from out of town because of the cost savings. People have inquired from as far away as Ocala and Volusia County cities.

"Most families are looking for a hometown funeral home convenient to their home, but not at all costs," he said. "That's why people travel."

Even with the corporate chapter in Gramkow's history, the chapel is still a landmark in Sanford, Collison said.

"Most of our business comes from repeat business," he said.

One of the trends in the funeral business is advance planning and paying, but Collison has mixed feelings.

"I tell people to do it only if they're comfortable," Collison said. Prearranged funerals are good, but they aren't for everyone, he added. Some people will prearrange the services and it is a burden lifted from their shoul-

ders. Others worry constantly whether the plans will be followed and with some funeral homes, whether they will go out of business, which has happened.

Prearranged funerals are regulated by the state. The funeral home cannot touch the money until a death certificate is presented, Dayna Collison said. She said strict reporting and random audits serve as a check on the

industry. The consumer is well protected in Florida," Browning said.

Another thing that sets Collison apart is the availability of the staff, the owner said.

"We're available 24 hours a day," he said. "Our goal is to have someone call back within five minutes. People call us because they already tried someone else who hadn't responded after an hour and a half."

Another goal is to have someone visit the family within one hour of the call. That time depends on where the family is, but often they have someone to the location within 10 minutes. Another important aspect of

the Gramkow Chapel, Collison said, is that all of the embalming is done right on the premises. When someone dies emotions can run high, he said, and people don't want their mother transported all over place.

"We try to run our funeral homes the old-fashioned way," Collison said.

They also own their own crematory, and wanted to build one at the Gramkow location, but the city wouldn't allow it, he said.

Collison has another connection with Sanford. His brother Chris is a lieutenant with the Sanford Police Department.

Collison invites anyone with questions about funerals or the industry to pick up a price list or even stop by.

"Quite frankly, we're pretty proud of the fact that we're the largest, independent familyowned funeral home in the area," he said.





OFFICERS ERADICATE MARIJUANA PLANTS **FROM WMA**

Spring is the growing season, but unfortunately all that grows is not legal. However that doesn't stop some from doing it anyway, and public wildlife management areas (WMAs) seem to be favorite places for marijuana dealers to grow their illegal crop.

A WMA may seem like a per-fect spot for this high dollar business since many are remote, isolated areas that are not easily accessible except by foot. Growers can cultivate their crops in pots hidden among the dense vegetation, protected from detection by the sheer inaccessibility.

But three Sumter County men found out recently that Florida Fish and Wildlife **Conservation Commission** (FWC) officers don't tolerate this illegal activity on the public lands they patrol. FWC officers spend much of their lives studying the woods and are used to slogging around in swampy, mosquito infested terrain, cutting their way through with machetes while keeping a watchful eye for alligators and venomous snakes. They do it to find poachers and they do it to find marijuana growers too.

Blake Lynn Williamson, 18, (1/22/87), his twin brother Derek Lee Williamson, 18, (1/22/87), both of 3286 Burwell Road, Webster, and Joshua A. Chase, 17, (10/3/87), of 3421 Burwell Road, were each charged with the felony cultivation of marijuana - a 3rd degree felony that carries a maximum penalty of 5 years in prison and a \$5,000 fine.

An anonymous caller to the FWC led officers into Richloam WMA where they spent the better part of a day walking

was the ever present danger of stepping on an alligator or water moccasin.

By late afternoon the two ufficers had located a patch of 31 marijuana plants with an estimated street value of \$31,000. They hid amongst the heavy vegetation and waited for the illegal farmers to arrive to tend their crops. They didn't have to wait long. After only about 45 minutes the three defendants arrived and were surprised to see they had visitors waiting for them.

The three were arrested and booked into the Hernando County Jail on May 13 for cultivating marijuana in a portion of the Richloam WMA located in Hernando County.

A couple of days later, FWC officers from both Sumter and Hernando counties, acting on another tip, tromped around a different section of Richloam WMA looking for more marijuana. After several hours without luck, they called for assistance from an FWC pilot and his helicopter. With the overhead advantage, it didn't take long for the spotter to pick out the unique green color of pot plants from the cockpit of the helicopter.

Several hours later, the officers hauled 100 marijuana plants with a street value of \$100,000 out of the woods and into the back of an FWC truck bound for safekeeping at the Hernando County Sheriff's Office. In this case, there were no arrests were made.

"We have zero tolerance for dope operations on wildlife management areas and will do what it takes to destroy them. This recent haul certainly hit the growers where it hurt - in their wallets, and it prevented more than \$131,000 worth of marijuana from reaching the streets," said Lt. David Straub, whose team participated in the roundup.

The FWC officers will continue the marijuana eradication detail on Richloam WMA until the growing season is over.

The Astro- finally caught up to reliever Garret Braden in the top of the eighth using a pair of walks and a Darquise Toliver triple to score three runs






