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DeGaulle's Position

General DeGaulle's opposition to the proposed French constitution is fundamentally to its following the British model, rather than the American. French and British constitutional practice calls for a figurehead chief of state, president in France, king in Great Britain. The real leader is the premier, chosen from the legislative assembly because of his ability to guide it. DeGaulle as a professional soldier feels that the premier's work is necessarily political maneuvering, which is out of his line.

The presidency would be more to the taste, had the president any powers. The proposed constitution gives him an imposing array of duties, and then spoils it all with one sentence, "Every act of the president must be countersigned by a minister." Thus all authority rests with the ministers, especially the premier.

A good many European and Latin American countries could have adopted the American form of government with real power for the president, but most have preferred the English, whose king is chiefly for ceremonial purposes. It is not surprising that DeGaulle reverts to this system, but France may adopt it notwithstanding.

Rural free delivery, practically taken for granted these days, is only 50 years old. It was started in three West Virginia communities and developed slowly. After 11 years there were only 82 routes, covering 1,800 miles, operated at an annual cost of \$150,000. Today there are approximately 33,000 rural mail carriers who travel 430 million miles to serve 30 million people. More than half of the nation's 3,070 counties have the service.

While the average route is 44 miles, the longest run, out of Edinburg, Tex., is almost 100 miles. A tough job at first, the work was carried on usually as a part-time occupation by farmers in horse-drawn buggies heated in winter with charcoal burners. The good roads program and the automobile, the auto working on the other, plus rural free delivery, have pushed the great service to its present proportions.

Rural free delivery has bound the farmer to the city, the city to the farmer, and the two and has been a unifying force for the nation. This is a great achievement for 50 years.

The CIO, claiming 4,000,000 members in about 40 unions, such as the auto workers, steel workers, and textile workers, is the second largest.

There are quite a few other smaller unions, including the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America, the International Association of Bridge and Structural Ironworkers, and the International Association of Shipbuilders and Boatbuilders.

Small unions are expected to be as many as 100,000 people. The AFL, CIO, and other unions are expected to be as many as 100,000 people.

The CIO held a convention at Milwaukee in September, and the 200 delegates took several actions which indicate that the CIO will support Republicans in November.

