WASHINGTON, May 27 .-(A.P.) -Advocates of a general sales tax were challenged in the Senate today by Senator Harrison, Mississippi, Democratic tax leader, for an immediate showdown as be shouted "You haven't got the votes". He accused President Reover and sales tax edvecates of attempting to "browbeat" the Senate into supporting the controversial sales lavy after the Senate already voted enough levies to balance the budget.
