

Officials Must 'Tell All'

State Printing Costs To Be Bared

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP)—State officials who like to adorn their publications with self-portraits and continual mention of their names now must tell everyone how much it costs. Starting last Saturday, a law went into effect that requires all officials to put the annual and per copy cost of each publication they produce in a prominently displayed box on the front page.



Apparently the edict about no photographs only applied to the publications themselves, not the press releases saying how much money state officials...

Also in the box must be an explanation of what purpose the publication serves. The law lowered the disclosure that more than \$2.3 million in tax dollars is spent each year for "official" publications.

The first indication that the law was being observed came Monday morning, with the arrival of Education Commissioner Floyd Christian's "Monday Report."

Crisis Center Comforts Rape Victims

By ANN BLACKMAN Associated Press Writer WASHINGTON (AP) — For local women who suffer the brutal experience of being raped, advice and comfort, often from other rape victims, now is just a telephone call away. Staffers say the month-old Rape Crisis Center is receiving about 20 calls daily from current and past rape victims and their families who seek medical and legal advice and, sometimes, just sympathy. The center offers the first such private service in the nation. An example of the center's operation: A woman who has been raped may be too embarrassed to notify police or may not want to go through a long court procedure. With a phone call, she'll be given the name of a medical center in her area and information on venereal disease. But the staffers provide a list of lawyers and psychologists for victims who need them. "We have staffers who will accompany a woman to the hospital," said one staffer. "The staffer will explain hospital procedures to the woman so she isn't shocked or upset by them." One piece of advice from Liz, who, like the other center staff, is a former victim, is to remain calm and controlled when she enters a hospital because "if you go in hysterical, people in the emergency room will pay more attention to you." One staffer estimated that more than 50 per cent of the women who call the center do not report to police that they were raped. Most are looking for someone to talk with about their attack, she said. "We hope that by having another woman present that we can discourage the 'dressed like that - what did you - expect attitude,'" Liz said, claiming that such an attitude was sometimes apparent among police. Washington had 613 forcible rapes in 1971, an increase of more than 50 per cent over 1970. He added there is no way to tell how many more go unreported. In a recent session at the center, the question of self-defense was discussed. "We try to encourage women to learn self-defense, to be aware of their surroundings and know how to get out of tight situations," said Karen, a fresh-faced 28-year-old from Chicago. "If a woman is trained in self-defense, she won't be afraid to walk the streets alone. Hopefully, it will give her more self-confidence and control of her body." Across the street from the center, out of sight of passer-by, the women are fixing up an area whereby say a belted karate expert will give lessons in self-defense.

Bram Auto Parking Arrangement Told

By BILL SCOTT Replying to questions concerning the minimum 90 spaces of off-street parking reserved for the 165 unit Bram Towers, senior citizens high rise apartments, expected to open this summer, the City of Sanford Zoning official Laneel Risner stated today a variance was granted by the Board of Adjustment on January 28, 1971, to the housing project. Under the present city ordinance, a minimum 113 parking spaces must be provided for each apartment unit. This would have meant a total 247 spaces required had not the variance been granted, Risner explained. The zoning official further advised that U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) had indicated that since the apartments would be leased to senior citizens, most of whom have no cars, the city zoning requirement was not needed. HUD, who provided the funding, maintained such elderly projects must be located near stores, libraries, doctors offices and other downtown areas since access must be provided to those persons who are unable to drive a car. However, there has been some concern over possible traffic congestion that could result whenever relatives visit Bram Towers and must park their vehicles on the road due to the lack of sufficient off-street parking.

Judge Dykes advised the commission of the inadequacy of the jail conditions present in emergency situation and continued that expansion of the facilities must receive the priority attention of the commission. According to Judge Dykes, the courts "cannot sentence human beings to confinement in a facility which is unable to house them." He stressed the jail conditions are becoming more critical each day with no plans underway by the county for relief.

Wallace flashed a victory sign when he returned Monday from a four-hour outing that included an early dinner at the nearby home of a physician, Dr. Joseph Schanno, at Bethesda, Md. The governor traveled on Sunday night to his wife's hotel room, also nearby, where the couple had dinner. The governor is scheduled to leave the hospital Friday morning for the Democratic National Convention at Miami Beach. He will stop over in Alabama on the way.

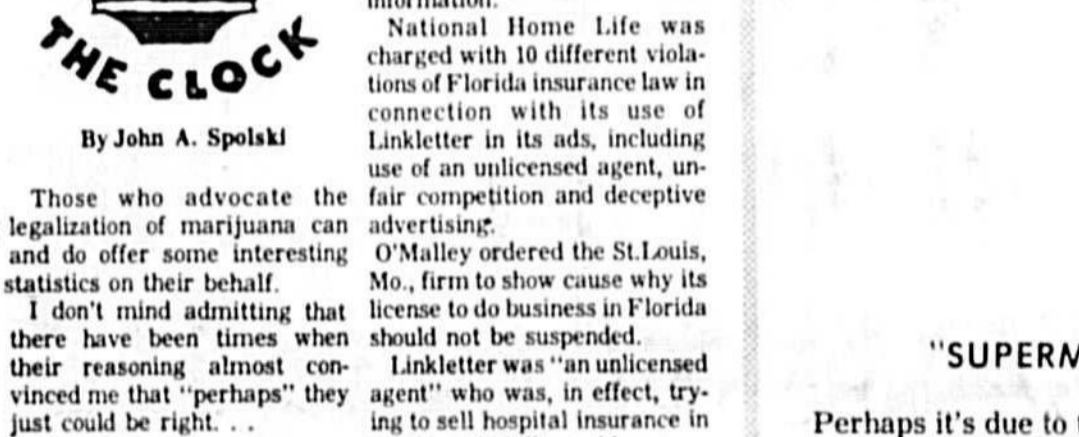
