Monitoring Teams Fan Out In Rhodesia Cease-Fire

SALISBURY, Rhodesia (UPI) - Lightly armed Commonwealth monitoring teams headed into the bush today as the deadline for a ticklish truce neared in Rhodesia's bloody 7-year-old war.

The countdown to the ceasefire at one minute before midnight 5:59 p.m. EST today began in an atmosphere made tense by the sudden death of the guerrillas' top commander in a Mozambique car crash. As the truce deadline approached, the Rhodesian command announced 13 more deaths in the fighting that has claimed more than 25,000 lives since it started

BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI) — The Soviet Union has ordered Vietnam to "watch it" during its military operations along the Thai - Cambodian border to avoid alarming other southeast Asian nations, Western diplomats said today.

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Supreme Court Justice Lewis Powell has issued a stay of execution for Willie Lewis Mack, who was scheduled to die in Alabama's electric chair at 12:01 a.m. on Jan. 4. Powell Thursday granted a stay of execution until the Supreme Court decides whether to hear Mack's appeal of his conviction and death sentence. Mack was convicted of killing a man during a robbery at a hardware store in Alabama, on April 28, 1977. The Alabama Supreme Court upheld his conviction and death sentence on Aug. 24, 1979, and on Dec. 20, refused to stay his execution.



Ailing Chrysler: A Welfare Client

In rescuing Chrysler Motors from the consequences of its own ineptitude, Congress is inexcusably opening the way for a new category of welfare clients—failing private industries.

When the subject of a federal bailout was broached some months ago, Chrysler President Lee Iacocca spoke confidentially of not only staving off collapse, but of curing the auto maker's long-term illness. But even as Congress acts to formalize a \$1.5 billion loan guarantee, Chrysler slips even deeper toward financial ruin.

The firm's losses are now running at the rate of \$6 million to \$8 million a day and it is becoming clear that the till will be empty sometime next month. Congress is moving rapidly to complete a bailout package of \$3.4 billion or so, including the loan guarantee, some \$600 million in wage conloan guarantee, some \$600 million in wage concessions from Chrysler employees, and another \$1.4 billion in outside financing. It will take several months to put this package together, however, and Chrysler's needs are urgent: \$500 million to meet the payroll during the next

If its bankers were willing to advance this kind of money, Chrysler would not have had to ask for a government handout in the firstplace. The one likely source of this money now is the federal treasury and Congress, in for \$1.5 billion, will find Islam, with him as the spiritual leader of the it difficult to resist the pressures to go another

Even this additional largesse would be unlikely to solve any real problems. The trouble is that non-Moslem world. Chrysler motors, despite years of declining sales and corporate losses, has not been capable of trimming its sails. The object of the federal bailout, Iacocca has made clear, is to permit Chrysler to continue as a full-line auto maker the very policy that has failed in the past.

Unfortunately, Chrysler's recent performance offers little hope that it will do any better in the future. In a market where auto sales have declined 34 percent since October, Chrysler's share has slipped from 10.5 percent to 8.5 percent and the firm has lost 30 of its dealers this year. Chrysler has slipped so irretrievably that a commitment of federal aid now is simply an invitation to come back for more when that is gone. The argument then will be made that the government must protect its investment with another handout. This is an open-ended process that is certain to snowball as other failing businesses, with some logic, also claim their places in the welfare line.

Chrysler has alternatives it has not chosen to grasp. It could follow the path taken by American Motors and Studebaker, stripping away its losing operations and accommodating itself to a new role as a specialty car builder with a thinner but more profitable share of the market.

It also could go into bankruptcy, a not unthinkable alternative despite House Speaker Thomas O'Neill's emotional pea to the House to. avert the layoff of 700,000 workers. The fact is that operations would either become profitable in receivership or the company would be sold to other auto makers. It is not in the interest of Chrysler employes, and certainly not in the interest of the taxpayers, to continue deficit operations at government expense.

Rather than face its problems, Chrysler has asked to be supported by the government in the style to which it has accustomed itself. In catering to this wish, Congress and the administration are litting money endlessly to a bottomless pit formo better reason than political expediency.

Khomeini's

WASHINGTON (NEA) - Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini wants the United States to take some form of military action against his country. At least, that is the conclusion of a The profile's ominous conclusion is being taken seriously by the administration, and it forms the basis of President Carter's strategy in dealing with the crisis in Iran.

Great Quilts

Aren't Easy lo Locate

NEW YORK (NEA) - Try to be nonchalant when you price the pieced quilt you just picked from a heap of rags: maybe the antique dealer doesn't know just what a piece of American "folk art" it is.

("Folk art" because it's something useful made pretty by someone who wasn't professionally taught how. The lady who pieced together the pattern - mosaic, Sawtooth, Sunburst, etc. in 1767, or appliqued Adam and Eve and their plants onto a "ground" fabric in 1843, didn't have a degree in fine arts. She just had calluses.) First, the quilt is obviously old. Look how short and wide it is.

They made them short back then because people were short, and wide because they often slept four or five to a bed. When they, the people, started eating better and growing taller, around 1800, their quilts grew, too. And from the faint sheen, the fabric could be linsey-woolsey. which was very big with the settlers before 1770. Big, too, with the folks in Linsey, England, who were evidently the first to

weave with a linen warp and a wool weft. The town wag probably named the result. Once the settlers got settled here and planted flax, which results in linen, and grazed sheep, which results in wool, they had their own linsey-woolsey to glaze. They liked to work up a shine by rubbing the material with a pumice stone. Still, these patches might be remnants of store-bought "Black Turkey tamet, tamet cheny" or "sad hair coloured

Italiano." Whatever they were, Henry Landis was selling them

in his Boston fabric shop in 1651. In any case, the old quilt is in terrific condition. 



LAS VEGAS. Nev. (UPI) - Nevada Gaming Control Board Chairman Richard Bunker said Thursday state investigators questioned Stardust Hotel owners shortly after \$115,000 in cash was discovered three months ago in a plane seized at Ft.

At least one of the two passengers was a Stardust Hotel highroller, possibly from Texas, according to sources. Five thousand dollars of the money seized was wrapped in a Stardust Hotel money-counting room wrapper dated Aug. 26, 1979. Investigators said money bearing such wrappers usually was destined for the bank.

The Wall Street Journal reported Thursday the discovery led to an investigation aimed at determining whether money from the hotel-casino was being used for international narcotics

"We've been on top of it from the beginning. When we were notified (of the seizure), our people got in touch with federal agents and talked to people at the Stardust Hotel and we have not found anything that indicates anything is wrong," said The control board chairman said the investigation was

continuing and that he would be briefed Friday by state gaming investigators on the status of the probe. The Wall Street Journal said lawmen seized the private plane and money Sept. 26 in Fort Myers, Fla., at Lee County Airport. The seizure occurred when police found an illegal fuel tank in the cabin on the Aero Commander during a refueling
