



10-Day Cease-Fire

Begins In Lebanon

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Leaders of Moslem and cease-fire at noon today. The truce was to last 10 days to resign and open the way for political reforms to end

Palestine guerrilla chief Yasir Arafat told all guerrilla groups to help enforce the standdown. Franjieh sent no word that he would resign. But the Syrian government, which pressured leftist warlord Kamal Junblatt into accepting the cease-fire with a threat year-old president would quit as soon as a new president

Franjieh was bombed out of the presidential palace car of Beirut by Junblatt's forces March 25. His temporary headquarters in the Christian port of Jounieh 12 miles north of Beirut would not say officially whether he would quit. But some aides said he would stay on even if a new president were elected.

Quebec Flooding Worsens

MONTREAL (AP) - Hundreds of families have had to across much on Quetec Province, authorities said.

They said more than 100 families were evacuated in the Gatineau area near Ottawa as about 400 houses were affected by the rising Gatineau and Ottawa rivers. Evacuations also were reported in the Montreal, Quebec City and Trois Rivieres areas. Near Montreal, officials said more than 2,000 hornes and businesses have been affected by the flooding over the past week.

No dollar damage estimates have been given. Officials said along the Richelieu River east of Montreal some houses were being flooded for the second time in a week.

Wilson's Decision Is Poorly Timed

Considering the intensely personal nature of British politics and problems, many Americans probably are wondering why anybody wants to be prime minister of that country, not why one wants

Prime Minister Harold Wilson's decision to step down as soon as his successor can be chosen can be as simple as the fact that he is 60 years old and tired of it all. And the graceful period for resigning for those who have a choice is when some exactly that with his long summary showing that Britain's external affairs are in good order.

Nevertheless, the consideration must be the nation, not the man and on that basis Britain would have been better off if he stayed. His resignation comes at a time when the mood in Britain is optimistic. The flow of North Sea oil that will add wealth to England's coffers is beginning. Labor is generally living within a \$12-a-week pay increase ceiling adopted last August. The inflationary rate has dropped from 25 per cent last year to 14 per cent so far this year. The budget has been tightened substantially and Mr. Wilson appears to be winning his fight for an additional \$10 billion cut in the next two years. Most of all Britain is exhibiting a realization that the cost of its social programs has become prohibitive and counter productive. The nation now will be thrown into disarray as

the rough and tumble of picking Mr. Wilson's successor progresses. Betting appears to be on Foreign Secretary James Callaghan who is roughly in the center of his party's political spectrum. However, he is four years older than Mr. Wilson and cannot be the Labor Party's long-range leader. But the same token the other likely candidates are on either end of the spectrum and very likely could not survive in office for long. The Conservative Party already is predicting that an election will have to be called within a half a year, and that is a long time for Britain to lose her political direction.

The Turmoil in London is not a happy propsect for the Atlantic economic and military allies because it adds another major state to an already long list of governments fighting internal political

It must be acknowledged, however, that if Hubert Himphrey emerges from a brokered convention, Gov. Brown would be a logical choice as his vice presidential running mate.

The track record of California governors at national conventions of their parties has been dismal. None has been nominated, and active pursuit of the nomination has brought all of them a measure of embarrassment, frustration and failure.

It was perhaps inevitable that Jerry Brown would heed the call, as others have before him. He will be lucky if he comes out of the convention unscathed. But he has had extraordinary luck so far in his political career. Right now it looks as though that

Author Denied Citizenship

WASHINGTON - When President Ford refused to see exiled Soviet author Alexander Sc'zhenitsyn last summer, he, quite deservedly, caught hell from all directions — from liberals

White House press secretary Ron Nessen originally said the President was simply too busy to see Solzhenitsyn, adding that fur thermore Mr. Ford "for image reasons does like to have some substance in his meetings."

This pathetic excuse however was quickly blown down by gales of laughter when it was asked, if this was true, then why had the President, in the past, met and posed for pictures with such "heavy thinkers" as: Brazilian soccer star Pele; Miss America, 1975; the Maid of Cotton; the West Virginia Strawberry Queen; and three Russian pilots who had made the first transpolar flight to the U.S. in 1937.
