### Airport sustains steady growth

SANFORD — Passenger traffic at Sanford's airport continues to post triple-digit increases at a time when the Bush administration's most optimistic projections indicate modest but steady growth throughout the nation's airports.

Department Secretary Transportation Norman Mineta told an aviation forecasting conference that he expects airline traffic to increase in the United States by 6.8 percent during the next two years. A growth rate of that size would put the number of U.S. airline passengers at pre-Sept. 11, 2001 levels by 2005.

At Orlando Sanford International Airport (OSIA), however, passenger counts were up nearly 150 percent in March versus March 2003. It was the third consecutive month that overall traffic at OSIA increased by a triple digit percentage over the same month in 2003.

"You're going to continue to see some fantastic growth numbers throughout the said summer," Larry

LAKE MARY — A group of active citizens are paving the way for improvements to the Rinehart Road trail.

The 2.3-mile stretch of trail from Lake Mary Boulevard to County Road 46A is undergoing a facelift that includes the addition of multiple exercise and rest stations, and improved landscaping and irrigation. The initial project is due to be completed this summer, but the group known as the Be A Trailblazer Inc. are continuing their efforts to support the betterment of the trail and possibly extend itself to other recreational areas of Lake Mary.

The not-for-profit organization was founded several years ago when the Timacuan, neighborhoods of Manderley, Woodbridge and The Hills of Lake Mary approached the city to dress up the bleak, black-topped trail on the east side of Rinehart Road. With the addition of a fifth partner, The Forest, the consortium of neighborhoods was inspired by the prospective chance of changing the landscape of the city's only trail that connects the county's Seminole Wekiva Trail and Cross Seminole Trail.

The group has raised about \$230,000

This Mother's Day, increase the size of your family by one ton! Adopt a manatee for mom this Mother's Day.

Even though you can't actually bring the manatee home, Save the Manatee Club (SMC) will send your mom a photo and biography of your newest family member. An adoption certificate, membership handbook, and newsletter subscription are included.

And, during the month of May, each new member who joins the Adopt-A-Manatee program at \$35 or more will receive a free commemorative plate featuring a design of "Manatees" by renowned marine artist Wyland (while supplies last).

Although the average manatee is not quite a ton (usually 800 to 1,200 pounds), they are probably the biggest and best present you can give to mom. In addition, funds from each Adopt-A-Manatee membership go toward efforts to protect endangered manatees and their habitat.

Found in the waterways of southeastern United States — primarily in Florida - manatees, an endangered species, need our help. Today there are only about 3,000 manatees left. Each year, many manatees are killed by watercraft collisions. They are crushed in floodgates and canal locks, and they become entangled in fishing gear. The greatest long-term threat to manatees is loss of habitat.

Nineteen manatees who regularly winter at Blue Spring State Park in Orange City have been chosen for one of SMC's three Adopt-A-Manatee programs. Adoptees at Blue Spring include manatee moms such as Phyllis, Lily, and Lucille. In the spring of 1991, Phyllis gave birth to twins, a rare occurrence for manatees.

This past June, Phyllis visited Blue Spring with a new calf. Lily is also the mother of several calves and a regular park visitor, returning each year since 1974. 





him, and he took off running, at which time he was shot.

Investigators say Dixon was not concealing drugs at the time nor was he robbed of \$120 in his possession. Sanford Investigator Chris Woehr said all the information points to

the shooting as a random act of violence, but the possibility of racial tensions are being considered.

"We have some information that was provided to us, but it is really unclear," Littles said. "We want to be very careful. If that's what it is then that's what we will call it, but if it's not we don't want to go there."

Through a lot of hard work, Littles said investigators came in contact with the two other white males in the vehicle, which led them to the Port of Sanford. Woehr said the two other vehicle occupants were not involved in the shooting.

Keller, however, did not own the minivan parked at the marina. It belonged to Donna Dowdney, 39, who was arrested Saturday at the houseboat for accessory to the attempted homicide. She reportedly drove Keller to Jacksonville and

informed police of his escape. She has since bonded out of the Seminole County Jail. Keller is expected to be extradited back to Seminole County in the next two to three weeks.

### Scruffy Duffers Pub creates a golfers' oasis

**SANFORD** — The ceramic statue of a happy, not-so-lucky golfer perched overlooking the bar tells the story of a new neighborhood pub.

High school buddies Joe Loschiavo, a former Outback Steakhouse employee from New Smyrna Beach, and Chuck Volkema, a construction subcontractor from Sanford, said they always wanted to own a grill pub. After two years of planning and designing, their dream came true with the recent opening of Scruffy Duffers Sports Pub and Grill on State Road 46.

"The name comes from both of us wanting to leave our professional careers and stop shaving, that's where the scruffy comes from," said Loschiavo. "The duffer is a

happy, but not so good golfer."

They found their three-foot high mascot at a garage sale. And similar to the hunt for the "Scruffy Duffer," the two did much of the work on the pubthemselves.

Loschiavo estimates they performed about 60 percent of the work on the new building including the sod laying, tile work and bar and kitchen design. The interior decorating is also winning rave reviews from guests as the "old school duo" chose to highlight each table with one hero from each popular sport such as Larry Bird, Jack Dempsey and Hank

"We felt the pride and quality we could have put in it was better than anybody else would do," he said.

They decided on the Sanford area for the sports grill because of the growing, but hometown feel to the community. Loschiavo said he wants Scruffy Duffers to be known as a family owned and operated neighborhood pub.

"I think the void we are filling is more of the old style pubthat can take care of its customers," he said.

Scruffy Duffers can accommodate 40 guests inside the pub and another 15 outside on its spacious deck. The outside seating at Scruffy Duffers is

The menu is rounded out with daily lunch and dinner specials, an assortment of sandwiches such as the Black Angus hamburger, a varied selection of appetizers and salads that are made fresh to order.

