Bishop Of Diocese Of St. Augustine Was With Fitzhugh Ire During SpanishWar

#### Was Pastor In Palatka 10 Years

JACKSONVILLE, Aug. 13 -(AP) - The Most Reverend Patrick Barry who rose Irom assistant pastor of a Jacksonville parish to Bishop of the St. Augustine diocese died in a hospital here shortly after midnight of a heart ailment. Although he had not been feeling well for several days, his death was unexpected.

He came here from St. Augustine only last Sunday. Death was the result of coronary occlusion. Born in Ireland, Bishop Barry was 71. He was ordained priest in 1895. Funeral arrangements have not been made.

Dr. Barry, the fifth occupant of the See of St. Augustine, entered Mungret College in 1887 and in 1890 passed on to St. Patricks College, Carlow, where he studied philosophy and the-

established Parish of the Assumption in South Jacksonville in 1913. In four years he had erected a fine church, rectory, and parish half. In 1917 Dr. Curley called him to St. Augustine as rector of the Cathedral and Vicar-Genaral.


