Why Kipling Left America

Every community has its neighborhood feuds, grudge fights and its spite fences, but there would mighty few of them, writes Homer Croy in Your' Life Magazine, if "everyone would smile and give in-just a little." Proving his statement, he relates the story of Rudyard Kipling's residence in America, which ended as the result of a private fued.

Kipling, Mr. Croy relates, fell in love with a Vermont girl and, when he went to Vermont, fell in love with the state, too. He built a mansion that was to be the home of all future Kiplings.

"And then a load of hay upset the house and history. He hought some pasture land from his brother-in-law with an obtunry notice cards of the understanding that he was to be allowed to cut the thanks, recointions and notices of hay. But the brother-in-law said that no hay was to be cut from the land. From this simple matter, trouble started. The two had trained and snow-shoot and Cheleston dis The two had tramped and snow-shoed and Christmas dinner'd together, but no more. The quarrel grew sharp and personal and foolish.

"One day the brother-in-law was driving a load of hay down the road when he saw Kipling trundling along on his bicycle. He swung the team sharply across the road, and Kipling fell off and threw both of them into a terrific argument. The argument grew so hot and personal that the brother-in-law threatened to blow Kipling's brains out, if he had any. Within a week the brother-in-law was arrested for, as the warrant put it, 'assault with indecent and opprobrious names and epithets and threatening to kill."

"It all ended with Kipling leaving America. The brother-in-law made the announcement that if Kipling ever set foot in America again he'd sue him for \$50,000 for 'malicious prosecution, false arrest and defamation






