"The fire department reacted quickly, limiting the damage to about \$10,000," said Juan Bailey, public information officer for the Division of State Fire Marshal's fire and son Victor, 18, left in a van Immediately prior to flames bursting from the house shortly arson investigation bureau.

Investigators determined that paint thinner and enamel paint had been poured in one of the bedrooms. The thinner was the accelerate for the fire, but Bailey said it is

unclear why enamel paint was used.

"It's not really an accelerate. It mainly scorches," Bailey said. "My guess is they wanted it to look like someone was painting and the fire was an accident."

During an interrogation, Eleanor Ramos confessed to setting the fire, Bailey said. She told Investigator Christopher Scovotto that the owner of the house asked her to burn it down for the insurance money. investigators are dubious of that motive.

Seminole's Perry elected chief judge

SANFORD — Judges in the 18th Judicial District voted last week on which one of their peers would become the next chief

li was a unanimous verdict.

Judge James E.C. Perry received all 35 votes, an unprecedented vote for the 59-year-old Seminole County resident who has served just three years on

the bench. "When you're elected by your peers, that's the ultimate compliment," Perry said. "That I was elected by my peers shows they inist my judgment, trust my work ethic and fairness."

Making this election even more significant is the fact that Perry,

first black to hold the chief judge position in the 18th circuit. He's also the first chief judge from

Seminole County in 13 years.
"It's pretty exciting for us to have a chief judge," Senior Deputy Court Administrator Ron Serra said. "This is a very positive event for Seminole County.

Duties of the chief judge are both judicial and administrative. The chief judge controls both the circuit courts, which prosecute felonies, and county courts, which prosecute misdemeanors. The chief judge also assigns judges to courts, regulates the use of courtrooms and makes decisions effecting court-run pro-

Perry's term begins July 1 and will last for two-years, after which time he is eligible for re-election. Perry will replace Circuit Judge Bruce Jacobus of Brevard County. Perry did not seek out the job

of chief judge, rather he was asked to run by his fellow judges in the county. Wanting to bring the position back to Seminole, they believed Perry was the best chales.

"He's a very candid, sensible individual, soft spoken," Serra said. "On an administrative level his decisions are always very conservative, level-headed and logi-

"The partnership between the departments will help the team in a couple of ways," said Terry Schenk, Seminole County fire chief. "You don't have to duplicate equipment and anytime you get to share jurisdiction and come together to prevent duplication is

The unit is the fourth in the state of Florida, with others in Tumpa, Miami-Dade and Metro Dade. If those other team were called to

Lake Mary Commission decides not to reconsider School Board's zoning request

LAKE MARY - It looks like a disagreement over the relocation of an alternative school is headed

City commissioners Thursday briefly discussed their concerns over the relocation of Excel Alternatives Inc., within Technology Park, located off Lake Emma Road. Although on the meeting's agenda, a motion was not made to reconsider Commission's earlier denial of

Comprehensive Plan.
After City Manager John Litton summarized the last mediation meeting between the two parties held earlier this month, Mayor Thom Greene asked the commissioners whether they wanted to reconsider the item. There was no answer.

Commissioner George Duryen, however, asked if there was any progress made during the three mediation meetings in regard to the school's relocation.

"I think there was some move-ment by the School Board in trying to see if they could make the situa-

tion work," Commissioner Mike McLean sald. In a unanimous consensus, however, the commissioners agreed Technology Park is not an appropriate site for the school.

For two years, School Board staff members have searched for a new location for the alternative school in order to purchase a building rather than continue leasing the current facility, located in Sanford on Lake Mary Boulevard, for \$350,000 per year. The purchase would eventually save the school

system money.
It was determined that the Lake Mary site in Technology Park was

best suited for the facility's needs based on its cost, size and location. The alternative school operates on a business-like model, which school officials believe is consistent with businesses and industries located within the industrial park.

However, city officials have said a achool, no matter what type, is not compatible with the area. In November, Commission voted to deny an amendment change to the Comprehensive Plan that would allow for the school's relocation.

During January, city and school board officials met in a series of mediation meetings as required by

Seminole County's 1995 Interlocal Agreement. Although progress was made regarding traffic and public safety concerns addressed by the city, an agreement was not found over the compatibility and legality issues. Commissioners stated that the industrial park is not an appropriate setting for stu-

"We have to remember, despite the fact that it is an alternative school, the fact is that the students are 15-, 16- and 17-year-old people they are children,"

commission meeting, McLean used his time to point out that he graciously didn't seek a second term and nominated Jernigan to the post.





