part of the flight were indirectly to blame for its foreshortened ending, Larro-Horges explained. He said the plane at no time missed him or his companion any misgivings, acting beautifully at all times, but the headwinds cut down the gas supply much faster than anticipated.

Tired by their continuous vigilance since leaving Seville shortly after noon Sunday, the fliers found that they were not only dangerously low on fuel, but had lost their bearings as they approached the Brazilian coast.

Then the tropical night descended upon them suddenly. The fliers on Larro-Horges said, and found themselves over an unpopulated region some distance inside the coast and chanced a landing in the Maracuja region in what they thought was a level field but crashed in making the night landing.

Larro-Horges was thrown clear of the plane. Challes was pinned under it but the cut over his eye was the most serious of the various bruises he sustained. The fliers were forced to spend the night in the wilderness and it was not until yesterday that they were discovered by a horseman.

motion was to request a prompt report of the Rogers bill by the House Committee on World War Veterans' Legislation. This committee reported this bill favorably last winter during the short session, but the House leaders declined to allow a House vote upon it early enough to do any good, and the measure died with the session, according to the report of the Legion's national legislative committee.

National Commander Bodenbacher has fixed December 31 for a national telegraphic roll call of all states on advance Legion membership for 1930, and expects an unprecedented showing, which started immediately following the convention in Louisville. A similar roll call held November 19 showed the national organization running 40,000 ahead of a similar year before, and by December 1 this total was increased to more than 87,000, the 1929 membership being more than 200,000.

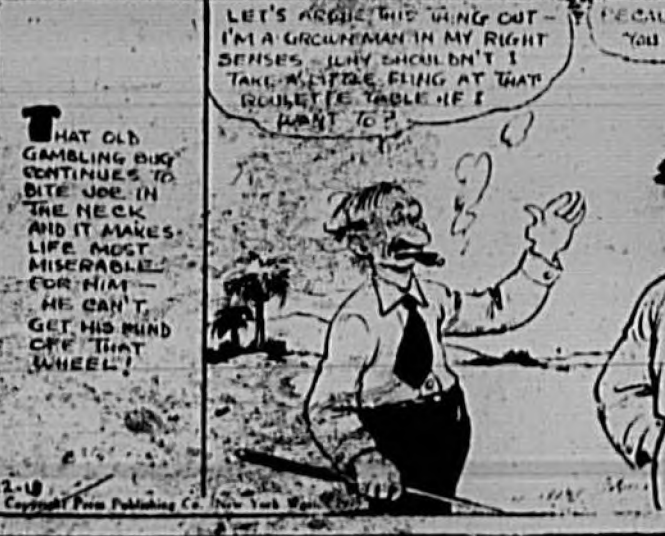

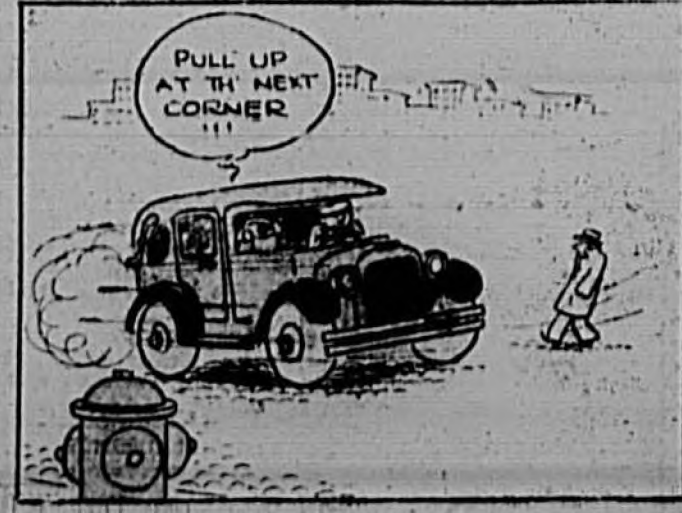
