WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon today sends Congress his proposed legislation replacing numerous specific community-aid programs with \$2.3 illion a year in special revenue-sharing funds

"This aid will have no strings attached as long as it is used for community development." Nixon said last month in announcing his special revenue sharing

Vincent related his experiences, also as a former guest of the Blue Angels. Nixon said the measure is intended to replace what he called "inflexible and fragmented" categorical grant-inaid programs such as Model Cities and urban renewal plus projects providing grants for water and sewer projects, demolition neighborhood facilities and rehabilitation work.

Nixon first proposed the community development legislation in 1971 but failed to muster enough support in either the House or the Senate.

While the Better communities Act would replace seven Housing and Urban Development categorical programs it would not affect HUD's housing and community planning authority.

The administration said a large share of the total funds appropriated annually under the act—about 78 per cent by the fifth year at a \$2.3 billion levelwould be allocated and made available directly to all central cities in metropolitan areas; all cities over 50,000 population, and all urban counties with a population of over 200,000.

## How Firms Should Not Behave Abroad

Should Congress draw up a "code of conduct" for American multinational corporations? This is one of the questions being asked here as Capitol Hill focuses a searing spotlight on these firms in the wake of the International Telephone and Telegraph Co.'s controversial activities in Chile.

ITT President Harold Geneen has admitted his company offered \$1 million to the Central Intelligence Agency and other U.S. agencies at the time of the 1970 elections in Chile. Some senators believe the money was to be used to block the election of Dr. Salvador Allende Gossens, the Marxist candidate. CIA declined

Allende won and when he became president he pushed through the nationalization of a number of American businesses, including some owned by ITT.

An ex post facto excess profits law passed and ITT was denied expropriation payments. The Senate Foreign Relations multinational subcommittee, headed by Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, investigated the ITT matter and took a

keen interest in the company's \$92.5 million

expropriation insurance contract with the Overseas Private Investment Corp. (OPIC). A U.S. government agency, with majority private sector representation on its board of directors, OPIC promotes capital investments in the less developed countries and insures U.S. firms against loss due to currency inconvertibility, expropriation, war, revolution

Negotiating teams from Mexico and the United States of America have broken off their discussions in San Diego about new regulations governing fishing off the coast of Mexico, but there are signs of willingness on both sides to resolve the dispute.

Mexico has agreed not to attempt to enforce its new law covering commercial fishing up to 12 miles off shore until there are further talks. The objections raised by representatives of U.S. fishermen will be studeid meanwhile in Mexico

A spirit of compromise has always predominated when Mexico and the United States find their interests in conflict. With patience and reason, this impasse can surely be resolved in a way that benefits all who rely on the off-shore fishery for a livelihood.

#### Incredible Waste In Welfare System

WASHINGTON (NEA) For sheer horror stories in waste, inefficiency and the unequal treatment of the poor in this nation's welfare programs, I recommend the reading of a dry but fascinating "Paper No. 6, Studies in Public Welfare"—a staff study by the Subcommittee on Fiscal Policy of the Joint Economic Committee of Congress. The report was based on a General Accounting Office sampling of six selected sites in the poverty areas from

Pertinent conclusions from that study help to explain why President Nixon and a growing number of senators and representatives are determined that change must be made in how this country distributes assistance:

· Some families on welfare may end up with twice and sometimes three times as much income and benefits as other families in apparently similar circumstances. Households receiving five or more benefits - about a fifth of the samples - are generally well off, if aid in kind is included. In fact, in eastern and western cities the average total income figures exceeded the \$6,500-ayear adequate income level advocated by the National velfare Rights Organization. Yet there are large pockets of extreme poverty, with the proportion being as high as 14 per cent at two sites.

· In a great number of cases, perhaps in most, the poor are severely handicapped for working, certainly at working more than a limited number of hours a week. The more a beneficiary works, the higher the rate of reduction in benefits, usually, under current programs.

Combined cash, food, housing and other benefits for urban households with children (but having no private income) ran from \$368 to \$767 per month. These tax-free benefits exceed the median wage levels for fulltime working women, which range from \$303 to \$512 monthly in the five urban areas studied, and either exceed or approximate after-tax wages for men, which vary from \$387

Beneficiaries of some housing programs, for example, could not be identified without first determining the private mortgage company which handled an individual's subsidized loan. "And of course, people can and do possess more than one Social Security number and may have recorded one number with one agency and a different number with a second agency.'

Watergate Could Have Been a Slip

Granting the reality of the President's isolation from even his top staff, and the likelihood (accepted by so many) that he did not know of the Watergate bugging matter at least until too late to stop it, could he have said anything to touch off the whole chain of events?

