

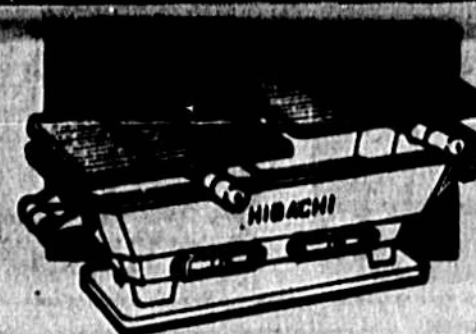

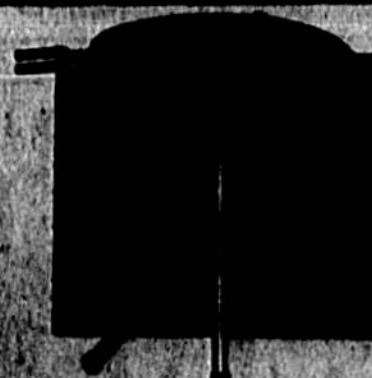

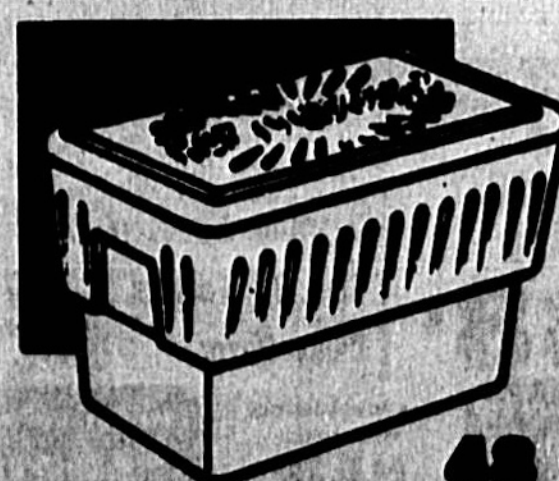

## Drug Dog (Visits): 1 Lake Brantley Drugs: 0

Dennis had a search of the campus at Lake Brantley High School in Forest City, Fla., for drugs.

Last week the Seminole County School Board authorized using Dennis on campus at high schools and middle schools in an effort to curb what some school board members said is a major drug problem at Seminole schools.

Tuesday, Dennis, accompanied by Seminole Sheriff's Deputy John Hawkins and Lake Mary Police Sergeant Dale Pico, searched the campus.

"I guess the dog spent about four hours searching around"

Pico, the dog's handler, made his first unannounced campus search at Lake Brantley High School in Forest City.

The only thing the dog found was a pack of rolling papers used to roll tobacco for cigarettes or marijuana joints, according to sheriff's department spokesman John Spaul.

But that wasn't the extent of Dennis' activity on his first visit to Lake Brantley, according to those involved in the drug hunt. Soon after Dennis arrived on campus, about 8:30 a.m., students who spotted the canine spread the word like wildfire.

Dennis had his picture taken by students, had to endure hounding and jeering from some, and was driven to a semi-drowsy state sitting at some lockers he tried desperately to get into.

"I guess the dog spent about four hours searching around," said Lake Brantley principal Darvin Booth, who himself had been told about the search plan only about 20 minutes before the dog arrived that day.

Booth said the dog and the two law enforcement officers were joined in the search by at least two school personnel, the dean of students and the assistant principal.

The dog, according to Booth, sniffed long at 10 to 15 student lockers. And "nearly tried to tear off the handles on two or three of them," according to Lake Mary Police Chief Harry Boman.

But no drugs were found, authorities said.

"We feel that the lockers where the dog went crazy trying to get into are those lockers drugs might have been kept in."

"We nearly tried to tear off the handles on two or three of them (lockers) recently," speculated a sheriff's department investigator.

One other sheriff's department detective

sergent said he felt all the publicity that followed the school board action falling about the intended use for the dog put the students on alert.

"They know the best's on," said the detective sergent.

"Ever since that publicity, every student in every school in the county knows they might be hit any day. And they know we'll bring that dog at erratic times,

so they might keep drugs off the campus."

So effective is the student awareness about Dennis, in fact, that the sergent related a story about another dog, not Dennis, not a drug sniffing dog, just an everyday German shepherd, who visited a school after the publicity and "the students were that was our dog. If any of them had drugs, I'm sure they got rid of them long ago."

## Italy Rebel Photo Has Moro Alive

ROME (UPI) — Red Brigade terrorists today produced a photograph they said proved that kidnaped ex-Premier Aldo Moro was still alive.

But they said he would be "executed" within 48 hours if the government refused to release their jailed comrades.

The photograph, said to be the same as one in the hands of the Italian newspaper *L'Espresso*, which had a copy of the photograph, was taken on Monday after a communique, which they denounced as false, said he had already been executed.

In a long communique released simultaneously in Milan, Turin and Genoa, the group said its intention would run out at 2 p.m. (7 a.m. EDT Saturday).

Anti-terrorist special investigators said they considered the new communique authentic.

