

Motorcyclist in critical condition after Sunday wreck on 17-92

Seminole County's Air Rescue 3 medevac helicopter was called to Sanford Sunday evening when a Winter Springs motorcyclist rear ended a vehicle.

Travelling southbound on the inside lane of French Avenue, police reported Khamsamay Vongvilay, 41, was in the process of switching lanes aboard his motorcycle when he neglected to notice a vehicle making a right-hand turn.

Ronnie Daniel Debose, 23, of Sanford, was reportedly turning right on to 24th Street when the accident occurred shortly before 7

Authorities said Vongvilay was not wearing a helmet. He is listed in critical condition at Orlando Regional Medical Center. Cleo Cohen, Sanford police spokesperson, said Debose did not suffer any injuries as a result of the wreck. French Avenue was partially blocked for almost an hour as officers conducted a traffic investigation.

I-4 overpass under repair

Repairs to the Interstate 4 overpass in Lake Mary started Monday morning, to replace a beam and part of the Lake Mary Boulevard bridge deck.

The construction project is expected to last about 45 days, and the entrance to westbound Interstate 4 from westbound Lake Mary Boulevard will be reduced from two lanes to

one for the duration. Late last year, a truck traveling westbound on Interstate 4 struck the beam causing the damage that necessitates the repairs.

81-year-old Sanford man accused of stockpiling \$40,000 in stolen goods

SANFORD — While a collection of four-dozen weed whackers may seem out of the ordinary, police say it is only the tip of the iceberg in an 81-year-old man's mounatin of suspected stolen property.

A two-month investigation by the Sanford police netted Tuesday one of the single largest booty of suspected stolen goods in department history. At last count, authorities claim more than \$40,000 in yard equipment, electronics and about everything else imaginable was discovered at two dilapidated sheds at 709 Willow Avenue in Sanford.

Local authorities have busted more lucrative theft rings in the past, but none may compare to the quantity of suspected stolen goods found at the home of Roosevelt Martin, Sanford police criminal investigations and special tactical units executed a search warrant at Martin's home Tuesday and probably found more than they

Leaders gave the initial nod Tuesday to an ordinance that

bans consumption or burning of any tobacco good - cigarettes, cigars chewing tobacco, snuff or related product in a city park. If approved at the commission's next meeting May 17, Longwood would be the first government in Seminole County to outlaw

smoking in a public park. Similar to others in Central Florida that recently enacted similar laws, such as Brevard County and the city of Port Orange, the proposed fine for violating the Longwood ordinance would be up to \$100 for first-time offenders and possibly up to \$500 for each subse-

quent violation. The City Commission did not unanimously support the ordinance as Commissioner Brian Sackett continued to debate the merits of the amended city code that outlaws smoking in parks, but allows the city administrator to create designated smoking areas in some areas. The City Commission previously agreed setting up a permitted smoking area with possibly a bench and ashtray in the city's larger parks such as Candyland and Reiter could work, but it probably wouldn't be feasible in smaller recreational areas.

"I am not a smoker and I

Two hair salon operators nabbed for bilking elderly

Two women who operated a hair salon at an affluent retirement community were arrested Monday on 25 charges each of exploitation of the elderly in connection with overcharging incapacitated clients.

The investigation began in January 2004, when the State Attorney's Office Elder Services Unit was contacted by someone suspicious of certain practices in the hair salon at the Village on Green Retirement Community, 500 Village Place, them," said Norm Wolfinger,

Longwood. The facility is an upscale retirement community that consists of individual independent living residences and a separate long-term care nursing facil-

"We have an obligation and responsibility to protect our seniors and hunt out those who would prey upon them whether in their own home or an assisted living facility. I am pleased with the initiative of our Elder Services Unit in uncovering these on-going crimes in Seminole County and putting a stop to Seminole County State Attorney.

The allegations centered on improper billing activities by the managers of the salon against some of the patrons who were billed for services and products not received. State Attorney's Office investigators served a search warrant on the business in late January with the Seminole County Sheriff's Office Economic and Computer Crimes Unit and seized records which document-

ed the allegations. The salon catered to both independent residents of the community and the residents of

the long-term nursing facility. The criminal activities were limited to the portion of the salon that catered predominately to those patrons of the nursing facility, many of whom suffer from the physical and mental infirmi-

ties of advanced age. Numerous intentional billing inconsistencies were discovered from the seized material. Records indicated a pattern of charges being assessed against patrons from the Health Center within the community for salon services that were never received.

Management at the communi-

ty facility was cooperative during the course of this investigation. The lease of the salon was subsequently terminated shortly after the evidence was examined.

Tammy Threatt and Margaret "Ann" Barber were arrested and each charged with 25 counts of exploitation of the elderly. Threatt leased the salon for 11 years and her mother, Barber, comanaged it with her.

Investigators said the charges covered only a period of 90 days because all business records older than that are routinely destroyed.



City Fire Department provides smoke detectors

Casselberry's Fire Department will continue its city-wide smoke detector installation campaign this summer in an effort to provide all residents with the potentially life-saving devices.

The latest leg of the campaign is supported by a \$2,000 donation from Wayne Densch Charities. With the donated funds, the fire department was able to purchase 374 smoke detectors. Members of the fire department will once again be checking to see if residents have smoke detectors, now that the department's supply of detectors has been replenished.

Fire department personnel will be installing detectors for residents who don't have them and can't afford to purchase them, replacing batteries for those who do, and repositioning detectors which have been installed in ineffective smoke detection locations.

