Recently a neighbor had the same type of stone removed. His doctor told him to avoid all dairy products,

Federal Aid For New York

WASHINGTON (AP) - As President Ford prepares a new statement of his adminstration's view of New York City's financial crisis, there were more reports that Ford will support federal aid to the city.

White House Press Secretary Ron Nessen declined to rule out a new administration position in today's statement, telling newsmen they would have to wait for

Ford in the past has insisted he will oppose any federal "bailout" of New York City and that the city and state should take tough steps to solve their local problem.

Cleaver Taken To California

NEW YORK (AP) - Resigned to the possible imprisonment that he eluded for seven years as a fugitive abroad, Eldridge Cleaver, the once strident Black Panther information director, was to be taken to California today to faces charges of parole violation and assault.

Cleaver was immediately arrested by FBI agents during a prearranged surrender Tuesday evening when he arrived from Paris aboard a Trans World Airlines jet. On his transatlantic flight, Cleaver was "unofficially"

accompanied by three FBI agents, and at Kennedy Airport he was met by three more. As the one-time revolutionary sped through customs, agents formed a human barrier against some 75 shoving and shouting reporters who mobbed the area, trying to interview him.

FBI King Campaign Revealed

WASHINGTON (AP) - The FBI conducted a six-year campaign to destroy Martin Luther King Jr. as a leader of the civil rights movement, according to evidence made public by the Senate intelligence committee.

Evidence released Tuesday showed FBI bugging of King's hotel room, a blackmail attempt which King interpreted as a suggestion that he kill himself shortly before he was to receive the Nobel Peace Prize, and an effort to find and promote a replacement for King as a



Competition Needed Among The Airlines

When the President announces a plan to reduce the burden of government regulation on a major industry, we would expect to hear the loudest cheers from the industry affected. Just the opposite has happened since Mr. Ford asked Congress to begin dismantling the regulatory structure which keeps the nation's airlines under the thumb of the Civil Aeronautics Board.

It is the airlines that are complaining. This emphasizes the point Mr. Ford has been making as he unveils his policy for deregulation of our transportation industries. Regulatory agencies which are supposed to be serving the public interest are too often only serving the interests of companies within an industry, protecting them from competition at the public's expense

The CAB powers over the airline industry date back to 1938 when airlines were struggling to get established in burgeoning new markets for passenger and freight service. The airline business has since grown up. There is no longer a justification for a regulatory system which Mr. Ford aptly describes as "promotional and

The President is proposing that airlines be free to raise and lower fares on a competitive basis and to fly competitive routes without the protection of CAB route assignments. Unprofitable routes could eventually be abandoned and service provided on new routes with much less government red tape. The Department of Transportation estimates that fares could be reduced by 15 to 20 per cent if the Ford plan goes through.

Historically, intrastate airlines which are not subject to CAB regulation have charged lower fares than those charged for comparable service by the interstate carriers. Some economists have estimated that the interstate airlines incur \$500 million a year in unnecessary costs because of CAB regulation — costs reflected in their fares.

CAB regulation has become a way of life for the major airlines and it is not surprising that they want to defend it. It has insulated them against the pressures of rate competition, and has allowed them to stake out a claim to many routes on an exclusive basis. For many businesses this kind of regulation can be more of a comfort than a burden.

The real burden is being borne by the public. and the administration is determined to begin phasing out the regulatory structure that covers the railroad and trucking industries as well. The time is past when industries which have their developmental years behind them can claim protection from the competitive forces of the marketplace, which are the source of economies and efficiencies that make the public the beneficiary of our private enterprise system.



Franco Clings To Life; **Condition Still Critical**

MADRID, Spain (AP) - Generalissimo Francisco Franco survived another night, and his doctors reported this morning that his condition was unchanged. A brief announcement on the 34th day of the 82-year-old dictator's illness said he had a quiet night. Apparently there was no recurrence of the massive abdomina hemmorhaging which he suffered early Tuesday.

The doctors late Tuesday afternoon reported there had been no evidence of additional bleeding for some hours. But they said the old man was still in "critical" condition a term the newspaper ABC interpreted as "the last rung of his illness. It cannot change, and it cannot get worse without death.

Thai Planes Strafe Laotians

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) — Two Thai planes strafed Laotian positions, and Thai and Laotian guns dueled across the Mekong river border between the two nations as Thai forces tried to recover a grounded patrol boat, reliable reports from the northeast frontier said today. Thai marines and frogmen, working under cover of darkness Tuesday night, recovered the body of a navy man killed aboard the grounded boat by Laotian gunfire, the Thai military command reported. While the Bangkok government tried to play down the crisis with its northern neighbor, the Laotian Communist government in a broadcast accused Thailand of "brazen and open violation of Lao sovereignty" intended to "create tension along the Lao-Thai border."





The petition, which arrived in the Capitol Tuesday, called on officials to make sure that Florida schoolchildren are "inculcated with the principles of truth, honesty and patriotism and the practice of every Christian virtue."

Askew "has seen nothing offensive in his own children's textbooks," Press Secretary Paul Schnitt said. Askew's daughter, Angela, is a high school freshman and his son, Kevin, is a seventh grader.

Radiation Threat Discounted TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Two phosphate mining firms can be paid \$1.5 million for reclamation despite the fact that radiation remains on the land, a state official

The payments are being processed following a decision that "the radiation problem is not a real danger," Randy Miller, Auditing Bureau chief in the comptroller's department, said Tuesday.

·They had been held up following a report in September by the federal Environmental Protection Agency that it found radiation dangers in houses built on reclaimed phosphate mines.

Gurney Trial Date Set

ORLANDO (AP) - A tentative trial date of Jan. 5 has been set if the government decides to prosecute former Sen. Edward J. Gurney, R-Fla., on two unresolved charges in an alleged \$233,000 slush-fund scandal. U.S. District Judge George Young said Tuesday that a status hearing on the case will be held Nov. 25. Gurney faces charges of conspiring to raise an illegal fund through kickbacks from builders seeking federal housing favors and of lying to a federal grand jury investigating the alleged kickbacks.

Matthews Denies Commitment TALLAHASSEE (AP) - A legislator who is switching parties says he has made no commitment to support House Speaker Donald Tucker's bid for a virtually unprecedented second term.

But Rep. Harvey Matthews of Orlando, a Republican who said Tuesday he will register as a Democrat, is considered close to Tucker and a probably supporter in the speaker's bid for re-election to the 1977-78 term.