We should have seen it coming

Jim Horne, state education commissioner, has pre-dicted the state of Florida will need possibly as many as 20,000 new teachers for the next school

year. Three situations have caused this

unbelievable need.

The first one is the edict by Florida voters that class sizes be reduced by two students in each classroom. This means more class rooms and subsequently more teachers. Horne predicts this alone will require 5,000 to 7,000 new teachers, and with them, there will be an increased need in adminis-

Pfeifauf The second reason is one we deal with every year, the increase in our population. It seems as though everyone wants to move to sunny Florida. With the recent snowfall in the northeast - who can blame them.

The third reason actually started a little over five years ago. The state decreed that all employees on the State Retirement System, with long tenures, could have an increase in retirement benefits if they signed up to retire in exactly five years. It is called the "Drop Plan," and is intended to reduce higher paid employees, and help elevate the lower employees to higher paying jobs. Thousands of workers signed up for the plan, and June 30 will be the end

of the five years.

I don't know if this is true, but I was told by one
Seminole County school official, who is in the plan, that Seminole County will be losing 26 upper level teachers and administrators on June 30. The figure may not be exact, but you can bet it will be a lot of people retiring.

When Florida voters chose to reduce class sizes this coming term, I feel confident no one told them about the Drop Plan which will be eliminating thousands of school officials across the state at the same

It is said Florida schools graduate approximately 4,000 teachers each year, with about 3,500 expected to remain in the state. The rest will no doubt, go to

states where teachers' salaries are higher.
Several legislators and state school board officials are presented again saying that the reduction in class size law was either a bad one, or untimely.

There is one way to help obtain new teachers by allowing people with a bachelor's degree to go through a certification process to allow them to teach the subject which was their major. This however, in my estimation (and I hope you agree) will give us less than top-level instructors.

You can tell by my photo that I don't have any children in the school system any more, but I have grandchildren and I'm concerned about this prob-

Other than repealing that class size reduction and holding it off for a few more years, I have no suggestion. But I do feel that citizens should know what's going on in our educational system.

Above all, we can't blame our local school officials — in fact, they need our support now more than ever, as they launch into trying to obtain more teachers for this fall's school term.





Dismantling of smoke stacks begins next week

Light Company announced that dismantling of the twin red-andwhite-striped power plant stacks at its Sanford plant would begin next week.

The stacks are being removed as part of FPL's repowering of two large generators at the Central Florida site.

Repowering is more than dou-bling the electricity produced at the FPL plant by converting to new technology that utilizes natural gas as its primary fuel instead

The 400 foot-tall stacks were

DeBARY — Florida Power & the two large oil-burning units that are being repowered. (A third smanlling of the twin red-and-300-foot-tall stack associated with a smaller, oil and natural gas-fired generating unit will remain in operation.) The new stacks associaled with the repowered, com-bined-cycle natural gas-fired units present a much lower profile at only 125 feet in height.

Dismantling the concrete outer walls will begin by Feb. 24. A sliding scaffold method starting from the top of the stack will remove approximately seven vertical feet each day. The majority of the brick and concrete will be recycled as built in the early 1970's to serve crushed stone. While not as dramatic as explosive demolition, this method is the safest and most cost-effective process according to Rosanne Kennedy, plant manag-er. Currently, demolition is taking place to remove the firebrick inner stacks. Removal of both stacks should be completed by the middle of 2003,

Meanwhile, one of the two units being repowered was com-pleted and put in service to meet customers' electricity needs last summer. The other unit is expected to enter service this summer. When repowering is finished, the Sanford plant site will be capable of producing approximately 2,100 megawatts, which is enough power to serve 486,000 homes and businesses. The site was previously only capable of producing

One thing that will dominate Perry's term is Revision 7 to Article 5 of the Florida Constitution, which deals with state versus county funding. He'll have to work with state legislative officials in hopes of keeping state funding at its present level. Perry also wants to continue the construction of the new courthouse and will attempt to 'cross-pollinate" the circuit's judges between Seminole and Brevard, in hopes of bridging the gaps between the two counties.

"As it stands now (the two counties) have virtually nothing in common," Perry said.
"(Seminole) is small and
(Brevard) is very large. We'll
have some of our judges sit over there sometimes and some of their judges sit over here so that they'll get to interact with each

As for the racial aspect of Perry's election, both he and Serra are quick to point out that Perry was elected on his judicial merits and not the color of his skin. Still, Perry recognizes the

race issue and hopes it might help change what he thinks might be a perception of an unfair local legal system.
But most important he wants

to make sure he does the best he can do for the circuit as a whole.

