goods and services increased at an annual rate of 14.3 per cent during the first quarter-the largest jump since early 1965. Both reports reflected an overheating

economy with inflation running far above the Nixon administration's goals.

Administration officials have said they expect food prices to begin tapering off later this year and are resisting further controls. But with no letup in spiralling food costs, the White House may be forced to act beyond the meat price ceiling imposed March 26.

The March figures, however, were gathered before the administration's meat ceiling was put into effect. Also, there was no indication of the effect of the week-long national consumer

boycott of meat. The report said the price of meat bought in grocery stores rose 5.4 per cent unadjusted and 4.8 per cent seasonally adjusted.

The World Is Waiting



"WAITING FOR THE SUNRISE" By HAROLD A. HARRIS First Christian Church

"Now upon the first day of the week, very early in the morning..." Luke 24:1 A few years ago there was a popular song which could well have been sung on that first Easter Sunday-a song which proclaimed gleefully, "The World Is Waiting For the

The message of the Resurrection is the difference between life and death! Do people die with you? Have you no, charm against death? This sad question of the natives gathered around David Livingston in deep Africa many years ago voiced the query in every heart. Life beyond the grave begins with life now. The central issue is: Is there anything in our lives that is worth living forever? The resurrection of Jesus Christ decisively affects the history of mankind. No event has made such a profound impact upon our culture. No event has brought such renewed hope to troubled mankind. Don't forget that the resurrection of Jesus is an important fact of history!

And what of Jesus' life? If you could resurrect part of his life, what element would you raise from the dead? Every year millions of people look forward to Easter to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Every Palm Sunday "the world is waiting for the sunrise" on Easter Sunday morning! Remember what you have read and heard about that first Easter. The world was not waiting for that sunrise. Even the disciples did not believe Jesus would be resurrected from the dead.

"Very early in the morning" is indeed a most interesting statement of both fact and truth, we need to ponder it well. We all need to examine our lives in the light of the resurrection facts. Socrates said unexamined life is not worth living. The only way that we can know our real condition is by examination. We need to remember that with the sunrise of the Resurrection we find that "Today is the first day of the rest of our life!"

Matthew 28:6 states that "He is risen." I believe that! Do you believe it? I believe that Jesus' life as well as his death and resurrection was the embodiment of divine love. This love of Jesus is revealed to us in his relation to persons. He loved all of them. Jesus forgave them and loved them as God loves and forgives all. The barriers that normally separated one person from another did not exist for the master. The political, social, and physical barriers that kept people apart did not keep Jesus from loving the most unlovable persons. Thus, the religious leaders complained that Jesus associated with "publicans and sinners."

It is not the Christian faith that is being judged and found wanting in our times, but the people who call themselves Christians! Many contemporary authors and philosophers are strongly critical of the present-day church. This criticism, however, comes not only from non-Christian writers, but from Christian writers as well. The sunrise of the resurrection will give us as the church a real Christian perspective! This is needed in our times.

Ironic though it be, the great hope for the powerful revival of Christianity in our time rests in the fact that the church is presently being condemned so severely. Only when the overwhelming need for the risen Christ is truly realized by the Church itself will his overwhelming power stir the Body of Christ to a prophetic ministry to a culture dying for want of a faith that brings life. We do not need a ritual of conformity, but a resurrection experience of new life and growth, we need the sunrise in our spiritual living!

God won you know! The outpouring of worshipers on Easter Sunday is something of a mass confession that we are wrong and God is right! The victory of the cross was made manifest in the garden near Joseph's new tomb "on the first day of the week at early dawn." Although this was an allinclusive victory it has to be won all over again in each individual life. May the sunrise of the resurrection victory be personal in you today!

The Search For Another J. Edgar Hoover

"John Edgar Hoover did not wear golden shoes. He was sometimes wrong, sometimes right. But he loved America, he believed in America and he fought for America. For most Americans that was enough. For those who knew him, that was a beginning.

That line of description is the last paragraph in a thorough but sympathetic book by Ralph de Toledano entitled "J. Edgar Hoover - The Man In His Time."

De Toledano has concluded reluctantly that Hoover - the first and only director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation — did not wear golden shoes. The fact that some members of the Senate

think, however, that he did and as many others believe he should have, is serving to create the scene for one of the most intriguing Washington debates in several decades. The Senate, in effect, is faced with the task

of finding another J. Edgar Hoover. To most citizens, Hooever, who died May 2, 1972, after serving as the only director for 47 years, epitomized to America what the FBI was all about.

He was the tough G-man, the stalker of headline-figure criminals, a staunch anti-Communist and a rigid disciplinarian who commanded total obedience from everyone around him.

Against 2nd Thoughts

The National League of Cities was perhaps the prime lobbyist for the federal revenuesharing program enacted this year by Congress. At its convention in Indianapolis, the league appeared ready to mount a similar campaign to assure that Congress and the President do not have second thoughts about the program.

The possibility of second thoughts has been evident since the first installment of federal revenue began arriving at state capitols and city halls. Taken from a federal treasury that is running in serious deficit, the money is hitting states and cities at a time their own budgets, in many cases, are enjoying a surplus.

President Nixon sees revenue sharing as a step toward restoring the concept of federalism, returning responsibility for government from Washington to the states and cities. That it is, in principle, but as a nostrings gift for communities already meeting their budget needs through local taxes it does not serve that purpose.