The answer is "yes". Sources who study and watch Mr. Nixon closely do not think such an answer at all inconsistent with the persuasive evidence of his deep personal Look at it first from the Haldeman aspect. The widely

held view of him in Washington is that of the doggedly

loyal servant to the President. Everything we know suggests this judgment is accurate. Haldeman is not perceived as a personal empire-builder though as guardian of the door to the Oval office he exercises a high degree of control over the written and the foot traffic flowing toward Mr. Nixon. Just as he is probably more isolated from the President than many observers would believe reasonable, so he isolates himself from people down the line, both in and out of the White House.

He transmits presidential orders, and may originate a good many which he thinks convey Mr. Nixon's "general intent" in certain circumstances. But most testimony is that Haldeman is not an active "field force" manager in any situation, and definitely was not in the surveillance His acknowledgement to congressmen that he ordered

the surveillance clears up how things got started from his level. It also answers how former White House aide Dwight Chapin and Nixon lawyer Herbert Kalmbach got going on the so far too briefly probed part of the operation which led Kalmbach to hire and fund Donald Segretti for disruptive" activities designed to disconcert the Democrats last year in a variety of ways. As prior reports indicated, neither Chapin nor Kalmbach could be put down as self-starters in such an endeavor. The big question at Haldeman's level is what got him

## Altamonte Council Action

Petitions for annexation and rezoning, with the exception of two, were all cleared by city council Tuesday, paving the way for new requests to come under innovative proceedures. Council, last week, decided to implement new proceedures governing future annexations, upping the fees in

The new fees for zoning requests and annexations will be \$200 each, as opposed to the present \$100 for both. The new proceedure will also handle zoning applications in one action and annexation requests separately. Present policy is to consider both in one action of council.

Council deferred action upon the resolution governing the issue until next week, authorizing City Atty. S.J. Davis Jr. to amend the resolution to provide that annexation requests shall come before council first for review before being sent by the city clerk to the tax assessor's office for certification

The next step in the proceedure is to refer the request to the city zoning board for review and recommendation and then to the tax assessor. It was also stipulated that council shall consider the request upon the first meeting in which it is

In another matter, council adopted upon first reading an ordinance adopting the Southern Standard Building Code for the city with the 1972 revision of the 1969 addition to the code.

#### Rezoning Request

A request by developer Torn Dyer for rezoning of property located on Grandview and Maitland Avenues from residential to commercial in order to erect an antique shop was continued until June 12. City Clerk Jane Richards told council "It may very well be the new zoning ordinance will be in effect by that time if that's what you're buying time for."

Zoning Director Buddy Gemeinhardt reported to council that documents upon Station Street in which abandonment had been requested last week, were researched and there was nothing to indicate the street, never used, had been abandoned by the city. The county had ordered the street closed in 1938, Councilman Helen Keyser still maintained the city should not abandon the street since it provides an access from Orieta Ave. to SR 436.

Gemeinhardt said the rights-of-way were to close to the railroad tracks for the street to be of any use to the city, and Mayor Lawrence Swofford noted the street has never been used and never will be.

Also approved was payment to Orange Paving Co. of \$21,477 for the first progress report upon the site improvements for the new civic center. The figure represents completion of underground work such as sewers and water

#### Power Plant Needed

Jacksonville, NA, Jacksonville, Fla., from 1953 through 1964.

Florida Power and Light studies indicate the necessity for another power plant site in Dade County by 1979 to serve the needs of increasing population as well as the greater use of electric service by existing customers.

The recent power outages in South Florida underscore the need to expand and strengthen power facilities in areas where the demand for service is heaviest. While strong interconnections within the system and with other power companies are important, it is essential to service reliability that adequate generation be maintained adjacent to high load centers.

At the present time, FPL is considering several alternative sites in Dade County for future power plants. "We have communicated frequently with government officials at the county, state, and federal levels as well as with other interested parties," said an FPL spokesman. "Through these discussions, we have received a great

deal of helpful information which will assure that all established requirements will be met by the proposed plant,' For more than a year, engineering and biological studies

have been conducted by consulting firms in an effort to determine the most practical sites within the county for a power plant location. These studies are continuing at the present time.

The March figures, however, were gathered before the administration's meat ceiling was put into effect. Also, there was no indication of the effect of the week-long national consumer boycott of meat.

The report said the price of meat bought in grocery stores rose 5.4 per cent unadjusted and 4.8 per cent seasonally adjusted.
