Sanford Residents Report Spout Of Water On St. Johns

A water spout that form the St. Johns River near Mullet Lake P.rk at about 6:00 o'clock Wednesday evening and then dis appeared when rain began to fall was seen by several persons fish-ing in the vicinity, including Dr. W. D. Gardiner, Sanford esteepath.

The white column of the water epout whirl twisted and nov-ed about, approaching to within about 76 yards of where Dr. Gardiner and A. W. Wise were fishing from a small boat, and then receding into the river. The column, reaching up to the clouds, varied from about four feet in diameter to a few inches, said Dr. Gardiner.

Near Lake Harney, A. M. Phillips reported that he saw the waterapout reaching up into the clouds and supposed that the bot-tom of it was in Lake Monroe. It moved about at a rate of about 10 to 12 miles an hour, but caused no apparent damage. Henry Williams, colored employee of the Davin Furniture Co. was said to have seen the water spout.

A waterspout is a whirling, funnel-shaped column of water and water vapor, extending from the auriace of a sea or lake into heavy clouds. It is a meteorological phenomenon and is caused by op-posite winds of different tempera-tures meeting in the upper atmosphere, thereby condensing a vast amount of vapor into a heavy cloud to which a vortical motion is given.

This vortical motion causes th cloud to take the form of a vant funnel, and creates a partial vacuum at the center into the vortex of which water is drawn. thereafter joining in the whirling motion. Waterspouts are frequently 20 to 30 feet in diameter but according to reientlats, the common opinion that they are liquid water for their entire height is an arror; the water drawn upward does not rise above 32 feet.



One of the charges in the indictment is that the accused men hold membership in the Communist party, "knowing well that said Communist party was and is a society or assembly of persons teaching the overthrow of the United States by force and violence." If conviction on this charge is tors. obtained and upheld then the Communist party is already effectively outlawed under laws long on the federal books. With this case as precedent, any person could be arrested simply on evidence of membership in the party.

Acquittal of the accused leaders, either on the membership charge or on the basic charge of advocating the overthrow of the government, would definitely indicate that the question of the legality of the Communist party needs additional searching study. 




