As we begin the celebration of the festive Christmas season for another year, with all of the accompanying activities, we hear occasional cries of "Keep Christ in Christmas." We see in the midst of the many decorations, a tiny nativity scene that appears somewhat overwhelmed by

There seems to be a sense of obligation that remains in the hearts of many to remember the precious burden borne that first Christmas night by a manger in a lowly stable. The child was announced by a star in the heavens and beralded by a host of angels. "Fear not," they said to frightened shepherds, "For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a saviour which is Christ the Lord."

But, as quickly as the obligation is met by attendance at some Christmas service, or by the adding of the nativity scene to the decorations, the Christ of Christmas is considered sufficiently observed and he is put away until the next time we drag out the Christmas decorations.

I like Christmas with all of the pleasantness that comes with it. People expressing kindness to one another and giving gifts to those we live is far more enjoyable than seeing a quarrelsome spirit and witnessing or participating in selfish

What I would like to consider, however, is why did Christ come the night long ago? Why did He the eternal Son of God, Creator, Sustainer and Ruler of the Heavens leave all of the glories of Heaven to "take upon himself the form of man and become obedient unto death even the death of the cross?

He did not come to bring Christmas, though it is indeed a wonderful season of the year. He did not come to teach us how to live by either precept or example, although He is the greatest example of perfect love and humility that man has

Jesus, himself gave the reason for his coming when He ministered unto, but to minister and to give his life a ransom

Yes, Christ Jesus was born that first Christmas Day that He might become the sacrifice for sin. The Babe of Bethlehem was borr to the accompanying song of angels and beneath the sign of a star in order that He might become the Christ of Calvary bearing the penalty of sin in his own body.

The blood of Christ, God's Son was to be shed for the

remission of sin, as John the Baptist said, "Behold the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world." To know this is to more fully appreciate the great meaning of Christmas Day-and the message of the angels.

Christ Jesus is and shall always be, the greatest expression of God's selfless love that eternity with all of its resources could know. As the hymn writer has said, We may say about Christ in his birth, his life, his death, his resurrection and ascension, "There is no greater love."





Petroleum Blackmail Unacceptable

The period now and the final enactment by Congress of emergency energy legislation presents a challenge to the American people. The spirit with which we approach energysaving measures when they are still voluntary such as the Sunday cut-off of gasoline sales may determine whether President Nixon has to go farther than he now intends in using his new powers for mandatory reductions in energy use.

Mr. Nixon made no mention of gasoline rationing in his report. Whether we can avoid that onerous step depends on whether the Sunday shutdown of gasoline pumps persuades a sufficient number of Americans to climinate unnecessary weekend driving, especially longdistance trips. That means accepting the curtailment rather than searching for ways to avoid

The diversion of 15 per cent of refinery capacity from gasoline to heating oil will create a severe gasoline shortage if the miles driven by American motorists, and the speed at which they drive, are not reduced correspondingly. Meanwhile, lower thermostats and allocation programs promise to stretch out heating oil supplies, and while other measures for reducing airline flights and lowering demand for electric power will ease the drain on our total national reservoir of available petroleum.

The months ahead will be revealing in two important ways. First, they will provide a test of the resolve and unity of the American people in the face of a peacetime crisis unlike any they have encountered in the past. Fuel rationing in World War II came at a time when our way of life was far less dependent on the internal combustion engine than it is today. While our economy could be seriously weakened if fuel shortages hamper our industrial productivity and the flow of commerce, it still is not a matter of a shooting war for national survival. Our

S. Korean Students Freed

SEOUL (AP) - President Chung Hee Park freed 17 students today in another move to quiet student opposition to his dictatorship. The students had been arrested during demonstrations against Park's authoritarian rule that began in early October. The president also ordered Education Minister Min Kwang Shik to reinstate 41 students who were expelled after participating in demonstrations in Seoul and other cities. But the president gave no indication that he might meet the students' other demands for the restoration of democratic government, abolition of the Central Intelligence Agency, economic reforms, freedom of the press and an end to government spying on campus and academic activities.

