In the apring. a trained director wan hired. The building wan completed in a lant puah of man-power, loarrowed money and prominen. 'Thus [soyn' Cluls openced its doors. [horing the fims three weekn, there were bok members. If a twoy didn't have the 31 a yenr fee, he could work around the clat and earn it. ©iradually. durink the sumner, equipment was donated and purchamed. Two liink airplane trainern were inatalled for air-nnd-npace-minded buyn. A library wan partly stocked. The gym was ready. There was a plano. A hitchen was equipped. A woodcraft mhop win opened. A meeting room wan made available for the membern' awn "board of directore" which set upi their own rulen of goverument and manngenetit Clamen were organized.

Then, one day a hale appeared in the gym floor. The old lumsIser, taken from the abanatoned Air Firce building. could not miand the thumider of hundredn of young feet. The gym was clomed. It atayed closed for a year, until the Clty Commimion budgeted nuf. ficient money for a permanent cement flowr. Meanwhile, the bourd of directom, atill battiling Demon Finance, apened the club to girla.

The number of boyn and sirts entering the building the follow. ing year, totaled 76,043. Then came another blow. Due to a vinlent electrical atorm, tho roof collapmed. The gamea room was closed. Conatant lack of funde during the neat few montha cancolled many programa, but the club atayed open and in operation on a limited chedule. They supervined their own prugrami, nelecting leadern by popular vote. Lat fall, the buidding clowed.

Early thin year, the Boya' Club of America came through with - proposition. If the clty would help to open the club, it would mend a paid, trained director for a year. After weekn of conferencem with clty comminaionern, a grant of $\$ 5,000$ war promined-if the club would raine another \$5,000. A drive was ntarted a few weokn ago. The now director has arrivel. The club has re-opened. On the day it opened, nearly 200 boyn and girla monped through the doriru to utart where thoy left off lail fall; nome playing kamen, uthern reading towikn or watching televinion.

# River-of-Many-O, 

## From a world of man-made artificiality one here entors a primitive wonderland where reign Naturo's peace and solitude.

## Dy 800 HANSCOM

Buning deep in the ailent woode it the eource of the Homosaen River, is Nature's Oinnt P'sh Bowl. Alone lta primitive pathe equirrali play et the vialtor'a feet, and wild birde cock their heads with curiodly at the humana who dare invade their privacy. Deep In the foreat, the homes of wild animale are undaturbed by man. The black bear, bobcat, deer, raccoon, otter, mink, opensum, fray foz and wild turkoy dwall pasefully.
The giant fuh bowl, descending 65 feet to ite ireatest depth, is the nource of the litile river which emptien into the Oulf of Mexico, nine miles away, a natural aptina, over alix mallion gellona of water pour into the bowl every hour. In the langunge of the Seminole, Homosamen meana "river of many finhen." Ita name in underntandable whon the valtor culee duwa from the ext-walie morree the great apring. Thounande of antt and fresh water fah uwim benesth, in the cryutal waters. They are to thick it ecomm nothlng could wedre them apart. Slek fuhh from the gulf, fieh, with caping wounds in the alde and mouth, journey up the river to the finhbowl. The healing watore cura them, and thay return to the sea. There is no enclosure to im prison them.

The visitor may wonder how salt water fiah can live in fresh water. There is practically the same concentrate of calcium chloride in the springa' freeh water as sodium chloride in nea water. Salt water flsh must have a cortain amount of ealt to live, and the calcium chloride takes the place of sodium chlor. ide. Tarpon, mullet and anook cannot stand a audden change from salt to freah water, but can tolerate a gradual change, such an takes place en route to the fish bowl. The calcium chloride is tastelens, and the fish cannot detect its presence. Many. Floridn atreams, aupponed to be entirely freeh water, contaln calcium chloride.
There are no feeding grounds in this giant pool, so where does thim huge concentration of fish get its food? Thay seldom gulp at each other. Usually, they keep to themselves in schools-the anook, jack crevalle and sheepahead in the deeper water, the cat fiah, enappers and trout at the top. Elmo Reed, manaper of Homoenses Springi, cayn the fish can