"People feel comfortable knowing that a decision is not going to be based upon personality, it's going to be based upon the issues and what's in the best interest of the circuit," Perry said. "I don't expect everyone to agree with what I say or do. I just want to make a difference.







If DBCC finishes unbeaten, the remainder of the schools in the M-FC will play in a conference tournament on Monday and Tuesday to determine the other two teams that will advance to state.

But it is the men's game that will draw the most interest.

Santa Fe (24-5) is ranked No. 2 in the state and is in first place in the M-FC with a 7-2 record.

5CC (21-8) is ranked No. 6 in the state and is in second place with a 6-3 conference

If the Raiders, who very nearly rallied from a huge deficit to beat the Saints on their home court earlier this month, win, they will be crowned co-champions and earn a spot in the state tournament.

If SFCC wins, they are the champions and the Raiders will have to win a playoff next week to get to state.

SCC Baseball ends losing streak, back over .500

SANFORD — The Seminole Community College baseball team ended its four-game losing streak in a big way Wednesday, romping past South Florida Community College, 10-3, at Raider Field.

The Raiders (5-5) appeared on the verge of breaking the streak on Tuesday as it led 2-0 entering the bottom of the sixth inning in Ft. Pierce against Indian River Community College (8-2), but the host Pioneers exploded for nine runs in the sixth and seventh innings to win, 9-4, and drop the locals' record to under .500 for the first time this season.

Starting pitcher David Timm (1-1) was masterful over the first five innings allowing no runs on three hits, but then gave up three runs and three doubles in the sixth.

SCC meanwhile, was using the extra base hit to good advantage, taking a 2-0 lead on an RBI double by Tyson Malik in the third inning and a solo home run by Sean Greear in the fourth inning.

The Raiders came back to tie the game in the top of the seventh inning on Ben Sprague's third

home run of the season and Greear closed out the SCC scoring with his second home run of the game, and fourth of the season, in the eighth

Greear finished the game 2-for-3 with the two home runs, while Malik was 2-for-4 with two doubles and an RBI and Sprague was 1-for-5 with the home run, two runs scored and an RBI.

Courtney Propst, Michael Hnytka and Sanford's Chris Krall added one single each to the Raiders

SCC wasted no time in taking control of Wednesday's game, scoring four runs in the bottom of the first inning.

plete his bachelors degree. In 1997, he graduated first in his class from the combined former Florida Marine Patrol/Florida Highway Patrol academy near Tallahassee. After graduating, he began his career in marine law enforcement at Pennekamp State Park and the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary in Key Largo as a law enforcement officer with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

In 2000, after the former Marine Fisheries Commission and the former Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission merged to become the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Bowlin joined the FWC and accepted his current position in St. Johns County.

"During the course of his career, Randy has proven time and again that he is truly a dedicated professional and law enforcement officer. He is of unwavering high character, committed to the highest level of ethical standards, and is unquestionably the type of officer others strive to become, "said Major Andy Love, regional law enforcement commander for the FWC's Northeast

Bowlin loves to hunt, fish and boat, and one of the reasons he wanted to be a fish and wildlife officer was to give something back to the commu-

"I grew up hunting and fishing and have always enjoyed the outdoors. And, I've always been interested in the water; so by becoming a fish and wildlife officer, I am able to give something back to the community in a way I really enjoy. What a great combination," said Bowlin.

While there is hardly a routine day in an FWC officer's life, Bowlin routinely works to protect the state's fish and wildlife, while educating the public as to why that protection is so

Important. "About 85 percent of the people I encounter out there are trying to do the right thing, but they just don't always have the right information," he said. That's a big part of our job as law enforcement officers - to educate people about safety and laws, and why we have laws to protect fish and

Last year Bowlin worked a joint enforcement detail with the National Marine Fisheries Service which resulted in three arrests for violations of the Endangered Species Act. He made numerous hunting-related arrests, and rescued eight people from two separate vessel rescues.

In October, he prevailed in a gun battle in St. Augustine with a murder suspect who was subsequently arrested on charges for a murder in south Florida, and attempted murder on a law enforcement officer for his attempt on Bowlin's life.

He is a skillful vessel operator and regularly uses his abilities and knowledge to board offshore fishing vessels for inspections - a hazardous assignment requiring skill, composure and a high level of physical fitness. Bowlin possesses keen investigative skills and the ability to produce detailed reports that have resulted in a near-per-
