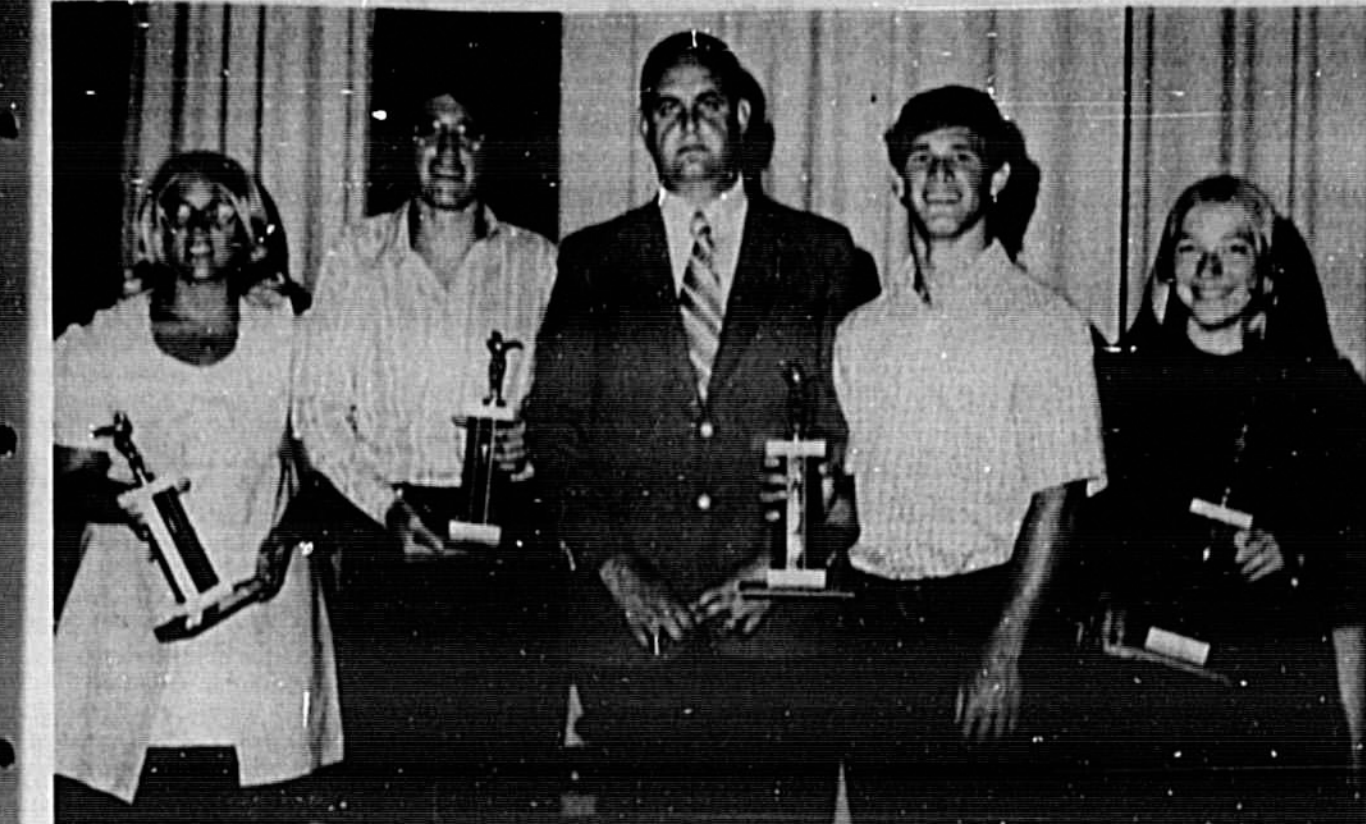

President In Moscow For Summit Nixon Greeted By Russian Leaders



President Nixon

MOSCOW (AP) — President Nixon arrived in Moscow today for summit talks with Soviet leaders expected to produce agreements on limiting strategic arms, promoting trade between the two giant rivals and cooperating in the exploration of outer space.

Beginning the first official visit to Moscow by any American chief executive, Nixon emerged hatless from the presidential jet, smiled, and descended the ramp to shake the hands of President Nikolai V. Podgorny and Premier Alexei N. Kosygin, who led the Soviet welcoming party.

Communist party chief Leonid I. Brezhnev, the Soviet Union No. 1 man, did not come to the airport to greet Nixon.

Mrs. Nixon, dressed in a lilac suit, was at the President's side. Afterward, Nixon and Podgorny inspected detachment of crack Soviet troops.

