

When a consumer protection measure becomes law, the headlines that ushered in its passage become history, and the public goes on about its business in the belief that the governmental process has passed another milestone in the long struggle to attain more perfect regulation of the marketplace. In reality, the passage of a law is one thing, administering and making it work is quite another and often involves nearly insoluble problems. An excellent illustration of the complicated

administrative and interpretive decisions that follow in the wake of a new consumer law may be seen in the case of the Fair Packaging and Labeling Act "truth-in-packaging" that was passed by Congress more than 2 years ago. Mr. John D. Morris, writing in The York Times, reveals a number of the difficulties that truthin-packaging has run into - difficulties that are now making the act ". . . a major target of a critical review of consumer protection laws." Among the difficulties is the fact that truth-

in-packaging falls within the jurisdiction of at least 3 government agencies. The Food and Drug Administration has the responsibility of requiring that contents of bottles, jars and many containers be shown in both ounces and pounds, pints or quarts. It is said these regulations are limited to food products. The FDA also is charged with regulating "drugs, devices and cosmetics," which include such things as over-thecounter medicines, toilet articles and medical de-vices such as packaged bandages. The labeling of other consumer products comes under the jurisdiction of the Federal Trade Commission. And still another agency, the Commerce Department, is responsible for promoting voluntary industry action to stop any "undue proliferation" of packages containing different quantities of

In complying with some features of th truth-in-packaging act, industry may be exposing itself to antitrust action, particularly in the area of compliance with the Commerce Department's voluntary program for reduction of pack-