The communique came on a day of new violence, in which Red Brigades terrorists attacked a police barracks in northern Rome with hand grenades and machine guns five today and shot and killed a prison guard in Milan as his wife looked out the window of her apartment screaming "No! No!"

The communique, which said Moro is in a dark tunnel and clean shaven. The trait politician appeared to shift better health than he did in a photograph released immediately after his last kidnapping.

"The communique distributed April 18 and attributed to our organization is false."

Reporting March 14, *L'Espresso* said a copy of the new communique was attached to the magazine.

Police have been searching for two Red Brigades members of Rome for Moro's body after receiving a purported Red Brigades message that he had been killed and his body dumped there. The Red Brigades issued another "communique" today calling that report false and containing the new information.

"How many great (financial) centers or how many big businesses do you see coming into Las Vegas?" he asked.

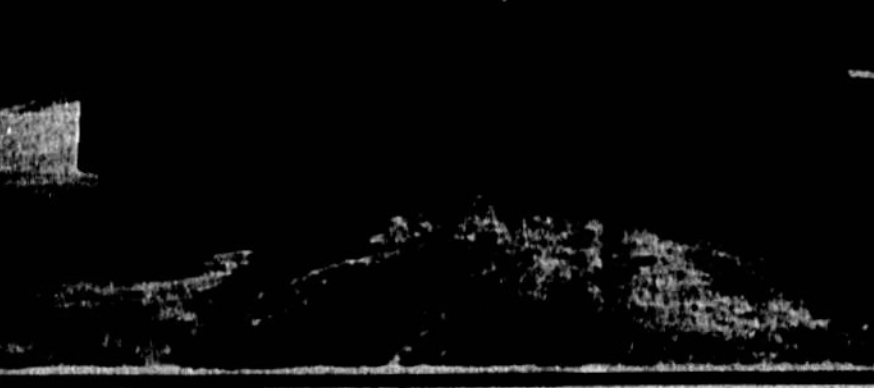
Askew said he intends to speak out against the drive wherever and whenever possible.

# Man's Wife Sought In Murder

Police have issued a nationwide alert for the "harem suspect" wife of a murdered Coast Guardman. She is sought in connection with his murder, according to police, who said she may have plotted with her lover to murder her husband for \$5,000 in insurance money. Charles Ira Hackett, 36, of Fern Park and Langwood, is in Duval County jail charged with first degree murder following a grand jury indictment on the charge Thursday. Hackett was being held in the jail for a variety of crimes

including failure to appear, burglary and grand larceny. On Monday Hackett pleaded guilty to the burglary charge and in return the remaining charges were dropped by the state attorney's office, according to records. Hackett is the alleged lover of Jacqueline McCann Dancy, 26, of 823 Prairie Lake Drive, Fern Park. Her husband, Edward Dancy, 35, was found murdered in a ditch on South Sanford Avenue, half mile south of Sanford. He had been shot in the throat with a shotgun and his hands and feet were bound and his body wrapped in a blanket. Police investigators said he was on leave from Governor Island, N.Y., to attend a birthday party for his

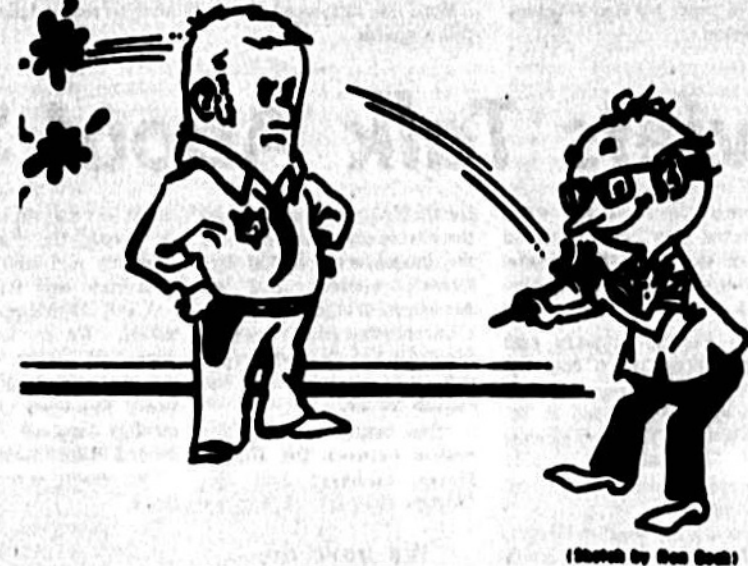
wife and was murdered shortly after the party on Dec. 28, 1977. The body was found Jan. 1 by two Sanford men walking in the area. A national indictment in the murder remains pending on arrest. The nationwide alert indicates Mrs. Dancy may be riding a motorcycle. She is said to possibly be carrying a gun or knife and has "knowledge of heroin," the report indicates. In addition to the \$5,000 insurance money which police believe may have been a motive, the state man had been subpoenaed to testify against Hackett in a burglary trial, according to police records.

