Herald Staff Writer Seminole County suffers from a critical shortage of primarycare physicians, those doctors who treat the most common ills, according to a health systems report of the east Central Florida area's health care needs during the next five years. There is only one primary-care physician for each 3,558 residents, according to the report, or slightly below the critical shortage ratio of one physician for each 3,5000 residents. The ratio of primary-care doctors in Seminole and Orange

counties, however, is one physician for each 2,274, a ratio in line with the rest of the east Central Florida area. The true picture in Seminole County, however, is probably best estimated to be somewhat less than the Orange-Seminole ratio." the report says. Probers Seek Fire Victims

BAY CITY, Mich. (UPI) - Investigators crept through the icy remains of the fireblackened Wenonah Park Hotel, discovering the charred bodies of four more victims - but not the cause of the blaze that killed them.

The grim search raised the death toll to nine in the fire that razed the four-story combination hotel-apartment, a 70-year-old downtown landmark which officials said did not meet current codes.

Swap Library For Mortgage

The City of Altamonte Springs has acquired its own library and cultural center.

"The Friends Of The Library," which owned and operated the South Seminole Community Library for the past 17 years, has given the city the seven-year-old Spanish design structure, its nearly one-acre site and more than 15,000 volumes and magazines in exchange for the city paying off the \$10,000 mortgage.

Mrs. Sadelle Pate, president of the "Friends of the Library," explained that," After the county opened up the county-wide library system, we couldn't swing it anymore

"We had always received a lot of donations in the past, but the donations evaporated after the county system was begun," she said.

The group, Mrs. Pate said, had continued to operate as long as it could by fund-raising activities to pay the mortgage and the expenses of operation. All services with the exception of the librarian, Mrs. Florence Coursen, had been voluntary.

Mrs. Coursen received a small monetary consideration. said Mrs. Pate. The library building and property at 281 Maitland Avenue, has been valued at \$70,000. The structure was built in 1970. The books were moved

into the new building in January, 1971. Mrs. Coursen said there are more than 800 families presently holding library cards and hopefully more families will take advantage of the facility and services

The library was begun in 1960 with 65 crates of books from the Rollins College library. Mayor Norman Floyd said the "Friends of the Library" will continue to work for the library and the city in conjunction with library planning and fund-raising. It was formerly known as the South Seminole Community

Building Buy Could Solve

If Seminole County buys the Roumillat building on Park Avenue and the former headquarters of the county Board of Education or East Commercial Street - both in Sanford the buildings would solve the county's office space shortage for several years, according to a county official working on the space problem. The official is Administrative Services Director Bob Ellis, who is compiling an up-to-date inventory of how office space is used in the courthouse. County Commissioners will use the information in deciding by the end of the year how to solve the county government's office space crunch.

"The county now rents the second floor of the Roumillat building for the manpower program. If the county buys the building, we'd be able to use the first, third and fourth floors for additional office space. That would give us about 11,500 square feet of office space," Ellis said Commissioners say the "Il consider a county purchase of the building when its structural soundness is verified.

The county also is attempting to buy the former headquarters of the board of education, which recently moved to new facilities on Mellonville Avenue and 13th Street.

"That building would give us about 4,000 square feet of office space, enough to house the state attorney's operation, if the county wins its lawsuit with them," Ellis said. The state attorney's office contends all its personnel must be housed in the courthouse. County commissioners say they have to provide office space for the state attorney but that the space doesn't have to be in the courthouse. The state attorney's office has launched a suit in circuit court to

force commissioners to provide the office space in the courthouse I think we'll win the suit, and we could then move the state atorney to the old school board building. This would free more space for courtrooms, which the judges say they need." County Commissioner John Alexander is negotiating with school board Superintendent William P. "Bud" Layer over a possible county purchase of the building, but negotiations are still in the early stages, Alexander said.

"If it hadn't been for Disney World's coming to this area, we wouldn't have this office space problem," Ellis said. "The courthouse was designed in 1963, and they thought it would solve the county office space problem for the forseeable future. But lawsuits held up construction until the late 1960s. The design of the courthouse couldn't be changed while the matter was tied up in court, and in the meantime Disney World arrived, causing a building and population boom in the county. The courthouse was obsolete by the time it was finished." - MARK WEINBERG



It is not clear whether the 23-page plan released by a House subcommittee is any more than a plan - whether any money changed hands and whether the stream of discussion and deliberation on U.S. policy toward South Korea has been infected in any way. With the Korean document now going to the Justice Department and House and Senate Ethics Committees, along with names of intended recipients of pay-offs which were not released by the House subcommittee, we

can hope to find out. If the whirlwind of scandal is again bearing down on Washington, the American people simply will have to ride it out, relying on the judicial process to pursue allegations to a conclusion of guilt or innocence. What is more important than the exposure of wrongdoing is keeping our sights on the best interests of the United States vis-a-vis a foreign country whose government appears to have abused its relations with a friend and protector.

WASHINGTON - The entire federal establishment heaved a sigh of relief the day President Carter signed an 18-month suspension of the saccharin ban previously ordered by the Food and Drug Administration.

For the moment, Congress is off the hook with the food industry and diet-conscious consumers who inundated Capitol Hill with protests against the FDA ban. And that means FDA will have a respite from congressional pressure, while the White House won't have to deal with any of the

above for at least a year and a half.

The only people in town who can't forget about rats and diet soda, in fact, are the professional staff and members of the littleknown Institute of Medicine, an arm of the prestigious National Academy of Sciences. The Institute, by act of Congress, has been delegated the unenviable chore of deciding how much of a health threat saccharin poses to human beings and what counterbalancing

At the same time, the Institute will conduct a separate study of the scientific community's ability to identify and evaluate cancer-causing elements in all types of food.

For those who follow health policy developments, it came as no surprise that Congress should turn to the Institute of Medicine for help with the saccharin controversy. The seven-year-old Institute is rapidly

becoming a prime repository for all kinds of political hot potatoes in the health field, from medical malpractice to the use of barbiturates for insomnia and anxiety. The reason is simple: credibility. The BUSINESS WORLD

Institute has no ax to grind. It is not part of the federal government, but neither is it a captive of any segment of the health industry - the physicians, the drug companies, hospitals, esearch scientists, insurance companies.





The cultural level and the health level of our people are the highest of all Latin America. And I think in the field of human rights, actually we are better off than the United

The Cuban premier said the presence of Cuban troops in Angola was justified. "They (the U.S.) have soldiers distributed inroughout the world," he said. "And nobody is going to put as a condition to the United States that they must withdraw from Turkey or from Europe or from Panama. And if we want to talk about relations, or anything that has to do with relations between the United States and Cuba, we can talk about the North American soldiers that are in Guantanama, against our will, in our territory. This would have to do with our relations." Asked if he could put a time frame on normalization of relations etween the two countries, he said: "It possible would require a second period of the Carter administration. It could be from n aybe 3 to 5 years, to be objective.

But despite wide differeces in views, Castro said he still had faith in U.S. President Jimmy Carter. "Carter is a different man than Nixon. Nixon was a man who had no scruples, he was a liar, corrupt, without any ethics, and Carter is another type of man.
