A young Seminole County man joined in history yesterday as he became the first earthman to make actual physical contact with the Apollo 11 capsule and its three heroic crewmen after they splashed down in the tropical Pacific, 950 miles West of Hawaii. Mitchell L. Bucklew 26, the son of Mrs. Frances Bucklew of Lake

Mary was the first Navy SEAL (frogman) in the water and the first to reach the bobbing capsule that brought back the only two men ever to set foot on the moon's crust.

Bucklew was stationed in Vietnam for two years and was put into special training two months ago in preparation to assist in recovering the Apollo capsule and its history making crew after its 725,000 mile voyage. Before going into this recovery training, Bucklew received the coveted Bronze Medal for actions in Vietnam. He is presently stationed near San Diego, California according to his mother. Mrs. Bucklew told The Herald that "she was

thrilled and proud of her son's action in helping recover the spaceship and its crew." Bucklew's name was flashed across the nation by all the major TV networks following his recovery
