

# Science Finds Clues To Noah's Flood

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (UPI) — A Columbia University scientist offered evidence today which he believes will support the story of the great flood described in the Holy Bible.

According to the Bible, the great flood which Noah survived by building the ark was caused by torrestial rains which lasted 40 days and 40 nights.

Dr. Rhodes W. Fairbridge said his worldwide study of sea fessils over a 16-year-period and evidence fur-mished by other scientists show that coastal areas in many lands were suddenly covered by vast expanses of

Fairbridge fixed the date at about 4,000 B.C. This is about the time that the floods mentioned in the Bible, Buddhist writing and other chronicles took place. He did this by charting the rise and fall of sea levels caused by ice ages and the shifting of ocean beds.

Fairbridge discovered fossils that he was able to connect with particular times in history and determine when see levels swelled and receded. He collected some

of them while akindiving off western Australia.

"The see level reached its highest peak about 6,000 years ago," he said in an interview with United Press International during the International Conference at the United Nations.

"The water rose gradually, inch by inch through the centuries. Suddenly it covered the coastine and moved inland," rising about 300 feet above had. Fairbridge said the great flood was a unimposed because man was unaware of the power of the elemen

# **Mexican Airliner Blast Kills Man**

MEXICO CITY (UPI) —An explosion aboard a Mexican airliner, apparently caused by a bomb, killed one person Tuesday and started a fire which injured eight others, it was reported today.

None of the two or three Americans among the 15 persons aboard the plane was known to have been hurt.

Capt. David Torre Athan, the pilot, landed the plane safety at the oil town of Poza Rica in southeastern Mexico. Federal authorities impounded the plane in preparation for an investigation of the explosion.

The only fatal casualty of the blast was identified as E. Pellowski, about 50, of Mexico City. He either jumped or was blown out of the cabin door, which was joited open by the explosion over the coastal town of Nautia 200 miles mortheast of here.
