Federal Judge Orders Army To Free Calley

turned the court-martial conviction of former Army Lt. William L. Calley Jr. for My Lai murders and ordered him released immediately from military prison.

U.S. District Court Judge J. Robert Elliott said in his lengthy ruling that Calley's conviction "is constitutionally invalid and that he is, therefore, entitled to the release sought in his habeas corpus petition." Calley, 31, has been confined to the disciplinary barracks at Ft. Leavenworth, Kan., since June 26, when Elliott took his

Army lawyers could seek an immediate stay of Elliott's order to release Calley "forthwith.

They could ask Elliott for an immediate stay of his ruling or appeal directly to the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in

New Orleans in order to prevent Calley's release. The heart of Calley's plea was that he was a victim of unequal justice when convicted by a military tribunal 31/2 years ago for the slaying of 22 Vietnamese civilians. In his ruling, Elliott said there was inflamatory, dam-

aging, pretrial publicity concerning Calley, who was convicted in March 1971.

In Washington, the Army said its lawyers would study the judge's decision "in order to evaluate various legal alterna-

The Army automatically considers parole for Calley Nov 19 - the date when he will have served one-third of the his 10year sentence. His original life sentence was reduced to a 20eral of the 3rd Army, and later reduced to 10 years by Secretary of the Army Howard Callaway Calley already has submitted his petition for parole to au-

thorities at Ft. Leavenworth, and his lawyers say the request should soon be before the Army and Air Force Clemency Board in Washington. Calley also has applied for presidential pardon, based on

the issue of amnesty for draft evaders. Elliott is the same judge who freed Calley last Feb. 27 after the former lieutenant had spent three years under house arrest at nearby Ft. Benning, Ga.

Three months later, the Army won reversal of Elliott's bail decision from the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans. Calley appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court, which refused to overturn the appellate court's decision on bail. After Elliott took Calley's conviction appeal under advisement June 25, Calley was flown to Ft. Leavenworth where he has been working as a clerktypist.

In his appeal hearing, Calley's attorneys said his trial was manipulated from the "highest positions in the Army - from Gen. (William C.) Westmoreland or possibly even higher." J. Houston Gordon, Calley's chief attorney, argued that Calley's constitutional right to call witnesses was violated when the military judge refused to subpoena Westmoreland, commanding general in South Vietnam when the My Lai massacre occurrer and Army chief of staff when Calley was

Gordon also said that if Westmereland had appeared, defense attorneys would have sought to compare him to Gen. Tomayuki Yamasure, Japanese commander in the Philippines of an occupying army which massacred civilians during the closing days of World War II.

Flood Area Building Rules OK'd

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - Stung with flooding complaints in several city areas, the city council has agreed to a plan limiting commercial, industrial and apartment construction in flood prone areas.

Councilman Cal DeVoney, despite stiff opposition ramrodded through to unanimous approval authorization for City Atty. Joe Davis to prepare for adoption an ordinance setting construction standards in low-lying areas.

The ordinance will designate flood-safe construction elevations and require construction of either water holding ponds or a positive drainage system to a moving body of

DeVoney said although many lakes are overflowing in the city, the area has had 10 inches less rainfall this year than at the same time last year. He insisted that requiring builders to provide drainage will

alleviate problems leading the fact (from the railroad tracks to 14 for Lakes Florida, Auelaide and Mobile) and

North Lake (south of SR 436 and east of I-4) basins. It was said this will be a first step of a series following guidelines established in a recent drainage study completer by consulting engineers Glace and Radcliffe.

Mayor Norman Floyd at first opposed the move, looking toward the possibility of acquiring federal funding for additional drainage studies, later voting with the proposal. Floyd reported a better fire insurance rating has been received from the state for city property owners. Floyd said with improvements in the fire department, including construction of a second fire house on Montgomery Road, west of the number one station on SR 427, and the hiring of additional firefighters, a new rating of "7" has been given the city.

The city had a "9" rating in territory west of I-4 and an "8" in the old city sections, previously. Cities are rated on a scale from 10 to one depending

quality of fire protection. The rating determines fire insurance rates.



Food Stockpile


Despite increased crop yields in some nations resulting from improved fertilizers, more productive seeds and modern farming practices, the worldwide problem of food supply appears more serious than ever.

Droughts, floods and other conditions difficult or impossible to control account for some of the shortage, but equally significant is the growing affluence of much of the world. Simply stated, many people are gaining the means to buy more and better food and advances in agriculture are not keeping up with the world's affluence and population growth.

There is a growing clamor to develop an international system to get food from the nations with surpluses-such as the United States of America-to those with deficits. Improving emergency relief programs make good sense, for many pockets of famine in the world could be treated quickly by better distribution of available supplies. However, in October the United Nations will consider proposals to create a worldwide stockpile of food to stabilize supplies and prices regardless of whether crops are short or plentiful.

