A list of cancer's seven most common danger signals has been published and publicized widely during the past several years. Statistics show that when cancer is detected after one of these danger signals appears, the rate of cures is forty-five per cent. But when cancer is detected before the appearance of such danger signals-usually during a regular examination -the cure rate is sixty-five per cent.

The only intelligent conclusion is that reasonably frequent regular medical examinstion may pay handsome dividends in terms of better health and even longer life. Such examinations are fairly expensive, but if they forestall cancer or some other serious disease the cost may be saved many times over.