Nixon looked fresh and attentive as he stood beside Podgorny.

government stressed peace and cooperation with the "planet's biggest capitalist country" as it prepared to welcome President Nixon today. But Nixon's chief adviser warned that the arms agreement expected from the summit conference might be delayed by technical snags.

Pravda, the Soviet Communist party newspaper, called for "mutually advantageous cooperation" with the United States and said the attitude of Soviet leaders was "businesslike and realistic."

Tass, the government news agency, reported on Nixon's meeting with Austrian Chancellor Bruno Kreisky during the President's stop in Salzburg and quoted Kreisky that the Moscow summit was "a major political event of our time."

Nixon spent 36 hours in the picturesque Austrian city, closed most of the time in the 18th-century Klessheim Palace to work on briefing papers for his talks with Communist party chief Leonid I. Brezhnev and other Soviet leaders.

Soviet Goals With West Analyzed

Only two weeks ago the chances that the Kremlin would countenance a summit meeting with President Nixon at this time were, in the view of many, worth less than a plugged kopek. Now the summit is about to begin on schedule. Why?

Behind the apparent eagerness of General Secretary Leonid I. Brezhnev and his colleagues in the Soviet Communist party leadership to meet this week with the President are a number of major Soviet policy goals.

Some inspired leaks in Moscow these days suggest that the Nixon decision to mine North Vietnamese ports to slow Soviet supplies would wash out the summit. It didn't. Although the Russians vow to continue supplying billions of rubles worth of hardware to Hanoi, the Vietnam situation is getting in the way of some major Soviet goals.

The Kremlin eye has long been intently fixed on Europe. Its drive for a security conference goes back many years and recently has had the highest priority. Moscow wants Europe to agree to the idea of "renunciation of force" in the same pattern as the West German-Soviet treaty just ratified in Bonn.

What else do the Russians want from the summit? They want expanded economic and trade ties with the West and the United States and access to Western technology for application to the Soviet consumer economy. The Soviet system is more than 30 years old now and its domestic economy still suffers from comparison with Western standards. The Politburo long has been feeling the pressure of popular impatience.

The Soviet economy could make effective use of some of the enormous investment in su-

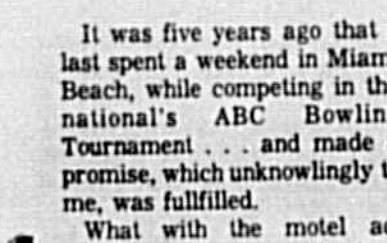
Million Dollar Budget

A county ordinance governing operations of the Seaboard Coast Line Railroad will be a topic of discussion at tomorrow's work session of the County Commission.

The issue has been under discussion for several weeks. Representatives of the railroad indicated they would attempt to resolve the problem confronting the areas residents of lengthy waits at railroad crossings.

According to Administrative Assistant Rodney Layer, the ordinance will stipulate the speed of trains, which, he says, has been the object of much controversy in Orange County, as well as proper crossing signals. Since there have been many area deaths due to alleged improper signalization, this, too, has caused much concern.

Further, the ordinance proposes in addition to a certain indicated speed of trains passing through the cities, that there be a flagman in advance of the train for the traffic.

Layer says the ordinance is most comprehensive and hopefully will rectify any of the problems still facing the county.

Also receiving the attention of the commissioners will be discussion of CASQUO, The City of Casselberry, which has been engaged in a long, arduous

struggle for the past two years in an attempt to obtain the utility company. At a recent city council meeting, City Attorney Kenneth McIntosh was authorized to research the acquisition of the utilities through possible condemnation proceedings.

Other agenda items at the workshop session include a discussion of the personnel board; drapery specifications and other courthouse changes; service area for General Waterworks; a well drilling and pump installation regulatory board; and well drilling code draft; water safety; a final plat drainage problem of Forest Brook, section 5; Lake Ann Estates, Unit 2 and, as was the case last week, a discussion of the county's road problems.

The regular 2 p.m. meeting of the commission includes a report by Zoning Director Robert Brown upon a borrow operation in Lake Kathryn Estates; a report by Chairman Greg Drummond relative to a May 17 meeting of CALNO; Anderson relative to the acquisition of the county parks property; Commissioner Al Davis report upon juvenile detention facilities; and County Planner David Farr's report upon Central and Southern Florida Flood Control District activities in Seminole County. Six public hearings are

scheduled for the 7 p.m. session and include a rezoning petition from A-1 agricultural to R-C-1 country estates located at the corner of Agriculla and Brooks Roads; from A-1 to C-2 general commercial located south of SR 46, east of I-4; from A-1 to R-1A located southeast of SR 427, across from Sunland Estates bounded on the west by the existing county road; and from A-1 to C-2 located north of intersection of SR 44 and Sand Lake Road.