Vesco Decision Today

NASSAU, Bahamas (AP) - Bahamian Magistrate Emmanuel Osadebay was expected to rule today whether international financier Robert Vesco should be extradited to face U.S. fraud charges.

Osadebay has heard almost two weeks of arguments by U.S. Justice Department lawyers seeking Vesco's return to New York and a battery of defense attorneys for the 38yearold Detroit, Mich., native. If Osadebay rules for Vesco's extradition, the defense

can appeal to the Bahamian Supreme Court, delaying any There is no appeal for the U.S. government from a magistrate's ruling denying extradition.

Plane Crash Kills Two

HEIDELBERG, West Germany (AP) - A United States Army reconnaissance plane crashed Thursday night during a training flight over central Germany, killing both crew members, the Army reported. The small Mohawk plane went down near Huckelheim, north of Aschaffenburg, the Army said. The cause of the crash was being investigated.

The army said the plane was assigned to the 73rd Military Intelligence Co. at Hanau. The victims' names were withheld

Militant Irish Reform

BELFAST (AP) - Militant Protestants in Northern Ireland have formed a new alliance pledged to block the formation of a Protestant-Catholic coalition government

The alliance is also pledged to torpedo efforts to form a Council of Ireland linking Northern Ireland and the Irish

The new alliance, dubbed the United Ulster Unionist Council, brings together factions led by the Rev. Iar Paisley and William Craig and 10 dissident members of Brian Faulkner's Unionist party. It includes the powerful Orange Order,

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) - Ocean scientists are whirlpools which could alter weather forecasting methods and help locate new fishing grounds. The whiripools, which also could alter hurricane tracking methods, appear in the photos as swirling eddies of cold water in the warm current flowing off Mexico's Yucaian peninsula. They were located two weeks ago by a Naval researcher who was studying photos taken during the Skylab 2 mission. The Skylab 3 astronauts were told to take some

Auto Makers Scrambling

DETROIT (AP) -- The nation's Big Three auto makers were apparently caught unsuspecting of the public's sudden switch to smaller cars, and are now scrambling to catch up. The automakers, having just enjoyed a year of record sales and soaring profits, are finding little demand in this time of an energy crisis for larger cars which use more gas. Production of small cars such as Ford's Pinto and General Motor's Chevrolet Vega is being pushed to the hilt, and a number of plants are being converted from making large cars to the smaller models.

Home Solar Devices

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) -- Two scientists here say if you have an extra \$100 and a half day to spare, you can install your own solar-operated home heater to save other fuel during this energy crisis. Aden Meinel, a University of Arizona optical scientist, says proof that the system works is in his home where several rooms are heated during daylight by a combination of wood, polyethylene bags and air ducts. An associate of Meinel said air is taken out of the house by fans, is briefly stored in the bags where it is heated by the sun's rays and then forced back into the

Americans Less Happy

PRINCETON, N.J. (AP) - Americans were happier with their lot 10 years ago, according to the Gallup Poll. In a nationwide survey of 1,505 adults Sept. 21-24, before the most recent developments in the fuel shortage, 71 per cent of those questioned said they were satisfied with their standard of living. A similar survey in 1963 showed 77 per cent satisfied. Twenty-two per cent said they were satisfied with the honesty and standards in the country teday, compared with 34 per cent 10 years ago.







Nixon's Watergate troubles have made him a political liability to fellow Republicans.

Ford firmly defended the President at a news conference Friday less than 24 hours after he took his oath as the nation's 40th vice president.

Many Republican lawmakers have privately expressed fears Nixon's low rating in public opinion polls may rub off on them. However, Ford said "If they had the opportunity to have the Precident appear, almost without exception they would be glad to have him."

Earlier, talking with newsmen during a picture-taking session outside the Senate chamber, Ford said "I don't think the President is a political liability to any candidate."
