GOP Senators Hit Transfer Of Power

Two GOP senators voiced misgiving today about a proposed constitutional amendment to set procedures for a transfer of power to the vice president if the president should become disabled.

The strongest statement came from GOP Senate Leader Everett M. Dirksen, Ill., in comments accompanying the report of the Senate Judiciary Committee, which approved the proposal last week.

Dirksen and Sen. Roman L. Hrusks, R-Neb., were the only members of the committee to express reservations about the proposed amendment, which is sponsored by Sen. Birch Bayh, D-Ind.

The Republican leader said it might be ill-advised to pass the amendment. He said the Bayh proposal contained too many specific details to be included in the Constitution. The present wording would

deter flexibility in the future, Dirksen said, adding that he would rather see an amendment allowing Congress to set the procedures for a takeover by the president by law.

Hruska, although he said the Bayh proposal was not to his liking, said an amendment of some sort was so urgently needed he would support it.

Wild West Lore Falls To Space

CALABASAS, Calif. (UPI) - A remnant of the Wild West yielded to a Saturn II moon rocket Wednesday when the "Hangman's Tree" was uprooted so the rocket could be trucked past it.

The problems began when North American Aviation wanted to truck the rocket -33 feet wide and 88 feet long - from the plant in Seal Beach, Calif., where it was constructed, to a test site in the Santa Susanna Mountains at the west end of the San Fernando Valley.

The tree, which has stood for more than a century, is an historical monument and by law cannot be destroyed.

The aerospace firm hired one of the country's top tree experts, who decided the tree could be uprooted and moved about 100 feet - far enough to permit the rocket to pass. A huge crane moved the tres to its new location.
