



WASHINGTON July 20.

— (AP) — President Roose-velt today signed a bill authorizing a \$4,610,000,000 ex-pansion of the Navy de-signed to give the United States a two ocean fleet capable of meeting any hostile combination.

The Chief Executive has already asked Congress to provide \$85,000,000 to start work on the new program which when completed in 1946 or 1947 would give the nation a total of '191 fighting ships,