The smoke detector campaign began in January after a fire death in the Lake Kathryn Estates mobile home development. The fire victim did not have a working smoke detector in her home.

Fire crews, battalion chiefs, the fire marshal, deputy chiefs, as well as the Fire Chief Mitch Floyd launched a door-to-door campaign in Lake Kathryn in the week following the death.

Forty-six percent of the residences in Lake Kathryn Estates were found to have non-working or no smoke detectors. Residents without smoke detectors were given new units and crews installed batteries in detectors that failed to work due to dead batteries. All installations were completed at no cost to the residents.

The city of Casselberry's Fire Rescue Department maintains a high standard of **Emergency Medical Services and Fire** Protection. The city Fire/Rescue Service was among the first service in the county to provide complete Advanced Life Support service on each of its front run vehicles. Casselberry was the first government agency in the county to offer regular patient transportation in its Rescues. All firefighters are dual certified as Paramedics or Emergency Medical Technicians and in addition to fire protection, provide state of the art technology and pre-hospital treatment during cardiac, trauma, medical and other emergencies.



anticipated, as a large U-Hatil truck was needed to transport the mass of evidence.

"What we did is we had one of our undercover officers sell stolen property to the gentlemen and then he was going to turn around and sell it to another undercover officer at a profit," said Cleo Cohen, Sanford police spokesperson.

Martin has been charged with dealing in stolen property and theft, but more charges could begin to stack up — similar to the heap of goods pulled out on the Willow Avenue lawn Tuesday.

"We have quite a variety," Cohen said. "There are probably 50 weed caters we've pulled out of the garage. There are power tools, toolboxes, lawnmowers, pumps, air compressors, TVs, edgers, pressure cleaners and even some typewriters. He's apparently been buying the stolen property and reselling it from the information we've received in the community."

Most of the items are somewhat worn and appear to be taken from garages, carports or

think smoking stinks," Sackett said. "I have researched this from California all the way over to New England and down to Florida and found so many areas that have banned smoking totally and have excluded the idea of designated smoking areas."

Sackett said he continued research of the issue by interviewing local residents that have young ballplayers.

"They are pretty well split and as a result I either say we allow smoking fully, which I really do not have trouble with because it is an outdoor area, or we ban smoking entirely," he said.

The idea of designated smoking areas creates the opportunity for parents to leave their children unsupervised, Sackett added.

The only resident speaking during the public hearing, Debrah Kryc, also did not favor the ordinance stating the commission was over stepping its boundaries.

"I don't know if we should be so presumptuous to try to control the air outside," she said. "My question is what next? Does that mean I can't buy the house down the street because I'm a smoker and the person next to me doesn't want the smoke filtering intotheir home."

Gordon AGAIN

A victory at California Speedway makes it two in a row for No. 24

Fontana, Calif. hose flames on Jeff Gordon's No. 24 Chevrolet painted an accurate picture of Sunday at

California Speedway. The only thing hotter than the temperature at the track - near 100 - turned out to be Gordon. And he

was stzzling. It was 98.7 degrees in the shade, 140 on the track and 141 in the pit area. Meanwhile, Gordon was smoking his way to victory in the Auto Club 500. OK, smoking might be a bit of a stretch: It was

another of those dreaded fuel mileage finishes. But Gordon is on another of his tears. He won for the second straight weekend, the 15th time he's done it in his career -- 19th if you count his streaks of three and four consecutive wins.

The victory extends Gordon's streak of multiplewin seasons to 11, the longest current run in Nextel

His 66th career win also puts him 27 points out of first place in the season standings. He's third, behind Jimmie Johnson and leader Dale Earnhardt Jr., who finished a dismal 19th.

Gordon beat Johnson by an undramatic 12.871 seconds when Bobby Labonte, Gordon's only serious challenger over the last 37 laps, ran out of gas on the the final lap. Labonte, in the No. 18 Chevrolet, coasted home fifth.

Johnson, Gordon's teammate, cruised past two Evernham Motorsports cars that also made fuel mis calculations. Kasey Kahne, a serious contender until he pulled in for fuel with 15 laps to go, finished 13th in the No. 9 Dodge. Jeremy Mayfield also had to pit late for fuel and slipped from a contending fourth to

Gordon turned out to be about a half-lap more fuel-conscious than Labonte.

"Definitely, we had our hands full," Gordon said. "Fuel mileage wasn't even a thought in my mind. I was just trying to stay ahead of Bobby. I thought it was going to be really, really close. It was a huge relief when Bobby ran out of fuel. I hate it for him but it allowed me to go conservative on my final lap.

The fuel pressure gauge was fluctuating. He ultimately ran dry, too. His team had to push







RiverWalk facts

- The Sanford RiverWalk is a 12-foot-wide pedestrian pathway stretching 1.2 miles from Mellonville Avenue on the east to French Avenue (U.S. Highway 17-92) on the west. The heavily landscaped pathway features trellis swings, benches and other amenities for people to enjoy the views of Lake Monroe.
- During construction of the \$11 million project, crews rebuilt the aging seawall using more than 4 million cubic feet of concrete and 1,666 30-foot by 4-foot concrete panels, some weighing as much as 7.5 tons each.
- The completion of the 1.2-mile stretch represents Phase I of the RiverWalk. Phase II is expected to extend the pathway to Interstate 4. No timetable has been established for construction of Phase II.
