By CHARLES MOLONY WASHINGTON—Want a gen ine; government-minted, 1793 date bronze medal commemorating Light Horse Harry Lee's Revolutionary War exploits?

That's the first medal ever made by the U. S. Mint, turned out the year after the Mint was founded, but you can get it from the Mint at Philadelphia for \$2.-25 plus postage.

plus postage. What you get may be as freshly struck as the Mint's newest medal, the Fred M. Vinson number in its secretaries of the treasury series (\$1.50), but it's made from the original 1793

The Bureau of the Mint here has assembled for the first time a collection of all the commemo-rative medals struck since this country was made up of British colonies. The result looks like a collector's - or maybe a swind-

ler's — dream.

Leland Howard, assistant director of the Mint, says, however, that there is surprisingly little swindling in the form of passing off newly-struck copies

as ancient originals of these medals—nothing in the class of the "rare" coins racket. Nevertheless, says Howard, there have been cases in which

there have been cases in which even a collector of rarities has put up perhaps \$20 for an old-date medal he could have gotten from the Mint for \$2.

All presidents, secretaries of the treasury and most directors of the Mint have been honored with medals, along with Army and Navy heroes and miscellaneous citizens. Exploits, many of them veiled in the mists of history, have been commemorated also.

The Presidential Series began as Undian Peace Medals. These carried on a tradition under which likenesses of the English King Georges were distributed to the pre-Revolutionary redakina as hopeful hints there'd be no tomahawk tossing or other disturbances.

George Washington holds the record for medals, with ten honoring him. Lincoln's the runner up. Howard, a Southerner, pointed out sorrowfully that the Confederacy's Robert E. Lee has naver been honored like his father, "Light Horse Harry."

The U. S. had seven medals minted in France before the U. S. Mint was established, but the Philadelphia Mint has the original plates for them and sells inal plates for them and sells

Many of the early medals were designed by celebrated artists, such as France's Du Vivier. They show in fine detail entire scenes of battle—charging horsemen, smoking guns and cannon, lines of riflemen and what not

Mint officials say there are several thousand collectors of the medals, and a lot of others who buy pretty numbers to give as Christmas presents. The Mint has issued approximately 200 different medals.


