### **Editorial Comment**

### Will We Be Ready For July 4, 1976?

Today we observe the 194th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence by members of the Continental Congress who had been meeting, debating, arguing and giving the world that demonstration of the right and necessity of dissent which has made the American Revolution much more than a successful trial by arms.

It is regrettable that the circumstances which surrounded that great event have been lost in the unhappy disregard of history which seems to be one of the prevalent theories of the

new inteneccomism with its accent on change. Even a cursory reading of the very well kept records of those days reveals the yeast which was leavening the entire loaf of government for the world to taste and savor was the bold, principled and tested truths which inspired the committee which drew up the "declaration."

The hand that did the writing belonged to Thomas Jefferson. While the words and phrasing may have been that which still bears the Jefforsonian stamp, yet the others on the committee - John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Roger Sherman and Robert R. Livingston - surely lent

their own convictions into the document. The colonists who had made the earlier meetings of the Constitutional Congress in Philadelphia were those who had primarily wanted only that their rights be observed by the British rulers. But in the intervening three years, events had persuaded these dissenters that a new doctrine of the rights of the governed and the responsibilities of the governing must be defined and supported with their "lives, fortunes and sacred honor.

The deliberations were not the formalized and solemn affairs which too many now rate them. Far from it. They were tempetuous and spirited. Dissolution and failure often stared them in the face.

But these were essentially rugged individualists, who knew the risks, had weighed them and decided that dissent was the only way to cure the basic evils of British rule

Since those days the machinery of government within these United States has been put under the greatest of strains. Domestic troubles, as tragic as the Civil War, and as immediate as the profound challenge to make our government responsive and believable have sprung up.

Decades of continued growth, even when westward expansion came to an end on Pacific shores, have created a great nation with great power and great resources which would have staggered the imagination of the Founding Fathers as they sweated out those days in hot

Political Notebook Democrats Erase Law, Voter Choice

The national Democratic party, in its 1972 drive for reforms to open up its processes, has been operating as a dominant agency "sending a message" to the 50 state party organizations. At times it seems only dimly aware that the states have been sending messages right back. We must presume that Democratic leaders in the states understood that the hectic 1968 national convention at Chicago decreed that nothing at all-not law or moral or ethical obligation-should take supremacy over a convention delegate's individual conscience.

Notwithstanding that rather startling message, a good many states in the intervening years proceeded to take action in exactly the opposite direction. Much of this religious is now embedded in new state law, though some

To be specific, seven states which previously either had no presidential primary at all or had a nonbinding contest, adopted changes which made the results of their primaries binding-in the convention-on all chosen delegates. The District of Columbia followed suit, emulating Florida, Tennessee, North Carolina, Michigan, Maryland, Rhode Island and New Mexico.

In addition, Pennsylvania enacted a law authorizing state parties to establish rules which would permit delegate candidates to bind themselves to particular presidential choices if they wished. If delegate candidates did so, they were to be legally bound. The Pennsylvania Democrats adopted such binding rules. Furthermore, five states - Wisconsin, Massachusetts.

Indiana, Oregon and California - retained the totally binding feature of their established primary laws. What does all this come to? It means that in 1972 some 12 states and the District of Columbia have laws binding all their chosen delegates to follow the results of their primaries. That means vating in the national convention according to preferences expressed for presidential nominees in balloting at the polls.

The number of delegates thus bound is a record high -984 of the total of 3.016 to be named to the July 10 Miami Beach convention.

This is not the end of it. Counting in the altered Pennsylvania law and party rule, four states-including also Nebraska, New Hampshire and South Dakota-now allow delegate candidates to bind themselves to a presidential choice and make the binding legal if they choose that course. They represent 241 delegate votes.

Altogether, then, 984 delegates must be legally bound and another 241 can be if they choose, for a grand total of 1,225, well over a third of all convention delegates in Still more. In three states, Illinois, New Jersey and

Ohio, delegate candidates can indicate a presidential preference but are only "morally bound" if they do and they win as delegates. These three represent another 432 delegates this year. So, with primaries held in 22 states and D.C., the legal binding effect embraces all delegates in 13, can embrace those in four more. Add those with moral commitment

Sounds like something of a trend-toward making actual voters' wishes on presidential choices effective and binding. And it seems like nothing but arrogance and effrontery for chosen delegates, participating in full awareness of these laws, to tell voters that their votes may go for naught and to tell presidential bidders their costly campaigns for "committed" delegates may lose

Salt Water Fishing

Every year big kingfish move in close to shore around the mouth of Ponce de Leon Inlet to feed on menhaden minnows; this year they have come in and stayed. David Leete and son Bobby located four of them Tuesday using the menhaden for balt. The scene of action was near the sea buoy just outside the inlet. They fished from a 16-foot private boat, and the catches ran from 22 to 31 pounds each.

Steve Kenzie, fishing the same area, brought in eight of the big ones up to 30 pounds each. A charter party aboard the "M iss Behaving" in a 2 hour span Tuesday afternoon landed 3 kings (18-22 pounds) and a jack crevalle of 22 pounds. Another party on the same boat Wednesday took eight amberjacks up to 54 pounds, two kings 12 bonita, two barracuda,

Thursday's fishing around the 12 mile wreck produced seven abberiack, a cobia, four kings, nine bonita and a Steve Kenzie tried the sea buoy again Friday, finding the


The "Star," Captain George Raven, brought in a leopard shark along with several bonita and kings. Leopard sharks are rather rare in this area.