A better solution, surely, is the route we are now following where the government is encouraging U.S. framers to produce more food which can be sold abroad. Economically, such a policy is sound because the United States gains from the improved trade balances resulting from the agriculture sales. Also, if we concentrate on developing better world distribution systems for farm products, U.S. surpluses would more easily get

To object to an international food cartel as a means of creating a stockpile is not to deny the need for an emergency reserve of food for famine relief. A limited stockpile may be developed when the U.N. worldwide food conference is held in

Pardon May Have Harmed

By his undoubtedly humane but fully premature granting of a "full, free and absolute" pardon to former President Richard M. Nixon for any offenses he may have committed against the United States during his presidency, President Gerald R. Ford has seriously strained and may have irreparably damaged the credibility he brought with him into the White House, and which he must maintain if the nation is ever to recover from Watergate. Rather than helping to heal the wound of

Watergate Mr. Ford's action has served to reopen it. He has done the very thing he implie he would not do when he testified before a Senate committee as vice-president-designate. Almost every reason the President cited in his

pardon message could be used as an argument for not doing what he did. "I believe passions would again be aroused,"

he said, "by a long, drawn-out period of litigation against Richard Nixon. Our people would again be polarized in their opinions, and the credibility of our free institutions of government would again be challenged at home and abroad." Precisely this has been the result of his placing Richard Nixon forever beyond punishment, and even beyond indictment and trial, for whatever crimes he may have committed

The President says he had been advised that many months and perhaps years would have to pass "before Richard Nixon could hope to obtain a fair trial by jury in any jurisdiction of the United States." It would be helpful to know who provided that advice.

This use of the presidential pardon power is, of course, a shortcutting of our system of justice which is one of the things the President is sworn to preserve, protect and defend. Utility Price Study Proposed

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate Commerce Committee has taken a first step that could lead to lower electric-power rates for American consumers. It approved a bill authorizing a three-year, \$4-million study by the Federal Power Commission to determine whether and how the current pricing system should be

The legislation is aimed at the "declining-block-rate" system under which the more power is consumed, the less is paid per unit. A key element of the FPC study would be the feasibility of a peak-pricing system. Under this method, a user would pay less for electricity at certain

Cuba, Oust Soviets-- Buckley

WASHINGTON (AP) - The United States should get an agreement for the removal of Soviet military and intelligence forces from Cuba before entering into a more "normal" relationship with the island, says Sen. James L.

The New York Conservative Republican expressed concern at a news conference Tuesday about intelligence operations in Cuba, which he said have led to political kidnapings and murders in Latin America.

Airline Aid Suggested

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Transportation Department, citing the financial plight of the nation's two largest international airlines, has urged the Civil Aeronautics Board to quickly adopt higher rates for mail carried by U.S. international airlin's.

Undersecretary John Barnum, in a letter to CAB Chairman Robert Timm, said the present international mail rates have been basically un changed since 1968 and do not reflect the substantial increases in fuel costs brought on by the fuel shortage.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The head of the Federal Energy Administration says that the prospect of adequate fuel supplies makes it unnecessary for Congress to extend the Emergency Petroleum Allocation Act.

In testimony Tuesday before a House subcommittee considering extension of the bill, the agency's administrator, John C. Sawhill, said, "The Arab embargo, thankfully, is behind us and our volume of imports has returned to near pre-embargo levels." The legislation expires in February 1975.

White House Staff Stable



Q: Can you settle an argument? Who led the AFC in most average yards per punt? Ray Guy of Oakland or Jerrell Wilson of Kansas City?-Kevin Hart, Pleasanton, Calif.

Jerrel (one "1") Wilson barely nosed out rookie Guy of the Raiders with a 45.5 average which also led all of pro football. Guy had a 45.3 average. You sense right. A little of the arrogance that sometimes goes with being the No. 1 fighter in the world has begun to ooze out of George. The years since that act of innocence in 1968 have brought some emotional changes, too. He was married and split up. He got into very complex and muddled managerial situations with his money. And despite his omnipotence as a fighter, amply proved against Joe Frazier and Ken Norton, he doesn't have the awesome presence of a Jack Dempsey or a Joe Louis. George could use a little of just being a nice

Q. I'd like to know who were the Cy Young Award winners in the American League from 1970 through '73. And who do you think will get the Cy Young -Award in the American League this year? - J.W. McGee, Sacramento, Calif.

The previous four Cy Young winners were as follows: 1970, Jim Perry, Minnesota; 1971, Vida Blue, Oakland; 1972, Gaylord Perry, Cleveland; 1973, Jim Palmer, Baltimore. Gaylord Perry started off the '74 season as if he'd be a cinch to pick up his second AL award but since then the favorite's role has shifted dramatically to wily Luis Tiant of the Boston Red Sox. DEAR POLLY - My answer for I.C.G. who has trouble cleaning her chrome toaster-broiler that looks smeared and streaked is to use a spray window cleaner with ammonia in it. Spray, wipe and then shine with a paper towel or lint free cloth. I find this cleans any chrome. - L.C.