Ilve in the bowl Indefnitely without food. Some think they wander down the river for their food and hurry bacta agata to awim in the pool. Some beliove thay come to the bowl for a "vecation" and to enjoy the even yoar-round 74 dogres temperature. Othara think the conatant flow of water aurging from the spring invigorater the flah.
In this dant bowl, the vieftor moee finh he has known by name only. There are ger thh, outorn lake chub aucter, Florida soldan shiner, bis inned ahiner, narthern eee catpah, northern needis Ahh, zalawater tilllith, red-Anned tult theh, shoopahead tillliah; aleo leant litit fish, calling, vantorn mogqulto fibh, mellori choice, enook, striped mullet, white mullet, enapper, aheapmhend, sea trout, channel baes, Jack crovalle, Warmouth hane, blueglll, larese mouth black base, black apotted suntiah and nucker. Here, natural enemies of the rea live together in peace. From the windowa of the underwater wath thay can lie seen rently bruehing each othor an they nwim in the clear blus-tinged watera.
The fah bow te not the enly attraction at Homonena Springa. A jungle trall leade through the foreat to the altigator lagoon. As the visitor atrolle along the path on the bank of the river, he seee purple orchida uaing the water for a mirror, In the lagoon, hundrede of Florida's famous gatore sleep on the bank

and awim fo the water amid natural aurrounding. Further along the trail, at the head of the lagoun, in Otter village. The fungy little felluws, made fanoun by Walt Disney, put on a show of their own. They gwim, ilive, romg and play in obvioue delight, always with one oye un the audlence, like true "hame" of the themire. Occasionally in the rough and tumble of their play, one reta hust. Anger mounte at they enarl at each other, but soon, all onmity is forgotton In this lend of aternal pance.

Hinmonama Springa in not man-made. with the exception of the bridge acrose the bowl and the little Colonial-type building which houses the ticket office. The 1,300 acres are nature's handiwork. 'lhere are more than 100 apringa of varying sizes. Ita beauty is natural. One leaves the artificiality of the manmude world upon entering thia prindtive land, where netural enemies live in pesce. Each year, 100,000 nature lovers enjoy the peacefulnesa and solltude it uffern.

# THE EASTER HAM . . . FLORIDA STYLE 

By Lillia May Morikall

EASTER, in all the Christian world, commemorates the day on which Chriat aroee, victor over death and the tomb. It has come to mean to all, a new bliththe beginning of spring and the awakening of all elements of nature, which may have lain dormant during the monthe of winter.
Children learn to associate the colored egr, the baby chick and the bunny with the day on which they fare forth dreased in their criapent colorful special Easter outfita. Through our joy at putting off winter and putting on apring, as we wear our Eanter Anery and dreas up Eanter baakets for the kiddien, let un not crowd out the real aignificance of the day.
Somewhere, back through the years-where or why we don't know-there aroee another tradition in connection with Eaater, that of cerving baked hain for Easter dinner. While this cuatom is not limited to any one section of the country, it han been adapted to the Florida-way of eating and cooking, uaing the state's own citrus fruita and Juices in itn preparation and merving.

To effect thin apecial Florida treatment, place a Poee 12-An thende Mogaine-1.3s.S
ham in the roanter and add a quart of fresh or canned unsweetened grapefruit juice, together with half a cup of sugar. Steam it on top of the stove until the rind comen off easily. Then remove the skin and cover the ham with moistened brown sugar, placing whole cloven decoratively in the fat part.
Now bake it in a $\mathbf{3 5 0}$ to $\mathbf{4 0 0}$ degree oven for about 20 minutes. Remove tha ham from the oven and dust it with brown sugar. Arrange orange slices over the top-and it adds to its attractiveness if a maraschino cherry in put into the center of each orange alice. Put the ham back into the oven just long enough to effect a lovely, mouth-watering glaze. To carry the Florida idea still further, and to pretty-up the dish, garniah the platter from which it is to be served, with kum quata. Or if you prefer, and are alicing the ham before it is taken to the table, arrange colored hard boiled eggs around the ham. The shells may be dyed, or the shelled hard boiled eggs soaked in beet juice long enough to give them a rich ruby tint. There's the definite Easter touch loved by young and old.
And apeaking of Easter eggs, Mra. Grover C. Price
of St. Petersburg has ment un a recipe for making candy ones, Florida through and through. They are most attractive. Try her recipe.

Miz one cup of Florida orange juice, the juice of one lime, two cups of chopped Florida pecans, a cup of chopped dates and a cup of chopped raisins. Add enough confectionera augar to make the mixture very atiff. If desired, divide and color each portion with a different tint of cake coloring. Form either large or mall eggs and put on waxed paper to dry.

These attractive egga will go far toward drewsing up your Easter table, along with the eye-appealing feative ham, baked Florida style.

An a fitting complement to the Easter baked ham, be sure to serve Oranoe Biscuits. Make regular baking powder biscuit dough, roll it out thin and spread with a paste made by mixing six tablespoons of butter, two tablespoons of flour, one-third cup of orange juice, and the grated rind of one orange. Cook in double boiler until thick. Cool, spread over the dough, roll up, cut into one-inch slices and bake at 450 degrees for 15 minutes.
