Pitching Duel Ends When Parker Balks To Score Skeen With Run

Sonnier and Womack Chased By Umpire Hummer For Disputing Decisions; Twin-Bill At Orlando Sunday

For six innings at Municipal Ball Park last night, Cleo Jeter and young Byron Parker of Ocala engaged in a hang-up pitcher's duel, but Parker balked Willie Skeen in with the first run of the game in the seventh. Sanford added one more run in the seventh and then pushed across three in the eighth to clinch the game.

Daytona Beach continued its winning ways in the semifinals of the Orlando Nationals and won 7-1, for its 11th straight victory, so Sanford was unable to increase its first place margin of five and one-half games.

Young Parker, a former U. of Alabama player pitching his first game in the Florida State league, matched Jeter pitch for pitch during the first six innings. He received sparkling support from his teammates who turned in four double plays in his behalf.

Jeter was having one of his better nights and was never in serious trouble with the exception of the ninth when he was riding comfortably on a 5-0 lead. Cleo struck out five, walked five, and allowed five hits.

Tonight the Seminoles will go to Ocala with Al Nixon scheduled to do the hurling honors for Manager Whitey Campbell. A double-header between Sanford and Orlando will be held in Orlando Sunday with Frank Hudson and Jodie Howington, both southpaws, hurling for Sanford.
