

Reached By Rescuers Yesterday; Were Brought Out Shortly After Midnight

#### Hymn Of Praise Sung By Crowd

Were Imprisoned In Mine Since Cavein On Easter Sunday

MOOSE RIVER, N. S. (Copyright by Associated Press) -- Mocking death that threatened them for tendays, Dr. D. E. Robertson and Charles Alfred Scadding were rescued today from their living tomb within an abandoned gold mine.