Wall Street 'Image' Tarnished

We have been through a period in recent weeks when the news on one page of the financial section is hard to reconcile with the news on another. The most popular barometer of stock market performance, the Dow Jones Industrial Average, has fluctuated sharply since the first of the year while the production and profit levels of business and industry as a whole have been going up.

Such contradictions can always be explained by Wall Street pundits, even if their explanations do not agree. Another phenomenon searching for an explanation is the retreat of the small investor from the stock market. The number of shareowners in the United States of Amercia had been increasing steadily for more than 20 years and reached 32.5 million in 1971. Then last year it declined by 700,000. Mutual funds which offer a convenient route for the small investor have reported in recent months that there are more

investors cashing in their shares than buying new ones. It would be an oversimplification to say that the small investor has been scared away by the gyrations of the stock market alone. Unpredictability is what makes the market tick. He has bought stocks on a "hedge against inflation," but has seen stock prices stay level or even fall as inflation wore on. His confusion and uncertailty have been aggravated by the difficulty of understanding international monetary problems and of forecasting the effect of wage and price

All of this makes for wary investment, but we would guess that the average American still has considerable faith in the



study of Boston elementary, junior and high school stu-dents being conducted by Dr. Gene M. Smith of Massachusetts General Hospital, under a grant from the National Institute of Mental Health. The study is looking for answers in three areas:

(1) Why some students become regular drug users while others merely experiment with drugs briefly or ignore them; (2) how personality traits and academic performance serve as predictors of involvement with or disinterest in drugs; (3) what changes occur in attitudes. personality and behavior after the initiation of drug use. In findings to date, the best indicator of subsequent use of illegal drugs is rebelliousness toward authorities and rules. Obedient children are the least likely to become

The more rebellious a child, the greater his subsequent use of drugs is apt to be, ranging from infrequent mariuana smoking through frequent marijuana use to multile experimentation with and use of depressants, stimulants. LSD and other hallucinogens, and heroin. Other reliable predictors of future drug use are classroom apathy and generally poor academic performance from middle grade school onward, and the early smoking

of cigarettes Personality traits on which drug users score low are: Conscientiousness, dependability, striving for recognition, setting high goals, persistency, planfulness, thoroughness, efficiency, mannerliness and agreeableness. Two traits which do not predict future drug use or non-

use are vigor and self-confidence. There are marked personality differences between those students who have never used drugs and those who have, while infrequent and frequent drug users tend to have similar personalities.

The students are self-rated. They range from fourthgraders to high school seniors and represent a sample of predominatly white, middle-class high school population of 15,000 in 33 public schools in the Greater Boston area They fill out questionnaires each year in which they rate themselves on traits of personality and behavior and iden tify their attitudes toward drugs and their use of drugs School records furnish histories of academic performance

while a coding system guarantees confidentiality. Participation is voluntary, but approximately 95 per cent of the students present on testing days have taken part in the study.

Relationships with old associates in Japan, Thailand

In one Latin country after another we have failed to take those small but considerate actions which would hold our close associations. We do not, in reality, deal sensitively with the deep feelings of some of our associates South of the Rio Grande on how far to sea a country's territorial waters extend. Japanese friends in high places tell me they are des

perate for a chance to talk frankly and privately with those American officials who make decisions. They almost passionately want to do this regularly - so that they fee they are in on things and not merely being filled in as a necessary afterthought to keep them from boiling over. The nub of the matter, as this reporter understands it from a variety of insiders from selected countries, is that these friends want to be considered as an integral part of the show, not just people and nations to be pulled along


in our wake, or consulted urgently in crises. They want to be a part of the ongoing discussion Again, ironically, these sentiments mirror almost precisely the spirit of the Nixon doctrine, as outlined by the President. These precepts also are almost in word-byword agreement with principles expressed by Dr. Henry Kissinger, Mr. Nixon's chief policymaker for foreign

Kissinger, even before coming to the White House, made it clear in his personal remarks and his writing that it! was his firm belief the United States historically had done much better, and had gone much further in accomplishing its aims internationally, when this country worked as one of a team of nations moving toward agreed-on goals de-


veloped by the group. By contrast, we have not done nearly so well, Kissinger has said, when we attempted to go it alone or have marched off strongly in one direction in an outward show of leadership, using all manner of persuasion to get other lands to do the right thing and join us.

Our national genius, Kissinger seems to believe, is as a bit of yeast in gatherings where other countries take the lead. Here our influence, he says, can be phenomenal.

"The people down there (the insurgents) have no business in Wounded Knee," Randall said. "We set a deadline, and if there has been no settlement by May 4, we are going to go in with rifles and kick them out." Talks between government and indian

negotiators aimed at implementing an April 5 agreement to disarm the militants holding Wounded Knee broke down 10 days ago. Richard Hellstern, deputy assistant U.S. at-

torney general, said the insurgents used a radio supplied by the Justice Department to contact him late Friday, asking for a meeting. "I said we were willing to meet if a precise agenda aimed at a settlement were to be discussed.

There was no response to that," Hellstern said. Meanwhile, Oglala Sioux Tribal Chairman Richard Wilson said a federal court order is being sought to force U.S. marshals and FBI personnel

from the reservation.