# \$6.07 Billion Budget - Biggest Ever - Wins Nod Of Senate Panel

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) — The Senate Appropriations Committee approved a \$6.07 billion budget Thursday night, the biggest ever, and will send \$20 million for emergency — a sign the Florida economy is healthy again. The massive spending plan, voted out by Sen. Phil Lewis' committee, goes before the full Senate next Thursday. The House is about a week behind in its budget work. Lewis, D-West Palm Beach, says he will be satisfied if he can keep legislators from dipping any

million more for schools than the Senate proposed. The two houses have about the same amount for universities and the Senate has \$2.5 million more for community colleges than the House. Senators, in effect, are saving the \$80 million picked up when state and legislative reports earlier this week revised their estimate of money to be available during the 1970-71 fiscal year. House members are choosing to spend most of the windfall on schools. The money wasn't available when Asher wrote his \$5.98 billion budget. The split over the reserve fund and the increase in the required local effort is still in the air. The Senate floor probably will be the first big trouble spot when House and Senate conferees begin final work on the spending plan in early May. Big city senators on the Appropriations Committee last 5-7 Thursday night in a bid to leave the required local effort at 4.4 mills. The increase to 6.5 mills in the budget now means that \$11 million available only to the property-rich, big counties this year, will be distributed among all 97 counties. Miami Sen. Kenneth Myers is leading a coalition of senators from Duval, Brevard, Duval, Hillsborough and Pinellas counties who will make another run on the floor. He predicts it will be successful. The House and Senate have their differences on educational funding, Myers said, but it's not as bad as last year when a deadlock on the budget and taxes forced 18 days of special sessions. The tentative House budget has only about \$7

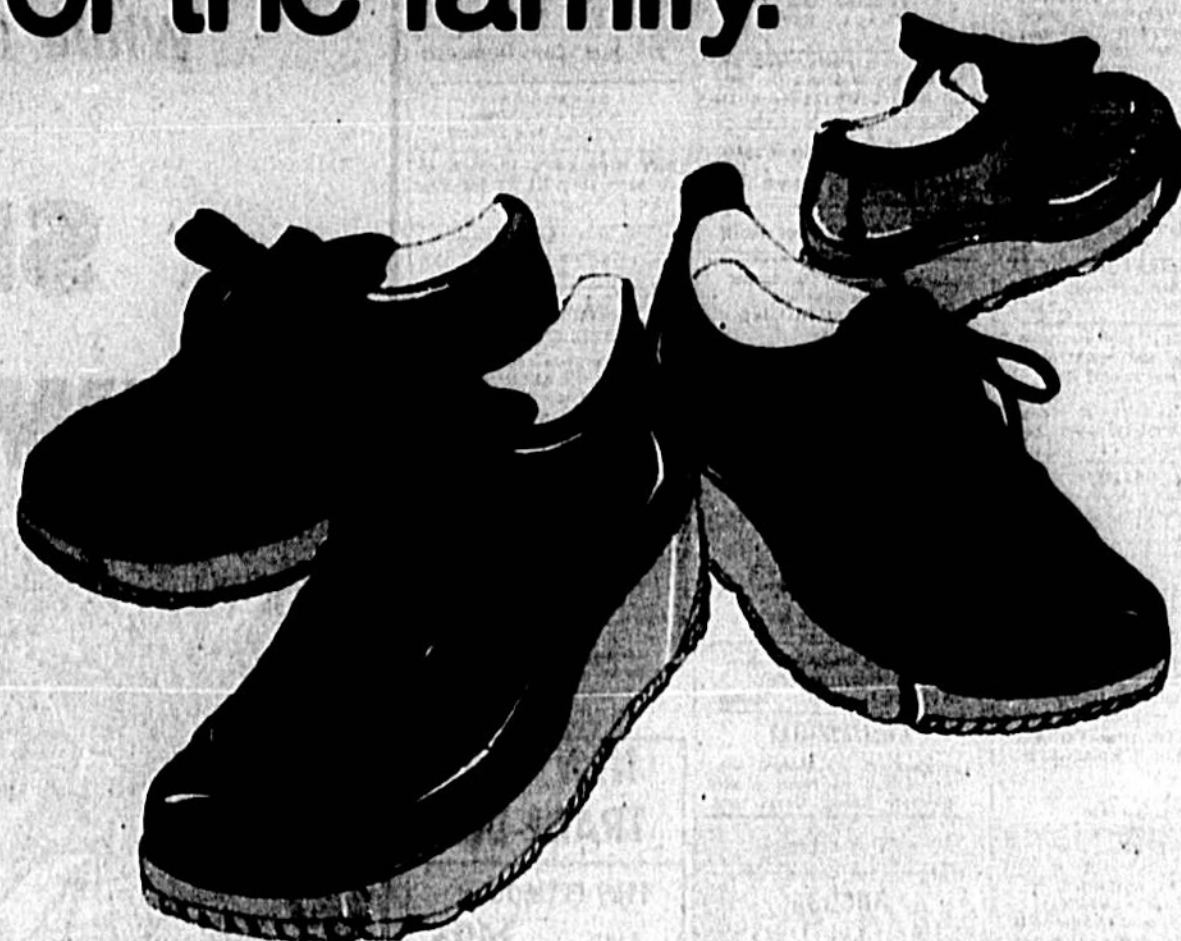
