





Khomeini Approves Entry

Of Islamic Mediators

BASRA, Iraq (UPI) — With two of its southern cities besieged, Iran received an Islamic official seeking to mediate the Persian Gulf war.
Tehran Radio said today Ayatollah Ruhellah Khomeini Monday told Habib Chatti representing the Islamic Conference of Nations he had "no objection" to a fact-finding visit to Iran by a delegation of several Moslem heads of state and for talks with the

delegation.

Tehran Radio Monday said Chatti asked Khomeini to agree to setting up a mission made up of heads of Islamic nations, entrusting "it with ending the war." It said Chatti reported Khomeini showed "great interest" in his proposal.

Carter Makes Iran Offer

United Press International With Iran's parliament moving closer to a decision on the 52 U.S. hostages, President Carter and Secretary of State Edmund Muskie speak as though they hope relations with Iran will improve.

But the man who probably will make the ultimate decision Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini, says that he welcomes Iran's international isolation.

According to broadcasts from Tehran, the speaker of the Iranian parliament, Hasemi Rafsanjani, said the special commission on the hostages will "propose a plan" at the end of the week "at the very latest." Rafsanjani said in one broadcast Iran may b satisfied with a "promise" concerning U.S. noninterference in Iran's internal affairs. Campaigning in Youngstown, Ohio, Monday, Carter told a questioner, "If Iran should release the hostages, then I will unfreeze the Iranian assets in banks here and in Surope, drop the embargo against trade and work toward resumption of normal commerce with Iran in the future."

Rep. Aspin Picks Iran

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Iran has massive stocks of missiles and ammunition bought from the United States, and probably could win the war unless Iraq receives fresh supplies from other countries, Rep. Les Aspin, D-Wis., said today.

But Aspin, a member of the House Armed Service so bad that the "government may not even know how much ammunition it does have because it doesn't know

where to look for it." "Iran should have one of the greatest stocks of war consumables of any Third World country - if not the greastest stocks," Aspin said in a statement, "If Iraq doesn't get outside supplies, it is possible it could lose the war simply because its artillerymen will run out



PITTSBURGH (UPI) - The cast of characters ha changed since the Oakland Raiders last met the Pittsburgh Steelers three years ago. But in spite of the new faces, when the two teams got together at Three Rivers Stadium Monday night, it was just like old times. That long, bitter rivalry was rekindled ... and the Raiders were still bullying the Super Bowl champions. Recycled Jim Plunkett, starting only his second game in place of the injured Dan Pastorini, threw touchdown passes of 45, 56 and 34 yards to carry the Raiders to a 45-34 upset of

the injury-plagued, struggling Steelers.

It was the fourth straight victory for Oakland over Pittsburgh, which it battled in the AFC playoffs five consecutive years through 1976, then last defeated in the 1977 regular season. It was the second straight upset loss for the Steelers, 4-3, and dropped them into a firstplace tie in the AFC Central Division with Houston and Cleveland. The victory gave the

Raiders a 4-3 mark and kept them one game behind San Diego in the AFC West. The Raiders spotted Pittsburgh a 10-0 lead in the first quarter, fell behind, 17-7, but surged back to go ahead, 21-17. They widened their margin at times to 28-17 and 35-24 before shutting the Steelers out in the fourth quarter and locking up the victory with 10 more points. "It's a great victory. It drove me crazy," said Tom

Flores, the Raiders' coach. "We knew-coming in here Pittsburgh was going to be fired-up." Plunkett, who passed for 247 yards, connected on scoring throws of 45 yards to Morris Bradshaw in the second quarter, 56 yards to Cliff Branch in the third and 34 yards to Branch in the fourth. Atlanta Police Use Reward, **Psychic In Hunt For Killer**

ATLANTA (UPI) - Police searching for leads to the killer stalking black children have pinned their hopes on a house-to-house canvass, a \$100,000 reward and a Nutley, N.J., psychic who calls the dead children "my little angels."

Dorothy Allison, accompanied by a police detective from her hometown who has learned to "sort of" interpret her clues, told reporters Tuesday "I guarantee he won't murder while I'm here." "I will control him," she said. "I have seen who he is and I will follow him. I don't have complete control over him but I can control some actions." She said she has given police the killer's name and description, but nonetheless plans to accompany them on a street-by-street search.

Blast Kills 5, Hurts 25

NEW CASTLE, Del. (UPI) - Five employees at an Amoco Chemical plant were killed and at least 25 others injured in a propylene gas explosion felt up to 15 miles away. State police, fearing more explosions, evacuated hundreds of nearby residents. Fires, sending flames 50 to 70 feet into the air, raged for more than seven hours at the plant until firefighters from Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Maryland brought them under control today. Several hundred residents were evacuated from their homes in surrounding towns because authorities feared a second explosion and possible leaks of toxic furnes. At least 125 poeple spent the night in a Wilmington high school.

They said \$10 million must be paid by Nov. 3 or else the Caesars Tahoe water supply would be poisoned, but the notes did not explain how or when the water would be poisoned or how the ransom was to be paid.

Millionaire Kills Burglar

WESTPORT, Conn. (UPI) - A millionaire pool table manufacturer who shot down a burglar beside the indoor swimming pool of his walled palatial estate says it was a choice between life and death. The intruder apparently lunged at Arnold Kaye, who then fired three shots from his .38-caliber pistol, killing the burglar, police said. 





Savvy cooks treasure recipes that please the family and save money. When a recipe yields something in addition to that, some cooks refer to it as a recipe that pays dividends. The accompanying recipe for Doughnuts is such a recipe. The holes from the doughnuts are used to make Pecan Rolls.

Venison, the meat of deer, elk, moose, antelope or reindeer, has been used for food for centuries. Some food shops have it fresh during the season and also through special order during

Venison has it its own unique flavor, usually more gamey than most of us are accustomed to in our meats. It requires more tenderizing care and traditionally, marinating venison for days is suggested in most recipes. However, you may use a natural meat tenderizer and sidestep the long marinating

Cuts of venison are similar to beef, and, once tenderized, can be grilled, broiled, roasted or used for stews. Especially tasty is a vension stew made with deer meat. Serve this with boiled potatoes on the side and a hearty rye bread or beaten biscuits to sop up the gravy. Fresh cider or a bottle of hearty Burgundy go well with this staple of our ancestors, now a treat in the '80s. COLONIAL STYLE