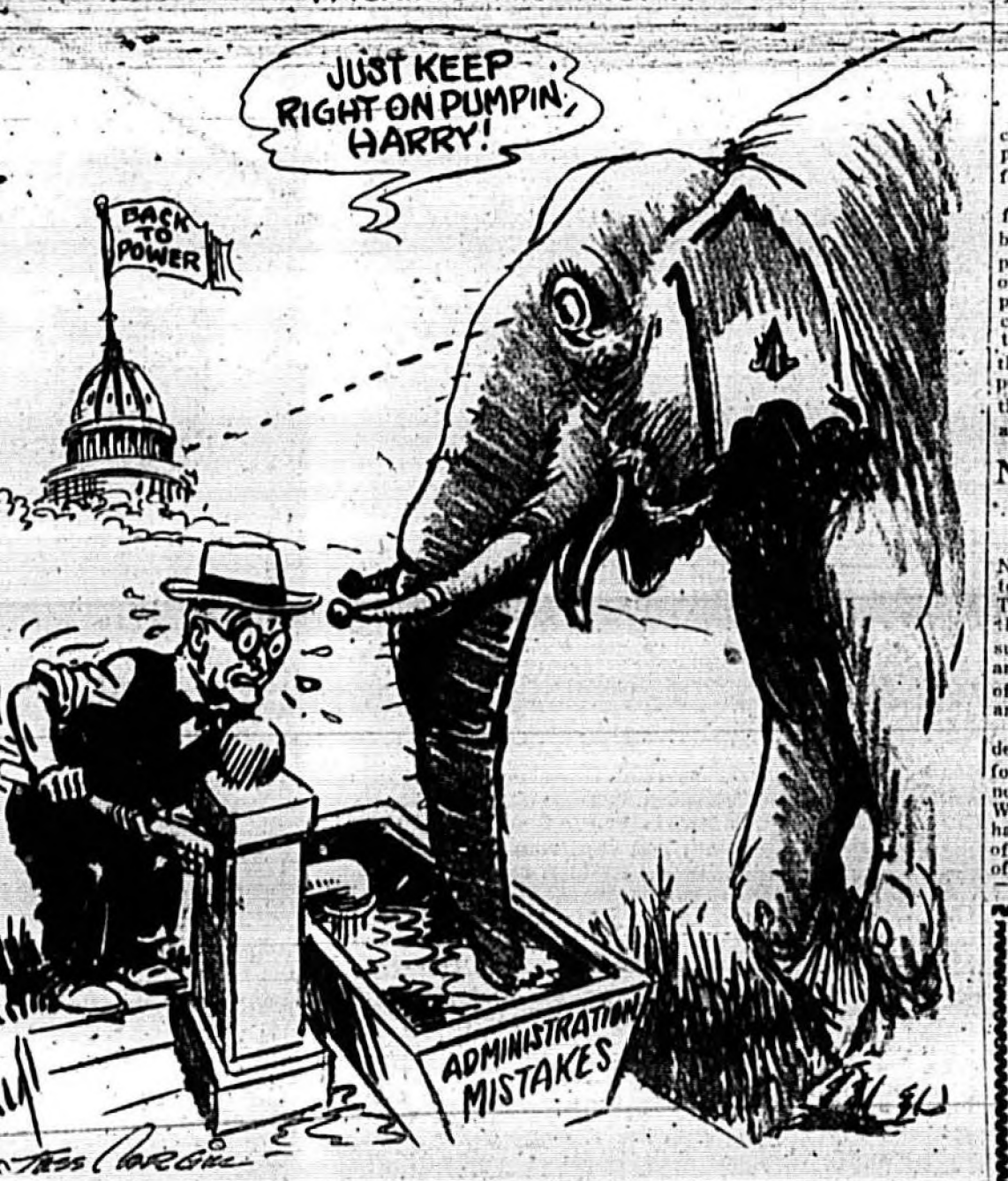

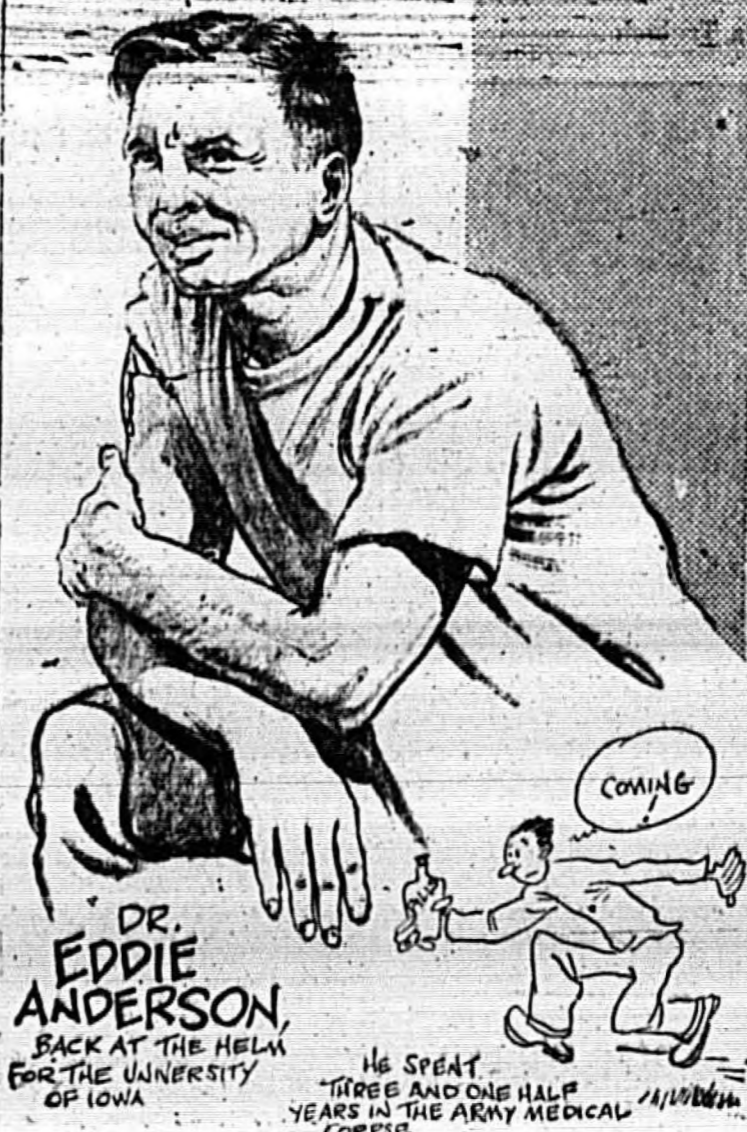

GI Flamethrowers Get A Peacetime Job On The Farm

WASHINGTON—Former infantrymen who lugged flamethrowers during the war should be able to adjust happily on some modern farms.

Also, ex-tank drivers certainly would enjoy getting acquainted with a new type of bulldozer tractor for which loads manure, rocks or hay without any laborious handling.

These are just two of many improved devices, gadgets, machines and assorted labor-saving ideas which agriculture research engineers are testing at their proving ground near here.

The engineers don't invent, but they encourage inventors and help machinery manufacturers by testing new ideas.

The "flame cultivator," developed originally for cotton farmers, to eliminate hoeing, was a between-the-plants, is being tried out now on cane and corn.

The new loader is attached to the front end of a regular tractor. It digs in under a load of manure, for instance, and picks it and like a road shovel.

It operates just like a sweep hay rake and can load any manure that has to be picked up and put into a wagon.

Several manufacturers are working on a small—10-horse-power, 1,000-pound-tractor for farms of 4 acres or less. It fills the gap between the large and the garden tractor.

Hydraulic control is all the rage now. They call it "fingertip control" of course, and a farmer actually can lift the plow or harrow attached to his tractor without wincing a long lever that juts and gets stuck.

There is a new combine harvester which is a single unit with the tractor that powers and carries it. The operator cuts a swath directly in front of him, doesn't have to worry about a back swath when he is through with a field, and can clear any patch of grain that looks too green for cutting.

There also is a new and cheery cotton picker. Its spinning engine, even on the open hills and don't strip plants as earlier pickers did.

For the corn-harvest country there is a new picker and shredder which chops up corn stalks—and the borers in them. This kills the insects and leaves the shredded stalk to be plowed back into the ground.

And there is a blower machine for air-conditioning hay which is cut green. It dries the hay for stacking.