"Our dinner menu is small but I feel it captures what people want in a pub-style menu — grouper, shrimp, chicken and steak," Loschiavo said.

The drink menu is highlighted with a wide selection of beers and Entertainment is also not lacking at Scruffy Duffers. With plans to include live music of a laid back oldies or Jimmy Buffet-style band, the pub fea-



Gouldthorpe, president of TBI Airport Management Inc. TBI is a private company that has partnered with the Sanford Airport Authority to manage the domestic and international terminals at OSIA. "We're getting into our busy season with the British market and our domestic partners continue to grow every month."

Gouldthorpe said passenger counts indicate the airport authority is beginning to achieve one of its main goals: diversifying airline service. Though the airport has experienced substantial growth during the last seven years, much of that growth was the result of seasonal charter traffic from Great Britain. By attracting a diversity of passengers, traffic at OSIA is less seasonal, Gouldthorpe said.

"It also lessens the effects monetary exchange rates between Britain and the U.S. have on our passenger counts," Gouldthorpe said. "We've seen times when a change in those rates has significantly reduced the number of British passengers coming to the states."

Domestic travel in and out of OSIA was up 169 percent in March compared with March 2003. February saw an increase of 256 percent in the domestic terminal and 188 percent in January. Almost 71,000 domestic passengers used OSIA in March.

On the international side, 34,566 passengers traveled through OSIA, an increase of 114 percent. More importantly, Gouldthorpe noted, the Canadian airline Jetsgo was responsible for 9,750 passengers, about 30 percent of. OSIA's international traffic.

"The Canadian market is wide open for us," Gouldthorpe said. "What Jetsgo has accomplished is not going unnoticed by other airlines.

"What makes that market so nice for us is that many of the Canadians come to Florida in the winter, which balances out our British market," he added. "In addition, we've found that Canadians spend more time here. Often times they have homes or investments or business contacts in the region, so they stay longer and spend more

While each of the airport's 21 airline partners continues to see growth, Gouldthorpe said Southeast Airlines was terminating its Oklahoma City and Las Vegas routes. 

### Gordon deserved a free fix at Martinsville

Martinsville, Va. TAZ e all have to deal with potholes, but this one just wasn't fair. When we drive our car over a pothole, we may curse our bad luck.

Our tires may get out of alignment, or the car might even receive a scratch if the hole is a big one. But when watching a NASCAR race,

no one expects to see a pothole, no matter how old the track. That's why Jeff Gordon got a raw

deal from NASCAR when his car hit a pothole on Lap 200 of the Advance Auto Parts 500 Sunday.

This wasn't a racing issue. This was an administrative issue.

Gordon pleaded with NASCAR to let him fix his car during the red flag, but officials refused to bend the no-repairsunder-red rule. After leading roughly half the race until the stoppage, Gordon deserved better. He had one of the fastest cars on the track, but was forced to pit and lose track position to repair the damage to the No. 24 Chevrolet. "It wasn't our fault," team owner

Rick Hendrick said during the stoppage "It wasn't a racing incident. But (NASCAR president) Mike (Helton) said he couldn't do it.

" 'I can't do it,' that's all he said." Before the race, Martinsville track officials proudly announced that the

track would be resurfaced for the fall Apparently, it would have been a better idea to do that before this season began — and that's no small mistake.

"I guess we were just one race early," Gordon sald. The No. 24 car was forced to make

four pit stops before the green flag came back out, dropping him from second to

Think of all the crew members and employees such a dramatic plunge affected. Dropping that far down is worth a lot of money - \$25,615 according to the official entry form posted on the NASCAR hauler. That's not necessarily hitting Gordon in the pocket, but it's certainly influencing the salary of

the lower-profile employees. Fortunately for the team, Gordon had a good enough car to fight his way back to finish

But the situation should have never occurred. Helton couldn't have done anything about the pothole, but should have imme-

diately said, "The weak track was NASCAR's fault. Go fix your damage and come back to where you were." Still, some teams would have protest-

ed that decision. NASCAR's rule is in place to prevent teams from taking advantage of any incident serious enough to warrant a red flag.

Sterling Marlin hopping out of his car to pull out a dented front bumper several years ago comes to mind. But this wasn't the fault of any driv-

So think about it, NASCAR. Change the rule to allow for judgment cases. The judgment by NASCAR in this



## Vacation Express lands at Sanford airport

SANFORD — "We're back!" Those two words, spoken by Pace Airlines CEO Darrell Richardson, were music to the ears of Orlando Sanford International Airport (OSIA) officials.

The North Carolina-based airline operates 737-300 lets for Vacation Express, one of the nation's largest tour operators which announced in January it would moved its hub operations to Sanford from Atlanta.

Friday marked the beginning of a 7-year contract between

Vacation Express and OSIA. To celebrate, local dignitaries welcomed airline officials during a ceremony in the international terminal.

This is a tremendous boost to the airport," said Larry Dale, president and CEO of the Sanford Airport Authority. "We expect Vacation Express to bring in 250,000 to 300,000 people a year to Sanford."

Vacation Express will use OSIA as its hub, linking seven of its major gateway cities to Aruba, Cancun (gateway to Cozumel and the Riviera Maya), Costa Rica, and Puerto Plata and Punta Cana in the

Dominican Passengers originating in central Florida can access non-stop service to tropical destinations plus domestic service to all hub feeder cities. For the 2004 season, the cities in the hub program are: Atlanta, Baltimore, Cincinnati. Charlotte, Louisville, and Nashville.

The move to Sanford is actually a return for the Atlantabased Vacation Express. The company operated its hub out of OSIA from December 2001 to January 2003 before switching its hub to Atlanta. During that


